2. After School Care

Transport has been finalised for After School Care and families will be invoiced by Tallygaroopna PS for this cost. Stepping Stones will invoice families separately for the service provided at St. Luke's PS. A reminder that this service will be available to families the first day back next term (Monday 16th July) and information booklets and enrolment forms can be collected from our school office. Both of these documents are also available on our school website. Bookings are to be made with Stepping Stones not our school – we will then be contacted from Stepping Stones with specific numbers for each session after school and we will then contact the taxi service in regard to this. We will be contacting the taxi service at 1pm each day so bookings need to be completed by this time to manage the program effectively.

The cost for each day of transport for After School Care will be \$23 for each trip. This cost is based on travel from Tallygaroopna PS to Congupna PS and it will be split evenly for the amount of children using that service each day. A summary of costs is below:

Bookings are to be made to Stepping Stones no later than 1pm.

Students attending After School Care will need to leave school by Taxi at 3.15pm.

The school will be charged for the travel component of the program and then families will have separate invoices sent out.

3. Dance Festival

Tomorrow, students in Grades 3-6 will attend the Dance Festival at the Shepparton Basketball Stadium. We will have an early lunch and leave school at 1pm and then travel into Shepparton by bus. The festival begins at 1.30pm and concludes at 2.45pm. We should return back to school by about 3.10pm. Permission forms went home last week and need to be retuned ASAP. The cost for the day will be \$2 to cover the cost of the bus. Parents are welcome to come along if they wish and attend the festival.

4. Evacuation Drill

Last Wednesday, we had a successful evacuation drill at school. These practices are an essential part of our Emergency Management at school and the students were able to assembly calmly and smoothly outside which was great to see. If you do hear a strange bell at school, it is normally just a practice evacuation drill. I mentioned to the children last week, that in my 20 years of teaching I have not had a real drill and hopefully this will continue into the foreseeable future.

5. Grade 5/6 Reward Day

To conclude the term a rewards day will be held for our grade on Thursday 28th June. This will involve a movie and may include popcorn and a small portion of Iollies. Throughout the last few weeks of term 2, students in grade 5/6 have been earning money based on their adequate work habits in and out of the classroom. This includes such things as completing homework, remembering things and generally being well organised. As a result of this, students have been trying to earn the following amounts of money to enable them to participate in the Rewards Day.

7. Jump Rope for Heart

Our school was able to raise over \$700 for Jump Rope for Heart which was a fantastic effort. We hope to distribute the prizes to students before the end of the week.

8. SunSmart Schools Program

Recently our school has developed and implemented a comprehensive SunSmart Policy that meets the guidelines and recommendations of SunSmart, Cancer Council Victoria. Our school is now registered as a member of the SunSmart Program until June 2015. This program aims to support schools to ensure staff and students receive a healthy balance of UV that minimises the risk of skin and eye damage and skin cancer and helps with vitamin D.

9. Active After School Program - Term 3

Next term, we will be introducing a new sport with the AASC Program – BMX (Tuesday's). This will be very exciting and promises to be a lot of fun. Because children will need to be competent and confident riding a bike, enrolment will begin with Grade 6's and work down to Preps. There will be a first in best dressed policy applied because the program will only be able to accommodate 20 children. The first 5 sessions will be held at school and then the last 2 sessions will be held at the BMX track in Shepparton. We will be able utilise a bus for the last 2 sessions which will take children to the venue and then back to school – arriving at approximately 5.30pm. Mr Brodie will travel on the bus during this time as well. More details will be available early next term but the program will continue to be free to all children.

Our Bike Education Program was only for children in Grades 2 – Grade 6. However, students in Prep and Grade 1 will be able to participate as well – this will be up to the discretion of parents (no training wheels). Bikes, helmets and gloves will all be provided – all children will need to have a long sleeve top, long pants and enclosed shoes.

The Enrolment Form is now available on the School Website to download if needed.

On Monday's, we will be having Taekwondo at our school. This is very popular as well so it will be first in first dressed. The last session will be held at the Koryo Taekwondo Centre at 415 Central Avenue in Shepparton also and a bus will be provided to and from this venue as well (see details above).



Prep for Parents: Getting The Most From Your Child's School Reports

Student reports provide you with a clear picture of your child's progress. They are used in all Victorian government schools to report student achievement in Prep to Year 10.

You will receive a report twice a year and be invited to a parent-teacher interview to discuss your child's progress.

A parent-teacher interview enables you to:

- discuss how your child is progressing, both academically and socially
- see examples of your child's work
- get to know your child's teacher
- stay informed about plans for your child's future learning.

Interpreting services are available for parents from non-English backgrounds to attend the parent-teacher interviews. Your child's school will be able to assist with access to this service.

If your child has a disability, check with their teacher for more information on how school reports will be structured for your child and what information their report will contain.

What's happening at school

Schools send their student reports to parents. Some schools send them home with their students. Other schools email or post reports directly to the parents. Your child's school will then follow up the reports by inviting you to a parent-teacher interview. Most schools will schedule these interviews within a few weeks of sending out the student reports and will generally be flexible around the time the interviews are conducted.

Many schools send parents a student report before the end of this term or early next term, followed by parentteacher interviews.

Schools encourage parents to be actively involved in their child's education and welcome discussions between teachers and parents so that everyone is working together to support your child's learning.

Student reports

Your child will already have undergone a range of assessments earlier in the school year and you may already have had some discussions with your child's teacher about how your child is settling into school and the results of these assessments.

But now it's time for the formal student reports.

You will receive two formal student reports on your child each year. The first student report is generally done around now.

Your child's reports help everyone to have a clear picture of your child's current achievements and the progress they have made.

Every student report contains an A-E scale to ensure consistent reporting against common state-wide standards. The A-E scale is linked to the Victorian Essential Learning Standards (VELS) for Preps. This means that the A-E ratings your child receives in their reports have the same meaning at every school. In every school:

- a 'C' rating means that a student is at the standard expected for Preps at the time of reporting and that their learning is on track
- a 'B' rating means that a student is above the standard expected for Preps at the time of reporting
- an 'A' rating means a student is well above the standard expected for Preps at the time of reporting
- a 'D' rating means a student is below the standard expected
- an 'E' rating means a student is well below the standard expected for Preps.

A 'C' does not mean that your child is 'just adequate'. It indicates that your child has met the state-wide standard expected for students in their age group for that subject and that their learning is firmly on track.

Your child's report will have clearly written comments that tell you what your child knows and what they can do. The report may also identify areas in which your child needs further help or can improve. The report clearly describes what the school will do to support your child.

It includes a plan for your child's future learning. If your child is having difficulties at school, or is performing well above expectations, the teacher will implement an educational program to assist and extend your child.

So what more can you do?

Here are tips for getting the most out of your parent-teacher interview after you receive your child's school report:

Before the interview:

- Look over your child's report and determine what information you'd like to know more about.
- Ask your child if there are any areas they would like followed up (for example, where they feel they
 need extra help or have concerns) and share this information with your child's teacher during the
 interview.
- Talk to other family members and enlist their help in developing things that need to be covered during the interview.
- Write a list of specific questions you wish to ask your child's teacher.
- If you need a translator, arrange this with the school before the interview.

Some things you might explore include your child's progress in reading and writing; how you can support any specific actions for improvement through the learning you child does at home; discuss your child's developing interests, how they are doing with discipline and social skills.

During the interview

- If you want to know about a specific area of your child's progress (for example, how well they are reading) let your child's teacher know this at the start so you can focus the interview on this topic.
- Take notes so you can share what's discussed with your child.
- Discuss how your child is participating in classroom activities and whether, for example, there are any
 general issues with behaviour or discipline that need discussing.
- Ask your child's teacher to clarify any extra support or extension activities that may have been mentioned in your child's report.
- Ask for suggestions or more details about how you can help your child at home.

After the interview

- Keep in regular contact with your child's teacher and follow up on any mutually-agreed plan.
- Talk with your child about what you discussed with their teacher and tell them about the things you've agreed to to improve their learning.

You can also request interviews with your child's teacher at any other time, especially if you are concerned about your child's progress.
