**1. Uniform Reminder** – A reminder to families to reinforce our school uniform. This should give our students a sense of pride without competition at school. Shorts should be only black without logos and beanies during winter months should be bottle green or red – not footy beanies. Thanks for your cooperation with this matter.

**2. Music (Leave)** – Miss Parry will be taking some long service leave for Term 3. Our Music program will continue during this time with Mrs Tucker assisting as much as possible. Mr Brodie will also fill in as needed with some Music history content being delivered across the school.

**3. Concrete Art** – Parents will be at school doing this tomorrow from about 12pm – after Munch N Crunch. All are welcome to come along and help.

**4. COVID-19 Reminder** – Just a reminder to families about the guidelines for COVID-19. Unfortunately, a few cases have popped up again. It is recommended that staff members, students or visitors who have symptoms of cold, influenza or COVID-19 undergo testing for COVID-19. Parents of symptomatic students should be asked to collect their child from school and keep them home until they are no longer symptomatic.

The Department of Health recommends that staff and students who test positive for COVID-19 isolate for a minimum of 5 days and do not attend school until their symptoms resolve.

**5. Enrolments** – Thanks to those families who contacted me a few weeks ago in regard to Foundation enrolments for 2025. Foundation enrolments for next year can now be received. If you are planning on leaving the school can you let David know as well please to assist with planning for next year. Confidentiality will be respected.

**6. Munch N Crunch** – The next lunch for students will be on this Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> June (hot dog). Orders have now closed.

**7. Sweets & Pie Drive** – The Parents' Club have organised this with Dunkirk Food Store and Wunghnu Café. Orders have now closed and goods are to be collected on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June from 3pm. Any updates will be on Skool Loop.

**8. Ballarat Camp** – This camp is planned for Grade 5/6 students in Term 4 from Monday 28<sup>th</sup> October to Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> October. Families are encouraged to make regular payments to assist with the overall cost of this camp. We anticipate that this camp will be about \$400 - \$450 per student subject to fundraising. An Expression of interest went home last week and this is due on Thursday so that final numbers can be confirmed.

**9. Curriculum Days** – Just a reminder to families that we have scheduled two Report Writing days (curriculum days) on the following days:

Term 2: Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June (in line with the King's Birthday holiday on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> June)

Term 4: Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November (in line with the Melbourne Cup public holiday on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> November).

**10. Parent Payment Arrangements for 2024** – These were approved at school council on 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2023 and are set at \$200 per student for 2024 to cover student supplies, online subscriptions and MACC & MARC costs. # APPENDIX A: TALLYGARROOPA PS UNIFORM ITEMS

## All year round

The following items may be worn all year round, with either the summer or winter uniform:

### **Bomber Jacket or Windcheater**

Bottle green/red bomber jacket with school logo

Bottle green crew-neck windcheater

### **Polo shirts**

Bottle green short sleeved with school logo. Grade 6 students may wear a red polo shirt with school logo. Bottle green long sleeved polo.

### **Skorts**

Plain black skorts without decoration or brand name and in winter can be worn with black tights/stockings.

### **Here's some tips to ensure you receive notices and push notifications**

- When you download the Skool Loop App you will be asked if you would like notifications please **tap yes**. Some devices don't ask this question and automatically tick yes for you. This can be changed in your settings
- If your notifications are turned off in your device settings, some phones apply that to all apps when downloading. In the phone settings please make sure your notifications are turned on
- Check your App Store or Google Play regularly for any outstanding updates
- There are 2 different notices school will send out: **push notification** (banner and ding) or a **notice** (visual alert only)
- You will only receive a push notification if you are not using the app at the time
- If your volume is off you will not hear an alert
- You will see a visual alert if a **notice** has been posted. You will not hear a ding
- You will only hear a ding if the school sends a **push notification**.
