News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone. Last week we began NAPLAN testing and it was terrific to see the positive attitude displayed by all of our Grade 3 and 5 students during this time. We have completed the Writing and Reading Tasks and we look forward to implementing Language Conventions tomorrow and then the Numeracy task on Wednesday. Thursday will be a catch up day if needed for any students who have been absent during this time. I would like to remind families – this testing is just a snapshot of student achievement and it does not fully encapsulate the whole learner. Many tasks are completed throughout the semester to enable staff to make a valuable judgement and this will be reflected in the student reports at the end of term 2.

Today, Mrs Haberfield, Miss Lothian and myself attended the final module of the Professional Learning Communities Initiative. We have worked extremely hard over the last couple of months with an emphasis on improving Grammar & Punctuation in Grade 5 – focusing on the use of apostrophes. Over a few weeks, we saw an improvement of 23%, which was encouraging, and we were able to share our journey today with other schools involved in this initiative. We look forward to continuing to have a micro focus on other aspects of the curriculum into the future and set specific goals and targets.

In this edition of the newsletter, there are a number of photos to highlight Cross Country, leaders at work and a recent visit to Kinder. We have had a couple of Open Days already this year – the next one is on Thursday and we look forward to announcing our Transition Program for new Foundation students in the not too distant future. As always, we value our relationship with the local Kindergarten and more visits are planned in the next few weeks.

Work with the Production is starting to pick up speed - please don't hesitate to contact any staff if needed – this program will be held a couple of weeks earlier this year and rehearsals will begin soon. If you can assist with costumes and props – please let us know. These are published in this newsletter for parents to refer to if needed.

To support your decision making, the Department has launched a new website to help you locate your local school, and give you transparency of choice in public schools across the Victorian public school system.

Your child is guaranteed a place at their local designated neighbourhood school, however you can choose to request enrolment at another school if you prefer. The school will use the Placement Policy to consider the application.

What you need to do

- 2. Locate your designated neighbourhood school or preferred secondary schools using www.findmyschool.vic.gov.au
- 3. Complete the Application for Year 7 Placement form and return to your primary school by Friday 31st May 2019.

Year 7 placements are determined by secondary schools. You will be sent notification of Year 7 placement for 2020 on **Wednesday 7th August 2019**.

19. Absence Notes



Rationale:

• A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the Dress Code.

Aims:

- To promote equality amongst all students.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with our school.
- To provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation:

- After consultation with the school community and the Student Representative Council, School
 Council has developed a Dress Code that we believe provides choice for the students, allows for
 students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, and caters for the financial
 constraints of families.
- The Dress Code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions. Change to this is subject to the Principals discretion.
- Summer and Winter uniforms, as well as a sports uniform will be prescribed, and are required to be worn.
- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, plus watches are the only acceptable jewellery.
- Extreme hair colors and/or extreme hairstyles are not permitted.
- Enclosed shoes must be worn at school.
- Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn at school.
- The only head wear that is acceptable is Sunsmart hats consistent with our Sunsmart policy. They must be worn outside from September until the end of April. Hats are not to be worn inside.
- From May until the end of August, school beanies and scarves are permitted to be worn outside.
- The Parents Club will accept good quality second hand uniforms, and will operate a second hand uniform store for parents.
- The student Dress Code, including details of uniform items and places of purchase, will be published in the newsletter at the start of each year.
- School Council requires the Principal be responsible for implementation of the Dress Code in a manner consistent with the Student Code of Conduct.
- Parents seeking exemptions to the Dress Code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability, health condition or economic hardship must apply in writing to the principal.

Evaluation:

- This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's three year review cycle and feedback will be sought from the School Community.
- This policy was updated and endorsed by School Council on Wed 17th Feb 2016.
- These policies will be implemented in accordance with our **Student Engagement Policy.**
