**1. Biggest Morning Tea** – We were able to raise \$210 for the Cancer Council from this event last Thursday. It was wonderful to see so many visitors to our school and many smiles on people's faces.

**2. End of Year Events** – We anticipate that the following events will be held in the second half of the year. It might be a good idea to pencil these into calendars for the time being.

**3. Contacting Staff Reminder** – Staff at Tallygaroopna Primary School value the relationship with families in our school community. Communication is vital and we ask that staff and family members strive to (where possible):

- Only contact each other between the hours of 8.00am – 5.00pm from Monday to Friday
- Only use the following platforms for communication between families and classroom teacher: Class Dojo or email
- Only use the following platforms for communication between families and the school: school phone, school email or Skool Loop.

**4. Complaints** – Please either email, telephone or arrange a meeting through the front office with the Principal, to outline your complaint so that we can fully understand what the issues are. We can discuss your complaint in a way that is convenient for you, whether in writing, in person or over the phone.

A formal phone call or in person meeting is recommended because some messages via email, text or on Class Dojo can be misinterpreted.

**5. Open Days** – We have a number of Open Days still scheduled for Term 2 for prospective families and students. Please promote these dates as much as possible – these are now on all school communication platforms. We hope to have an idea of enrolments for 2024 by the end of Term 2. Please hand in enrolment forms - this will assist with planning and staffing for the new year.

**6. Curriculum Days** – Curriculum Days have been scheduled on the following days:

Term 2: Friday 9<sup>th</sup> June: Report Writing (in line with the King's Birthday holiday on Mon 12<sup>th</sup> June)

Term 3: Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> July: First Aid & CPR

Term 4: Monday 6<sup>th</sup> Nov: Report Writing (in line with the Melbourne Cup Public Holiday on Tues 7<sup>th</sup> Nov).

**7. Milo & Snags** – Order forms were sent home last week with the eldest child in each family. Orders are simple - \$15 per student will allow for students to purchase a milo and a sausage for the 5 Friday's indicated below – orders close at the end of Term 2.

**9. Life Ed. Van** – This program will not be onsite this year because they are having staffing difficulties. As a result, this program will be held virtually on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> August – further details will be available soon.

**10. Chaplaincy** – Last week, we had some discussions with a new provider who could assist us with filling our Chaplaincy position for the rest of the year. We are hopeful of filling this position soon. We also are in the process of applying for funding for a further 4 years– fingers crossed.

**11. OSH Care Numbers** – Just a reminder to our families to try and support OSH Care as much as possible. Numbers have declined recently and our weekly numbers of about 30 have been cut to about 15 of late.

The future of OSH Care is discussed frequently at School Council. If numbers are still around 15 - we may have to reduce the days that it operates to ensure that it remains sustainable going forward.

**12. Attitude to Schools Survey** – The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Grade 4, 5 and 6 students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general. This year, the AtoSS will be conducted at our school from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> May to Friday 9<sup>th</sup> June. Further information is on Skool Loop. Contact the school if you would prefer for your child to not participate.

**13. Movie Night** – This will be held on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June and will involve a Pizza Tea at 6pm followed by a movie. Further information is included in this edition of the newsletter and tea orders need to be returned by Friday 9<sup>th</sup> June to assist with catering. The eldest child in each family received this flyer last week. We anticipate that the night would conclude at about 8.30pm.

**14. Canberra Camp** – This camp is planned for Grade 5/6 students in Term 4 from Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> October to Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> October. We anticipate that this camp will cost about \$400 - \$450 per student subject to fundraising. Families are encouraged to make regular payments to ensure that their fee is fully paid prior to the start of the camp.

**15. Subway Munch N Crunch** – The final Munch N Crunch for the term will be held on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> June. We anticipate that orders will go home in the next few weeks.

**16. Lost Property** – There is a large amount of lost property in the Project Space. Can families have a look through this please and feel free to take any items home if you think these belong to you. A reminder to name items – unfortunately, many of these items are unnamed.

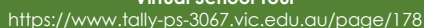

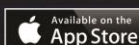
