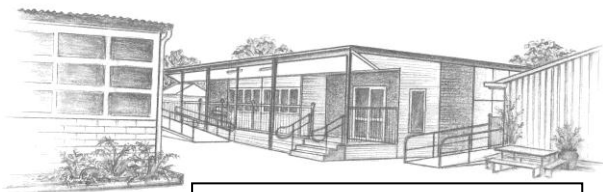

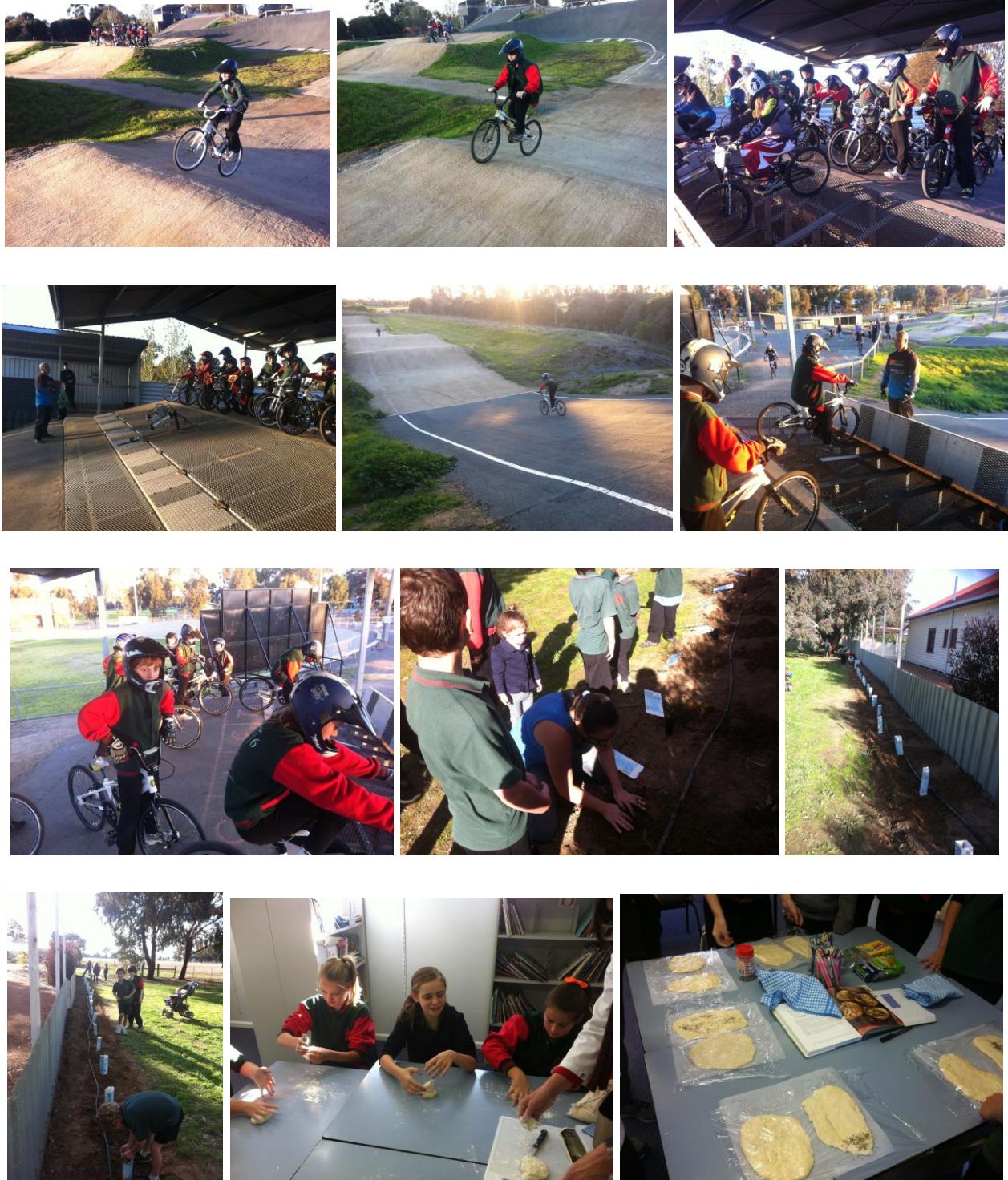

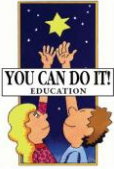

If school expenses are weighing you down, there is a way to lighten the load. The Schoolkids Bonus starts in 2013 and replaces the old Education Tax Refund (ETR).

\$410 a year for each primary student

(paid in two instalments of \$205)

\$820 a year for each secondary student

(paid in two instalments of \$410)

Are you eligible?

You could receive the Schoolkids Bonus if you have a child in primary or secondary school and receive a family or income support payment (including Family Tax Benefit Part A) or you are a primary or secondary student receiving an income support payment.
