#### News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone

This week is obviously a short week with the Public Holiday on Monday and the Curriculum Day yesterday. Teachers are busily putting the final touches to reports and we are aiming to send these home to families on Monday 26th June. There are some minor changes with the Reports this year as we are always trying to improve these for our School Community. Parents will notice that some areas assessed will not show 12 months progress—this is a result of changing over from AusVELS to the Victorian Curriculum and progress will be more evident over time. I encourage all families to look at past reports to reflect on specific progress if needed.

So far, we have had 2 successful Open Days with some families coming into our school on both days. At present, we look like having at least 7 new Foundation students into our school for 2018, but this may continue to increase over the coming weeks. As a result, we are anticipating implementing 4 classroom programs again in the new year and I will continue to keep our families updated in regard to this. Enrolments are currently 76, which is a huge increase over the last couple of years.

Last week we had our Life Education Van visit our school. This day is always rewarding and does reinforce important themes for the older students of the school as they start thinking about the challenges of Secondary School. We also had our third Men's Shed visit last Friday and the kids are really enjoying this opportunity to get out of the school and help in the community. More visits will take place every fortnight with the aim for all students to participate. On these days, we have to alter our Art Program marginally so that children can attend these sessions and not miss Art. Sorry for any inconvenience in regard to this.

Finally, I would like to thank those families who have helped set up our new Garden Beds at school. These look terrific and the children will have some input into what is planted in this area. We may start growing some vegies before the holidays – depending on the weather.

Karen will be at the school until Thursday as usual to attend to any matters that arise. I look forward to catching up with some parents throughout the week. I will be away on Monday and Tuesday next week at a Principals Conference.

There was much excitement as the Grade 3/4 and 5/6 students braved the cold and early start to board the bus to Quantum. We made great time and were very impressed with the facilities when we arrived. The Grade 3/4 students participated in the MaKey MaKey session where they used scientific measuring equipment to make play doh and then conducted experiments to research if objects were conductors or insulators. After lunch, the 3/4's were introduced to circuits and used computer software to create a controller for a game.

Students were then challenged to plan and build a monument as a team. #### 1. School Reports

School Reports will go home to families in sealed envelopes on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> June. Teachers spend a huge amount of time completing assessments and writing written comments so please read these carefully in preparation for the Student Led Conferences which will be held on Thursday 29th June. The aim of this day is to give all students an opportunity to discuss their progress so far at school with staff and families. **Therefore, students will be required at school only for the duration of their interview** (family arrangements will need to be made). This day links to our Kidsmatter theme and allows us to continue to build on the relationship which is necessary for both staff and parents. We hope to see all children attend this day. If this day does not suit, an alternative arrangement may be made.

#### What exactly do the A-E ratings mean?

A indicates achievement that is **above the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting (12 months or more ahead of the standard expected at the time of reporting)

**B** indicates achievement that is **above the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that your child understands more complex ideas and has a broader range of skills than would normally be expected.

**C** indicates achievement that is **at the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that your child's learning is on track and that they understand and can apply the range of skills and knowledge expected for their year level at the time of reporting.

**D** indicates achievement that is **below the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that there are some skills and knowledge that your child has yet to acquire before they can be said to be achieving at the expected standard.

**E** indicates achievement that is **well below the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means there are significant areas of knowledge and skills your child needs to acquire before they can be said to be achieving at the expected standard.

#### Isn't a 'C' a disappointing result?

No it is not at all. It is important to remember that if your child receives a 'C' on the report card it indicates that their *learning is on track* and they are achieving the statewide standard that *is expected of them* at the time of reporting. In the past, a 'C' in some schools might have meant that the child was performing below the expected standard. This is no longer the case.

#### 2. Student Led Conference Day

Student Led Conferences will be held on Thursday 29th June. These are basically Parent Teacher Interviews but involve the students. As a result, students are at the helm, as they are the ones who are responsible for presenting their work and progress on this day in a very informal manner. All students will be involved and prepare a simple Student Led Conference sheet which allows for the children to talk about their time at Tallygaroopna PS. Samples of work are shown as well and the students generally pick some of these using Post It notes.

There will be time for parents and teachers to discuss students' progress without the children present. However, these student led conferences allow all of our kids to be involved in some way at the beginning of the session and to have ownership for their learning and progress at school.

#### 3. Number Fluency Assessment

The teachers of Tallygaroopna Primary use a number of assessments during the year to assess how your child is developing academically, these may be through literacy or mathematical testing. Part of the Mathematical testing is the Number Fluency Assessment (NFA). This testing gives us an idea of how your child is developing in the following four areas: Counting, Numeration (Place Value), Addition & Subtraction and Multiplication & Division.

This year we were delighted to learn through the Numeracy Leaders Days, that this test has been revised and we have worked hard to put together new testing booklets and kits for this testing period. It has come to our attention throughout this testing that students results may change when compared to the previous test/testing period. We would like to inform you that while it may (in some instances - not all) look like your child/ren have dropped back or "gone backwards" it is just bringing their testing results in line with our new NFA test.

We do not believe this will be a regular occurrence especially as the last test has been used by Tallygaroopna Primary School for 10 years. If you have any questions please feel free to drop in and chat with David or the classroom teachers.


