- 11. Bike Education This will be held for Grade 3,4,5 and 6 students on the following days August 21st, 22nd, 28th and 29th. More information will be available after the holiday break which will involve permission forms and bike checklists. We anticipate that the Grade 6 students will be involved in a Bike Ride to conclude this program. Mrs Montgomery has kindly offered to implement this program again in 2023.
- 12. Free Books A number of books were available for sale at a discount price last Thursday and Friday. More books are now available and these are now free. We have encouraged our students to take no more than 20 books home if possible.

14. Produce Fundraiser – Information has been sent home with the eldest child in each family in regard to this. Orders and payment will be due on Friday the 21st of July with boxes to be delivered and available for pick up from school on Wednesday the 26th of July.

- 15. OSH Care Numbers Just a reminder to our families to try and support OSH Care as much as possible. Numbers have declined recently and our weekly numbers of about 30 have been cut to about 15 of late.

The future of OSH Care is discussed frequently at School Council. If numbers are still around 15 - we may have to reduce the days that it operates to ensure that it remains sustainable going forward.

16. Subway Munch N Crunch – The final Munch N Crunch for the term will be held on Thursday 22nd June. Orders went home last week and these are due on Wednesday 21st June.

- 17. Canberra Camp This camp is planned for Grade 5/6 students in Term 4 from Monday 23rd October to Thursday 26th October. We anticipate that this camp will cost about \$400 \$450 per student subject to fundraising. Families are encouraged to make regular payments to ensure that their fee is fully paid prior to the start of the camp.
- 18. Movie Night This will be held on Friday 16th June and will involve a Pizza Tea at 6pm followed by a movie. Further information is included in this edition of the newsletter and tea orders have now closed. We anticipate that the night would conclude at about 8.30pm and students need to have parents present at school on the night. Some staff will be available on the night to assist with supervision in the Project Space where the movie will be shown.
- 19. Working with Children Checks—A reminder to families and any other members of the school community that Working With Children Checks are needed for any helpers in the classroom.
- **20. Parent Payment Arrangements** These are set at \$140 per student to cover stationery, online subscriptions and MACC & MARC costs.
