1. Hume Region Cross Country

This is a wonderful opportunity and we all wish them luck in their endeavours and know they will do themselves and their families proud. We look forward to hearing about their day.

2. Woorabinda Camp

A big thank you to all of the families who have returned application and medical forms for the Woorabinda Camp. This is scheduled from Monday 29th July until Friday 2nd August. Further travel arrangements will be made available as soon as possible. It would be appreciated if the cost for the camp could be paid by Friday 19th July. At this stage, no teachers from our school will be attending this camp, but teachers from other local schools will be attending. Hopefully, details regarding this will be available soon as well. Mrs Haberfield will be attending the Grade 3/4 Camp to 15 Mile Creek in September.



3. Dance Festival

7. Scientist in Schools Program

To complement our Science Specialists Program, next term we will be starting our Scientist in Schools Program. This initiative is designed to support long-term, ongoing professional partnerships between volunteer teachers and volunteer scientists. As a result, we will be working with Allie Ford during a couple of Skye sessions in term 3 which are planned for 19th July and 13th September. Both sessions will begin at 10am and go for about an hour.

A brief bio on Allie is provided below:

I studied astrophysics and chemistry at Keele University in the UK. I loved both subjects, but the astro called to me more strongly so I went on and did a PhD at Keele, though I kept up with the chemistry by using spectroscopy (looking at colours/wavelenths of light) to determine the compositions of stars in clusters (the Pleiades and Hyades, amongst others) as well as old individual stars in the halo around our Galaxy.

I did a postdoctoral placement at the Open University (UK) for a year, continuing the research, before moving to Monash for a 2-year postdoc contract (that was 10 years ago, I'm still trying to get home!). I quickly learned that research wasn't really my cup of tea; I'm a communicator and teacher, so I focussed on getting involved with lecturing. I developed an observational astronomy third-year unit, as well as having taught into all three years of undergraduate astronomy, supervised an honours student, and spent the better part of the decade teaching a Life in the Universe unit, which I loved. I also tutored statistics for scientists, and a core science second-year subject with a focus on communication and information research.

A year ago I got tired of the two-tier system in universities, with all the emphasis on research and teaching being the poor cousin - it was always a fight to be allowed to teach well, rather than just teach content and eventually the fight wore me down. I'm still passionate about science and science communication - I'm a panelist in a show called 'Science of Fiction: Doctor Who' which has been at Adelaide Fringe and opened National Science Week in Canberra last year. I don't get to do quite as much science as I'd like these days, but I'll still talk about it and educate people about it at every opportunity! I currently work as a Learning Skills Adviser at Monash. I'm now based in the library, and spend much of my time working with students about different study skills (everything from how to understand assignment instructions to putting references in the right places, academic writing, time management and exam revision). I work with students from various aspects of health care (largely nursing, but also paramedics, occupational therapists, physios and occasional doctors), so there's still quite a lot of science understanding to be had!

This will be my fifth SIS partnership (I actually have three virtual partner schools at the moment!) so I've tried all sorts of different things and have a range of odd resources and ideas, depending what aspects of science you and the students want to explore:)

Term 3 activities should begin on Monday 29th July.

11. Solar Boat Challenge - Science

We are seeking interest from senior students, and adults, to be part of the Model Solar Boat Workshop / Challenge again this year. This program is part of our Shepparton Small Schools Cluster Science Specialist Initiative and a small group of senior students from each school will have a wonderful opportunity to participate. Initially, we are seeking interest from students to both attend a workshop during term 3, and then to compete at Scienceworks in Melbourne on Sunday 20 October.

At the workshop groups of up to 6 six students from each school will be working as a team to design, build and race their boat all on the one day. Parent participation is also required to assist students both at the workshop, and to guide the students in preparing/monitoring/adjusting the boat for and on the Challenge Day held at Scienceworks in Melbourne. Each team will require a co-ordinating adult.

A bus will be provided to ensure all participating students can attend. There is no cost for students and their families to participate in the Model Solar Boat Challenge.

Once interest is established, a workshop date and location will be set and interested students will then need to apply by completing a form and returning it to their class teacher.




