1. After School Care


2. Road Closure

Goulburn Murray Water will commence work on the construction of a new pipe culvert on Boundary Road, Tallygaroopna, on Monday June 4, 2012. This work forms part of Capital Works Program 2011/2012.

It will be necessary to close the section of Boundary Road between Kerr and Moores Roads to through traffic from 7.30am Monday, June 4th to 5.30pm Friday June 15th, 2012. We have been in touch with Jacobson's Bus Lines and this road closure should not affect our school bus run at all.

Motorists are asked to be mindful of the works and obey all signage when travelling in the area. Detours around the work site will apply. Goulburn-Murray Water apologises for any inconvenience caused as a result of the works.

3. Stop Work Day

The Department is currently involved in enterprise bargaining with the Australian Education Union in relation to its log of claims covering employees in the executive class, the principal class, the teacher class and the paraprofessional class. As part of its industrial campaign the Union has called on its members to stop work for 24 hours on 7 June 2012. Under the *Fair Work Act 2009* a protected action ballot of members of the Union is required before industrial action can be taken. The ballot was conducted by the Australian Electoral Commission and closed on 30 May 2012. The Commission has advised that a majority of members has supported the taking of industrial action. However, staff at Tallygaroopna PS will not be striking so it will be a normal school day.

4. Cluster Day at Dookie

Last week, we received some great feedback from Michael Ramsay, Principal of Dookie PS, in regard to the Cluster Day. He mentioned that he ran an activity with the Grade 5/6 students and every child he dealt with was polite, followed the rules, never complained when they were out and showed great sportsmanship. 5. Values Vault

6. Young Leaders Day

One of the goals they have between now and the end of the year is to have some more fun days at school. These may include such things as cooking and woodwork. 7. Science Specialist Program

Mrs Thomas is hoping to organise an excursion for all Year 5/6 students to Ecolinc, a Science and Technology Innovations Centre in Bacchus Marsh in term 4. Ecolinc provides innovative curriculum programs which focus on sustainable environmental practices. It is an impressive facility built on a model wetland, and incorporates state of the art technology in the programs it offers. We know it would be a big day, but would provide students with a fantastic opportunity to experience 3 different scientific sessions. There would be no cost for the excursion as rural Government schools are able to apply for a grant to cover the full cost of the program and transport. More details will be available soon – a possible date may be October 26th.

Last week, our school also received a new portable microscope which utilises specific software. This is a real engaging tool and we are able to use this device with our 10 new laptops at school.

8. School Council / Finance

Our next School Council meeting and Finance Committee meeting will be this Wednesday 6th June. The Finance Committee will meet at 6.30pm followed by School Council at 7.30pm. School Council Meetings are open to the school community - visitors or observers can be present at meetings with the agreement of the principal and a decision of council. There are times when the council meeting, or part of the meeting, needs to be closed though.

9. Grade 3/4 Camp

Students wishing to attend the Grade 3/4 Camp to Curumbene should now put in an expression of interest and a small deposit. This camp is being organised by Dookie PS and is scheduled to be a 3 day camp from Wednesday 1st August until Friday 3rd August. The camp will be a Cluster camp so 6 cluster schools will participate. Planning is still taking place and the cost will be finalised ASAP. Could families please fill out the form on the newsletter ASAP and hand in a deposit to Karen by Monday 11th June. Numbers will then be handed into Dookie PS. We will assume that students will not be attending the camp if this is not done. Mrs Haberfield will be attending the camp and the Grade 2's will be split at school for the duration of the camp. They will have a small booklet to work through during this time.

13. School Reports

These will be handed out on Monday 25th June. Teachers spend a lot of valuable time putting these together so please take the time to read these before attending Parent Teacher Interviews. Report folders will be handed out with reports, to new students in our school this year, so that past and present reports can be collated into this one folder. All students who were at our school last year, should already have this folder. If any parents are missing any reports from previous years can you contact Karen at the office and we hopefully can make a copy of this for you.

The report cards have:

- a chart with an A-E rating, showing your child's current progress against the expected state-wide standard as well as the progress they have made since the previous year
- a chart showing your child's level of effort and class behaviour
- details about attendance
- easy to understand comments from teachers outlining what your child knows and can do, any areas in which your child needs to be given further help or extended, and how this will be done
- suggestions for how you can help at home

16. AASC Program


