



FINGERGYM IN THE F/1 CLASS AT TALLYGAROOPNA

During this term, the F/1 students have participated in a Fingergym session twice a week with OT Student, Taylah Wright.

Fingergym is a unique group program that uses fun and motivating fine motor-based activities to assist students to become more independent in the classroom. This program was developed in Australia by experienced Occupational Therapists and Education



Sessions are run for 30 minutes with the students in small groups. Each group spends five minutes at each station and rotates onto the next station, completing five different activities. Stations are; 1. Strengthening hands, 2. Fine motor control, 3. Sensory and Planning, 4. Cutting skills, 5. Pencil to paper.

As an OT student, I assist students with their functional pencil grip, correct scissor grip, ability to take turns and share, use and maintain correct posture whilst seated and working on the floor and increase their fine motor abilities.

The program also promotes the development of school skills such as the ability to:

- organise work space and tools
- be aware of other people and their needs
- follow visual and auditory directions
- ask for help if needed

development skills.

- initiate and complete a task
- problem-solve and actively investigate cause and effect situations
- transition from one task to another
- maintain attention

I hope all the students have thoroughly enjoyed Fingergym and continue to develop their skills over the school holidays and throughout the year.

SHEPPARTON EDUCATION PLAN

UPDATE: TWO YEAR TRANSITIONS PLAN FOR GREATER SHEPPARTON COLLEGE (INTERIM NAME)

As Executive Principal of Greater Shepparton College (interim name) I have spoken at a number of Meet the Principal events this week regarding my vision for the new school and our plans for the future.

During these events I committed to informing school communities regarding the transition plans for 2020 and 2021 as soon as these were confirmed.

The Deputy Premier and Minister for Education, James Merlino, visited Shepparton on 28 March 2019 to announce the transition plan for the merger of the four secondary schools (Shepparton High School, McGuire College, Wanganui Park Secondary College and Mooroopna Secondary College) in 2020. Minister Merlino outlined the staged transition plan that will be implemented from next year (2020).

Staging the transition plan was considered important to minimise disruption for students during the next few years while still enabling our important work to be commenced to establish Greater Shepparton College (interim name).


In summary the staged transition plan will look as follows:-

- In 2020 Shepparton High School students move to Wanganui Park Secondary College, except for Year 9s
- They, and Year 9s from the other 3 secondary schools, will go to a dedicated Year 9 program at Mooroopna
- Mooroopna's Year 8 and 10 students remain at Mooroopna campus, while Mooroopna's senior students will move
 to either Wanganui Park campus or McGuire campus depending on their subject choices
- All Year 7 students will start at McGuire campus, studying a program specifically designed to enhance literacy and numeracy skills and extend their critical thinking.
- Other students remain at their current school site.

This provides the foundation us to bring year levels from the four schools together, offer a broader curriculum, give students more choices, and implementation of teaching and learning programs aligned to student needs.

TWO YEAR TRANSITION PLAN FOR GREATER SHEPPARTON COLLEGE (INTERIM NAME)

From 2020, three of the existing secondary school sites will be utilised as campuses of Greater Shepparton College (interim name). We have prepared a summary of year level and campuses for the next two years.



We have also prepared a table which will enable parents, carers and students to see which campus their child will attend in 2020 and 2021, which follows.

We are making big changes in terms of secondary education provision in Greater Shepparton over the next few years, and understand that this change brings some uncertainty for families, parents, carers and children. Please know that I am committed to creating the new school to improve the educational outcomes for our young people, with our students at the centre. They are, and will continue to be, our number one priority.

There are some logistical challenges with the new school, which we are currently working through, so that arrangements are in place for 2020.

I intend to continue to engage with school communities on a regular basis during the year, and encourage you to attend the next round of Meet the Principal events that we are planning in May 2019.



Students attending will need to be at Welsford Street by 10.30am. All students, parents and teachers are welcome to attend this ceremony to remember and acknowledge the ultimate sacrifice our diggers have made during wartime.

7. Cross Country

This will be held for Grade 3-6 students on Friday 3rd May at the Victoria Lake in Shepparton. All students and teachers will travel by bus and the cost for this day will be \$2 – permission forms will be sent home first week back in Term 2. The first event begins at 1pm (10 year olds and under) – so we will aim to leave school at 12.15pm and return at approximately 3pm. All students participating will have an early lunch on this day. Mr Brodie, Miss Love and an Education Support staff member will attend this program.

2:00 12/13 y.o. boys 3000 meters 2:15 12/13 y.o. girls 3000 meters

- It should be emphasised to children that they are not expected to run all the way and that the emphasis is on giving children the opportunity to participate and complete the course.

Special Friends and Grandparents are welcome to visit classrooms from 9am until 10.30am and then the Biggest Morning Tea will begin in the Multipurpose Room. 11. Absence Notes

Absence notes are a legal requirement for all absences. Please use the school absence note or submit an absence on Flexibuzz. Both of these are the preferred methods because they are completed immediately. If either of these are not convenient - please ring the school. Formal notes are needed for audit records and your support would be appreciated. We would prefer no text messages.

What happens if absences continue – 7 days a term turns into 28 days a year, which turns into 196 days over 7 years. This results in a child missing 1 whole year of their Primary School years – something for all of us to think about.

12. Attitude to Schools Survey

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

Students from Year 4 to 6, at our school will participate in the survey. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Your child has the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey.

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an <u>assigned identifier</u> that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous in the response file. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over the period Monday 29 April to Friday 7 June. The survey only takes 20 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time. The survey results will be reported back to the school before the end of term 2. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

Public demonstration site tests

In advance of taking NAPLAN online, students are encouraged to explore the <u>public demonstration site</u> tests for their year level in order to familiarise themselves with the different item types as well as the features of the test player.

The timetable for our school needs to be confirmed – but we are looking at 2 activities in the first week and then the other 2 tasks being completed in the second week of the testing period.

14. Pie Warmers / Lunch Orders

During second and third terms, students are able to bring along pies, sausage rolls, pizzas, etc to be heated in the pie heater. Food must be wrapped in foil and labelled with the child's name using a permanent marker. This will begin first week back after the holidays and is only available one day a week on a Thursday. No lunch orders are available in Terms 2 and 3 from the Tally Servo.

15. School Hats

Please remember to pack school hats when your children return to school in term 2. As a Sun-Smart School we wear hats until the end of April.

16. Social Events

Our school values the time that our school community interacts with each other outside of school hours.
