**1. COVID-19 Reminder** – Just a reminder to families about the guidelines for COVID-19. Unfortunately, a few cases have popped up again. It is recommended that staff members, students or visitors who have symptoms of cold, influenza or COVID-19 undergo testing for COVID-19. Parents of symptomatic students should be asked to collect their child from school and keep them home until they are no longer symptomatic.

The Department of Health recommends that staff and students who test positive for COVID-19 isolate for a minimum of 5 days and do not attend school until their symptoms resolve.

**2. Biggest Morning Tea** – This will be held on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> May and details are in this edition of the newsletter. All of our visitors will have an opportunity to go through classrooms from 9.30am to 10.30am and then the morning tea will begin at 10.30am. We anticipate that the morning will conclude at about midday. **We ask that all families please bring a plate to share.**

**3. Grade 5/6 Position** – We will be aiming to send home some specific information in regard to an update with this position in the next day or two. Thanks for everyone's patience with this matter. At present, the contingency plan will be implemented as stated in the information that was provided to Grade 5/6 families last Friday.

**4. Enrolments** – Thanks to those families who contacted me a few weeks ago in regard to Foundation enrolments for 2025. Foundation enrolments for next year can now be received. If you are planning on leaving the school can you let David know as well please to assist with planning for next year. Confidentiality will be respected.

**5. Attitude to Schools Survey** – This year, the AtoSS will be conducted at from Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May to Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June. Contact the office if you would prefer for your child to not participate.

**6. Tissues** – Could all families please donate some tissue boxes to school.

**7. Sweets & Pie Drive** – The Parents' Club have organised this with Dunkirk Food Store and Wunghnu Café. Order forms have gone home and are due back by Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> May. Goods are to be collected on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June from 3pm. Any updates will be on Skool Loop.

**8. Ballarat Camp** – This camp is planned for Grade 5/6 students in Term 4 from Monday 28<sup>th</sup> October to Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> October. Families are encouraged to make regular payments to assist with the overall cost of this camp. We anticipate that this camp will be about \$400 - \$450 per student subject to fundraising.

**9. Curriculum Days** – Just a reminder to families that we have scheduled two Report Writing days (curriculum days) on the following days:

Term 2: Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June (in line with the King's Birthday holiday on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> June)

Term 4: Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November (in line with the Melbourne Cup public holiday on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> November).

**10. Munch N Crunch** – The next lunch for students will be on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> June (hot dog). We anticipate that orders will go out to families soon.

**11. Parent Payment Arrangements for 2024** – These were approved at school council on 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2023 and are set at \$200 per student for 2024 to cover student supplies, online subscriptions and MACC & MARC costs. 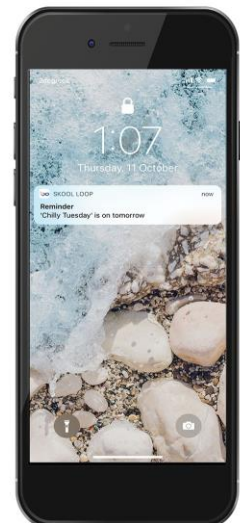

## SCHOOL GENERAL RULE: "TO CONSIDER THE FEELINGS OF OTHERS AT ALL TIMES".

### Here's some tips to ensure you receive notices and push notifications

- When you download the Skool Loop App you will be asked if you would like notifications please **tap yes**. Some devices don't ask this question and automatically tick yes for you. This can be changed in your settings
- If your notifications are turned off in your device settings, some phones apply that to all apps when downloading. In the phone settings please make sure your notifications are turned on
- Check your App Store or Google Play regularly for any outstanding updates
- There are 2 different notices school will send out: **push notification** (banner and ding) or a **notice** (visual alert only)
- You will only receive a push notification if you are not using the app at the time
- If your volume is off you will not hear an alert
- You will see a visual alert if a **notice** has been posted. You will not hear a ding
- You will only hear a ding if the school sends a **push notification**.

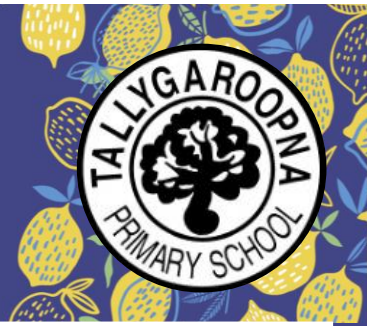
**Absence Notes** – The preferred method to notify the school is via Skool Loop. A written note will also be accepted so that we have something in writing.
