1. Principal's Conference – Today I attended a conference in Melbourne with other school Principals. This was an opportunity to come together, hear from renowned educators and leading practitioners, and discover new ways of thinking about leadership excellence.

3. Positive Parenting Seminars – There are a couple of these sessions which are highly recommended for our families. These are held on Thursday 15th June with one session being held at the local kindergarten at 9am and another session being held at GSSS in the evening. 14. Produce Fundraiser – Information has been sent home with the eldest child in each family in regard to this. Orders and payment will be due on Friday the 21st of July with boxes to be delivered and available for pick up from school on Wednesday the 26th of July.

15. OSH Care Numbers – Just a reminder to our families to try and support OSH Care as much as possible. Numbers have declined recently and our weekly numbers of about 30 have been cut to about 15 of late.

The future of OSH Care is discussed frequently at School Council. If numbers are still around 15 - we may have to reduce the days that it operates to ensure that it remains sustainable going forward.

16. Attitude to Schools Survey – The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Grade 4, 5 and 6 students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general. This year, the AtoSS will be conducted this Wednesday - further information is on Skool Loop. Contact the school if you would prefer for your child to not participate.

17. Canberra Camp – This camp is planned for Grade 5/6 students in Term 4 from Monday 23rd October to Thursday 26th October. We anticipate that this camp will cost about \$400 - \$450 per student subject to fundraising. Families are encouraged to make regular payments to ensure that their fee is fully paid prior to the start of the camp.

18. Movie Night – This will be held on Friday 16th June and will involve a Pizza Tea at 6pm followed by a movie. Further information is included in this edition of the newsletter and tea orders need to be returned by Friday 9th June to assist with catering. The eldest child in each family received this flyer a few weeks ago. We anticipate that the night would conclude at about 8.30pm.

19. Subway Munch N Crunch – The final Munch N Crunch for the term will be held on Thursday 22nd June. We anticipate that orders will go home soon.

20. Lost Property – There is a large amount of lost property in the Project Space. Can families have a look through this please and feel free to take any items home if you think these belong to you. A reminder to name items – unfortunately, many of these items are unnamed.

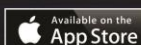
