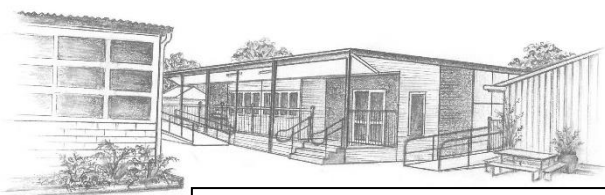

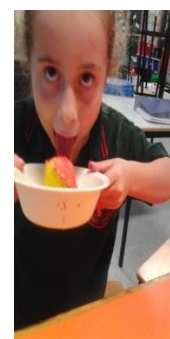

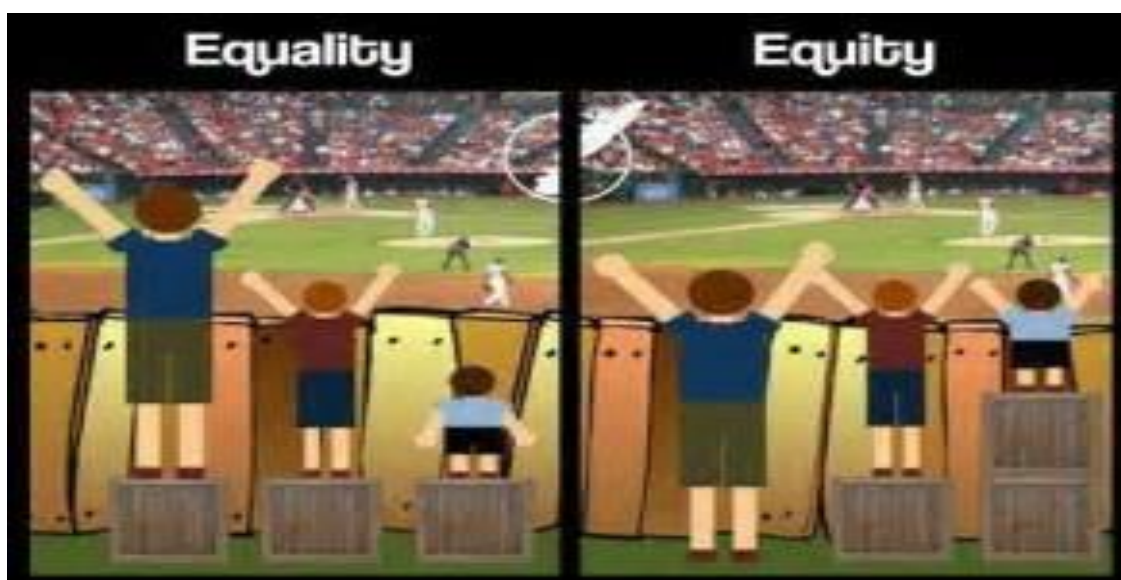

## Illness

If your child has been vomiting, it is Department policy that they DO NOT attend school for a period of 24 hours from their last vomit.

They are also not permitted back at school until 24 hours after their last loose bowel movement.

We have had recent cases where children are coming to school after vomiting the night before. Sending your child to school prior to recommendations puts the health of staff and students at risk of becoming ill.

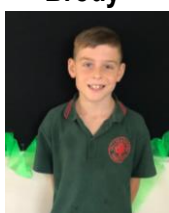
#### Foundation / Grade 1 - Mrs H's Super Students Lebron & Ayla

### **1. Transition – Greater Shepparton College**

Specific information regarding the transition process for Grade 6 students for 2020 was published in the newsletter a couple of weeks ago. The community will be informed of any other news regarding the Greater Shepparton College (interim name) via the newsletter and Flexibuzz – so stay tuned. Last week, a new website was announced also - <https://www.findmyschool.vic.gov.au/>

The Region will print transition information for parents, ensuring that clear information is provided in this pack to advise parents of 2020 Year 7 arrangements for Greater Shepparton College (Interim Name). The Region is also planning to have the transition information printed and distributed to schools early in Term 2 so that we can promptly distribute to our Year 6 student families.

### **2. Attitude to Schools Survey - tomorrow**

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

Students from Year 4 to 6 at our school will participate in the survey. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Your child has the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey.

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous in the response file. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over the period Monday 29 April to Friday 7 June. The survey only takes 20 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time. The survey results will be reported back to the school before the end of term 2. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

#### **Public demonstration site tests**

In advance of taking NAPLAN online, students are encouraged to explore the [public demonstration site](#) tests for their year level in order to familiarise themselves with the different item types as well as the features of the test player.

We are looking at 2 activities in the first week and then the other 2 tasks being completed in the second week of the testing period to assist with any anxiety that exists during this period. We have trialled NAPLAN online with our children and there seemed to be a sense of enjoyment with this which was encouraging.



#### **4. School Photos**

This is scheduled for Friday 17<sup>th</sup> May. Photo envelopes have been sent home and details in regard to photo choices and prices are part of this information. All envelopes will need to be returned before the day. **Family envelopes can be collected at the office if needed.**

#### **5. Open Days**

The first Open Day was held today and there are 6 other dates available if needed. These will be held from 9.30am until 10.30am. Any potential families are more than welcome to organise another date that may suit - contact the office in regard to this please.

#### **6. Biggest Morning Tea / Special Friends Day**

This is one of the big events of the year and has always been well attended so we are expecting many visitors on the day – Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> May. Special Friends and Grandparents are welcome to visit classrooms from 9am until 10.30am and then the Biggest Morning Tea will begin in the Multipurpose Room. This will conclude at around midday and a gold coin donation would be appreciated for the Cancer Council. Can all family members please bring a plate to share for this day – no peanuts in any food please. #### **7. Production Update**

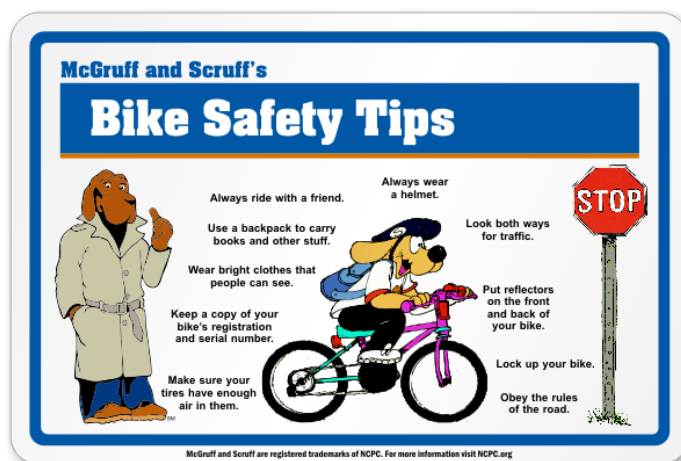

## Grade 2 / 3 / 4 Program – 11<sup>th</sup> June

### **BCYBERWISE**

Years 3 - 5

This module focuses on cybersafety, cyber ethics and building positive relationships with friends online and offline. The students explore a range of issues such as password security, risks of sharing personal information, how to communicate respectfully both online and offline, and strategies to handle bullying including cyberbullying.

- responsible and respectful behaviour when using communication technology
- skills for building positive relationships with friends
- keeping personal information safe online
- strategies to deal with bullying and cyberbullying
- exploring the role of bystanders

## Grade 5 / 6 Program – 11<sup>th</sup> June

### **THINK TWICE**

Years 5 - 6

Using distinctive animated and vox-pop videos, this module tackles the topic of drinking alcohol in an age appropriate context. Students explore concepts such as the effect that alcohol has on body systems, myths and facts about alcohol, laws relating to its sale and reasons why people choose not to consume alcohol.

- myths and facts surrounding the use of alcohol
- strategies for responding to encouragement or pressure to drink
- physical, social & legal consequences of alcohol use
- strategies to reduce harmful effects of alcohol on self and others
