

All students need to please bring their green reader bags back to school ASAP if these are at home. These will be used this year to hold their readers and homework as per normal.

There is a book at the office which needs to be signed if the need arises. This is for Student Late Arrivals and Early Departures. This needs to be signed by parents (or whoever is dropping off or picking up your child). There is also a Visitors Book to be signed for all visitors to the school (this includes parents who stay for reading/Parents Club activities, etc). This will aid our emergency management of the school.

This year we will have 2 School Captains (Boy/Girl) and 2 Vice Captains (Boy/Girl) from Grade 6. All other Grade 5/6 students will be part of JSC.

This year we welcome the following families to our school for the first time – Brittany Wickham & Jordan Bux (Alira), Jacinta Kenny & Ian Grinter (Max), Debbie & Garth Hill (Kade), Renee & Stephen Scott (Will), Ellen Bekkers & Rudy Tielen (Lara), Katrina & Robert Glover (Callum & Lachlan) and Kellie Kimberley (Diesel). Welcome into our school community and we trust that your time at Tallygaroopna PS will be both rich and rewarding.

New pupils starting this year are Fenn Burgess, Alira Bux, Max Grinter, Liam Groves, Kade Hill, Jodie Rutten, Will Scott, Ryder Thomas, Lara Tielen, Sofia Van Taarling (all Foundation students), Diesel Barclay-Kimberley (Grade 1), Callum Glover (Grade 2 and Lachlan Glover (Grade 3). We begin the new year with 73 students which is really promising for our school community – up from 64 at the same time last year.

1. Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) will continue with a term one application process and payment cycle for 2017. This changed timing of the program provides a better alignment with school budgeting and administrative processes and will give families certainty at the beginning of the year regarding CSEF eligibility.

Applications for the CSEF program will open from the commencement of term one, 2017, helping to ensure that all eligible students are able to participate in school trips and sporting activities. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card are eligible to apply. A special consideration category also exists.

A payment of \$125 for eligible primary school students and \$225 for eligible secondary school students will be paid directly to the school to be used towards camps, sports and excursion costs for the benefit of the student. Information went home in envelopes last week.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. This initiative is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

2. Student Headphones

In past years, many students have supplied their own headphones to use at school. We are encouraging this again in 2017, so that these can be used daily by students with a variety of ICT programs which are utilised at school. Obviously there may be some families who may not be able to supply these, so the school will supply some basic ones for students to use – this will occur next week. Good quality headphones cost about \$10 whereas the basic ones which are supplied at school are only about \$5 – not as durable obviously (please see Parent Payment Charges letter).

3. Parent Payment Charges

In previous years, we have mentioned the price of school fees at the beginning of the year in the first newsletter. We now have all of this information in our Parent Payment Charges information letter which went home in envelopes last week. Feel free to contact the office if any clarification is needed. The Essential Education Items have been approved at School Council and are summarised below. With the new Education Department Guidelines specific items need to be itemised hence some minor differences between fees for different year levels. Please refer to the Parent Payment Charges letter for more information on the Optional Extras and Voluntary Items.

4. Policies Endorsed / Reviewed

At the last School Council of the year in 2016, the following policies were reviewed and endorsed: Mathematics, and Information Technology. Both of these policies are now on our school website to view.

There were also a number of Policies that were reviewed in December last year (Attendance, Head Lice, E Smart and Student Engagement). All of these policies will be endorsed at the first School Council meeting of 2017. The E Smart and Student Engagement Policies have been sent home to all families already because no real major changes occurred.

5. Music - Grade 3/4 students

We are looking forward to our Music program continuing in 2017. Students in Grades 3 & 4 will need to purchase a recorder from the school for \$10 each if they don't already have one. Payment for this will need to be added to their school fees if required. Recorders are to be left at school but will obviously be owned by the students. Foundation, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students will focus on percussion instruments which the school already has. Grade 5 and 6 students will utilise ukuleles which the school has as well. Students will have their own recorder because of hygiene reasons. Music will begin on Friday 10th February. Please let the school know ASAP if you can supply your own recorder as an alternative.

6. School Times

The school day commences at 9.00am and concludes at 3.25pm. Recess is from 11.00 - 11.30am and Lunch is from 1.15 - 2.00pm (children eat in classrooms from 1.05 - 1.15pm). We are obliged to give children 5 hours of instruction at school and these specific times cater for this and allow some flexibility with our bus at the end of the day.

7. School Assembly

A school assembly is held each Monday morning beginning at 9.00am in the Multi-Purpose Room. Parents are quite welcome to attend and it generally concludes at approximately 9.30am.

8. Extreme Heat

We all know that a heat wave usually occurs as we return to school. Therefore we shouldn't be surprised that we are expecting extremely high temperatures for the coming weeks. Parents and guardians are reminded that on hot days it is important never to leave children alone in a car.

We have an extreme weather timetable to cover these 'HOT' days. Students will remain indoors for some or all of lunch time and will be encouraged to drink lots of water. Please make sure they bring a water bottle to school each day.

9. Foundation Students Information (Preps)

Throughout the month of February, children in Foundation WILL NOT attend school on Wednesdays. They will remain at home on 8th, 15th and 22nd of February and also the 1st March. There may be some Wednesday's where Miss Beer may require your child to attend a certain time for specific testing, but she will inform parents of this if there is a need. We will continue to implement a whole school buddy program on Friday afternoons, once every fortnight. The first full week for Foundation students will begin on Monday 6th March.

10. Breakfast Club

This began today in the School Kitchen (Multi-Purpose Room) and we look forward to this program being enjoyable for all involved again this year. The Breakfast Club takes place on a Monday and Thursday each week and begins at 8.30am and concludes at 9am. Setting up of the program begins at 8.15am and if you can help out in any way please contact the office. Thanks to the many helpers who assisted last year and we look forward to more great assistance again this year.

11. Tigbiz Communication

To aid communication between our school and the home we will continue to use an application which is available on computers and mobile devices called Tiqbiz. Tiqbiz is a school app and business program designed for newsletters, calendar events and marketing information. The school app includes an instant message service to alert when new information is available while the business program will notify customers of new releases and events. It would be appreciated if all families could download this ASAP so that immediate alerts go directly to everyone.

* The first day of Term 1 is a student-free day in all government schools to allow for appropriate planning to take place for the arrival of students. Each year government schools are provided with four student-free days for professional development, school planning and administration, curriculum development, and student assessment and reporting purposes. We have obviously taken 2 of these at the start of the year - the remaining two student-free days are determined by each individual school, so contact your school for details when they become available.

19. Payment Envelopes

22. Sun Smart Policy

Tallygaroopna Primary School endorses a SunSmart policy during many warm months (September until the end of April). Students must wear their wide-brimmed hat at recess and lunch time. Students without hats must stay in the undercover area between the Multi- Purpose Room and the brick building. New hats may be purchased from the school at a cost of \$10.

23. Medicine at School

For those students required to have medication whilst at school, a Medication Request Form is required to be filled out, signed and returned to the school office prior to the student being administered medication. Further copies are available at the Office. This does not apply to children with asthma with their puffer, although the office must be informed of the child's needs in this regard. Any change to the child's medical condition should be relayed to the office ASAP.

24. Headlice

Please be vigilant in checking your child's hair for lice. There were some frequent head lice incidents last year and we would like to have a relatively 'lice-free' year in 2017. Thanks for your cooperation.

25. Frozen Ice Sticks

Frozen Ice sticks will be available for sale each Friday at lunchtime for 50 cents each.

26. Fruit in Classrooms / Foods

This year, all classrooms will be having a fruit/vegetable break at 10.00am each morning. Students are asked to bring along a piece of fruit/vegetable to eat at this time. There will still be the usual play lunch at recess time which will be eaten in classrooms for all students. No students will be eating outside under any circumstance in 2017.

27. Parents Club

A big thank you to the Parents' Club for organising the Morning Tea last Wednesday. It was a great idea and it was terrific to see so many families attend the first assembly for the year. New and existing parents are always welcome to join this club which constantly supports the school. Last year some great fundraising occurred and the school was able to utilise some funds to go towards school programs, school furniture and excursions which was greatly appreciated.

32. Homework

Homework is an opportunity for parents or carers to participate in their child's education. Homework complements and reinforces classroom learning, and fosters good lifelong study habits. We acknowledge that families have busy lives but all we are asking for as staff at Tallygaroopna PS is a minimum of 30 minutes a week along with nightly reading. Spelling and tables may be implemented by classroom teachers on top of this. As staff, we will accept notes by families if homework is unfinished, as long as this is not a regular occurrence. Homework will be handed out **early in the week** and will be expected to be returned and completed by Friday.

Parents can help children by:

- I encouraging a regular daily session to examine and complete homework
- discussing key questions or suggesting resources to help with homework
- lelping to balance the amount of time spent between homework and recreational activities such as watching television or playing computer games
- asking how homework and class work is progressing, and acknowledging success
- I talking to teachers to discuss problems with homework
- I for upper primary and secondary students, checking whether homework has been set and ensuring that their child keeps a homework diary
- I reading texts set by teachers and discussing their child's responses to set texts and asking to see work they complete in relation to these texts

33. Engagement Policy

All families have received the school's revised Engagement Policy which includes our current school values. This document was approved in 2010 and it is a living and breathing document so new additions / alterations may occur throughout the year. 34. School Bus Safety

Thanks to all families who returned information about the School Bus for 2017 before school began. It is imperative that families who have children who are bus travellers contact the school if their children are not going on the bus in the afternoon (before 3pm). 35. English Online Interview

The English Online Interview is a powerful online tool for assessing the English skills of students in Years Foundation to Grade 2 in Victorian government schools. The Interview assesses students across the three dimensions of the English domain of the Victorian Essential Learning Standards (VELS) – Reading, Writing and Speaking and Listening. 36. School Values

These values are used to support our students, teachers and parents in becoming positive citizens within their community. These are summarised as:

- Inclusion: to include others and to not leave anyone out. To understand, respect, welcome, celebrate and honour the diversity of children, families and staff. Diversity comes in many different forms, for example culture, language, religion, lifestyle, family arrangements and circumstances, abilities and disabilities. Respecting diversity is important in creating a sense of belonging. The different backgrounds of the children, families and staff enrich a schools character and identity. Schools that are responsive to individual differences and respect diversity benefit everyone and help to build an inclusive environment.
- Respect: to treat others with consideration and regard, to respect another person's point of view and to treat others how you would like to be treated. A feeling of admiration or deference toward a person, child, non-human animal, group, ideal, or indeed almost any entity or concept, as well as specific actions and conduct representative of that esteem. Respect can be a specific feeling of regard for the actual qualities of the one respected (e.g., "I have great respect for her judgment"). It can also be conduct in accord with a specific ethic of respect (ie: Anzac Day).
- Honesty: to tell the truth and own up to things in a mature manner. Being honest means you display positive
 attributes such as integrity, truthfulness, straightforwardness, including straightforwardness of conduct, along
 with the absence of lying, cheating, theft, etc. Furthermore, honesty means being trustworthy, loyal, fair,
 and sincere.




