
#### 2. Building Project

This will be held on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> August to discuss our school's purpose and specific values in preparation for our new Strategic Plan. - What is the school's fundamental reason for existence?
- What is the purpose of the school?
- What do we value in our school?
- What does the school stand for and how does it want to operate?
- What are the influences that will impact on our school community in the next 4 years?

Dear Parents, Please find attached a letter from the Principals of Shepparton High School S, McGuire College and Mooroopna Secondary College regarding the recent planning and consultation that has been undertaken around the future provision of secondary school education at these schools.

#### **Greater Shepparton Secondary Education Regeneration – Update**

Dear parents,

Over recent months our school communities have been in discussions about the future of secondary school education in Greater Shepparton. We are excited with our progress and the opportunities we have to improve secondary school education for our students.

We are currently seeking the community's input and as these are only early discussions, no decisions have been made. As a result, there will be no impact upon our schools for current Grade 6 students enrolling for Year 7 in 2011. They will be guaranteed to complete their middle years of schooling at the same site. Any developments in schools organisation in later years will only occur if the proposal demonstrates improved learning opportunities for the young people of Greater Shepparton.

Recently, three community consultation meetings were held at our schools to share the discussions and proposals developed since last year's meetings and to gain feedback from our school communities.

A proposal to move to a single governance model was presented and this model would deliver the following benefits:

- Enhanced educational opportunity for all students
- Improved access to all facilities across the three campuses
- · Combined skills and curriculum knowledge across the staff
- A sound basis from which to plan for the future

The proposal also suggested establishing a senior secondary campus and a number of middle years campuses, which would assist targeting teaching strategies and programs to the needs of students.

We have also begun discussions with both Goulburn Ovens TAFE and La Trobe University, both of which are eager to be involved and can see the benefits for Shepparton. Mr Paul Culpan, CEO of GOTAFE commented "We see it as a significant step in improving educational outcomes for youth in the Shepparton region which aligns with the Institute's strategic plan of supporting vocational pathways with secondary schools that has been recently agreed with Skills Victoria".

This is an exciting opportunity for our schools and we will continue to investigate and implement enhancements in secondary provision and look forward to working with you to improve the educational outcomes for all our students.

While we are engaged in this long term planning process we wish to assure parents that our key focus is and always will be the provision of excellent educational opportunities to students currently enrolled in our schools.
