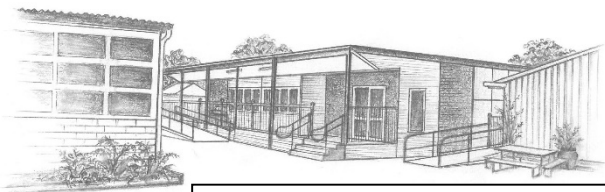
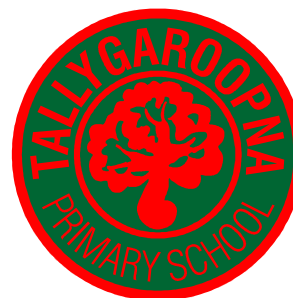

Hi everyone

I am sure that all of our wonderful Mum's had a great Mother's Day yesterday and enjoyed the special treats that were made by our kids over the last couple of weeks. There was a lot of excitement on Friday afternoon and I am sure all of the students of the school spoiled their Mum's, Grand Ma's and Aunties over the weekend.

I would personally like to congratulate all of the Grade 3 and 5 students for their participation in NAPLAN testing last week. We had 100% attendance again and this is a great result as our children show qualities of resilience, determination and application during this time. These tests have already been sent away and we expect some results coming back to families late in Term 2 or early Term 3. A reminder that these tests are just "one offs" and may not necessarily be a true reflection of student achievement that occurs at school. Please keep this in mind when you receive this information and don't hesitate to contact class teachers for some clarification if needed.

Last week was a busy week again with the Division Cross Country on Friday and our first Men's Shed Visit also. The latter was worthwhile and it was fantastic to see our kids interacting and helping out with some male members of our community. We anticipate that this will now be a fortnightly event and we are planning for all of our children to be involved in this program which was instigated by our School Leaders when they went to the Leadership Conference in Shepparton a couple of weeks ago. Well done kids - what a great opportunity for everyone.

In this edition of the newsletter, there are some important items in relation to some extra curricula activities such as the Movie Night and the Special Friends / Grandparents Day and Biggest Morning Day. 6. Music Position

This position closes tomorrow and we hope to be able to announce a successful applicant next week. We are determined to try and keep our Music Specialist Program running this year and will keep families informed as much as possible.

7. Attitude to School Survey

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

The Department has updated the survey for 2017 to include important new measures that are known to influence student engagement and performance. Students from Year 4 to Year 6, at our school will participate in the survey. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Your child has the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey.

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used by the Department to combine data for research purposes only. Your child's privacy and the confidentiality of your child's survey responses will be protected at all times. No identifiable personal data is included in the survey response file.

The survey results will be reported back to the school in term 3. No student can be identified in the results reported to schools or in any other report of the data. Some of these results will be available via the school newsletter.

This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over the period Monday 22nd May to Friday 9th June. The survey only takes 20-30 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time.

8. Science Excursion

On Thursday June 1st, students in Grade 3 to 6 will be travelling to Bundoora to participate in an excursion at Quantum Science Centre. The sessions are designed to promote STEM thinking and give students hands on experience. The venue is free and the bus cost has also been subsidised for country schools so it is a free day for the children. They will need to bring a cut lunch, snacks and water bottle. Students are required in full school uniform. The 3/4 Students will be participating in a session called MaKey MaKey where they create inventions for the 21st century. It's great for beginners & experts doing art, engineering and everything in-between! During this program students will learn about conductors, insulators and basic circuits whilst expressing their creativity in fun and whimsical ways. This hands-on program will have students excited and active while exploring circuitry and design.

The Grade 5/6's will be participating in a Minecraft session where Students will discover the exciting world of Minecraft and learn through collaboration in team projects! Quantum Victoria's Minecraft program is for Victorian students who are interested in developing digital media skills, exploring their creativity and developing online social skills using a safe and secure virtual world. Students will join our community space and have access to a project-based learning oriented achievement system whilst exploring science, engineering, mathematics and logic within our Minecraft world. They will initially participate in our full day program with the potential to have access back at their school, after school and on weekends in a fully monitored environment, whilst having access to in-world mentors. This extensive program is designed to support students in developing digital literacy skills in a peer-negotiated way.

HAROLD'S FRIEND SHIP

Foundation / Year 1

After building a model spaceship at school, Harold and his friends, Boots and Red venture into an imaginary world in outer space. As the adventure unfolds children explore:

- how to build friendships and care for others
- feelings and emotions
- safe and unsafe situations and early warning signs
- safe places and people to turn to for help

SAFETY RULES

Year 1 / Year 2

Harold and his friends have gone camping, but when someone gets injured on a hiking expedition, how will they look after each other and make it back to camp? This module helps children to problem solve and focuses on:

- recognising safe and unsafe environments
- how to care for others
- behaviours that maintain friendships
- places and people who we can go to for help

MIND YOUR MEDICINE

Years 3 - 5

Using a friendly game show format *Mind Your Medicine* develops students' understanding of medicines and their safe use, positive communication, strategies for managing conflict, stress, and bullying and explores how feelings influence the choices that we make.

- factors that influence someone's sense of self-worth
- techniques for effective communication
- identifying the impact of different factors on health and wellbeing
- strategies for managing stressful situations
- medicines as drugs & the consequences of their misuse

DECISIONS

Years 5 - 6

This module offers a choice of content on legal drugs or legal and illegal drugs. Students explore the decision making process and improve decision making skills by looking at choices, consequences, responsibility, facts, and influences.

- what is a drug and how drugs are classified
- effects of drugs on the body
- analysing health messages about drugs in the media
- messages around non-use – normative data – dispelling myths
- influences on decision making – family, peers, media, culture, financial, legal
- strategies and skills to be safe

11. Placement Forms

These are due at the office NOW for all Grade 6 students. All students received a colour Transition Booklet a number of weeks ago for choosing a Secondary School and the placement form is located at the back of this book.

Fri 12 May	Parents/Carers return Application for Year 7 Placement forms to primary schools by this date. Primary Schools are responsible for checking that the form is complete and that the parent's/carer's choice is clear.
Tue 30 May	Primary schools submit all initial placement requests (first preferences) to each relevant secondary school by this date, with Summary of Placement Requests form, and photocopy of each Application for Year 7 Placement form (as <i>all original documentation should be retained by the primary school</i>). Please note: Schools must not communicate with parents/carers regarding the status of placement requests until Wednesday 9 August (primary schools) or Thursday 10 August (secondary schools). Secondary Schools must not make offers to any student for specific programs prior to Thursday 10 August.

This program continues this week. As per usual, sessions after school begin at 3.35pm and will finish at 4.35pm. Students receive a healthy snack before the program begins for all school sessions. Students need to be picked up immediately after each session.

The next meeting will be held on Monday 29th May at 7.30pm and all are welcome.

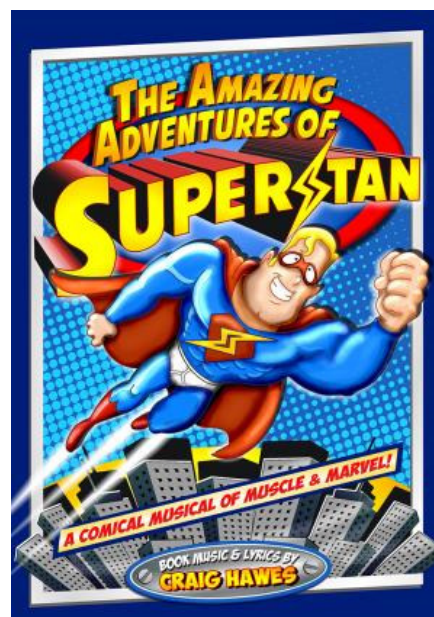
16. Playgroup Dates
