Hi everyone

4. Responsible Pet Program

Our whole school will be participating in this program next Tuesday 26th June. The Responsible Pet Ownership Primary School Program is aimed at 5-12 year olds and has been delivered to over 1 million Victorian primary school children. It visits over 800 primary schools each year across the state. The Program includes a dog visit, multimedia tools, role play, song and story time.


The Program focuses on teaching students about dog safety:

- * when dogs should be left alone
- * things we should not do to dogs
- * how can you tell if a dog is happy, frightened or angry
- * a safe way to approach and greet a dog
- * what to do if approached by an unknown or aggressive dog.

The Program also introduces and develops the following concepts:

- * choosing an appropriate pet general welfare and husbandry
- * the importance of identification and registration
- * confinement and housing, exercise and training.

There are a range of presentations designed to target the specific audiences in relation to grade level, prior knowledge and learning modes. All dogs used in the program are carefully tested and under the control of a pet educator at all times.

5. Specialist Program - Semester 2

Unfortunately, our Music program will be concluding at the end of Term 3 – congratulations to Mrs McQuilton on her impending new little baby. Our P.E program will continue each week on a Wednesday as per usual and our <u>LOTE program will extend to a weekly basis each Friday beginning in Term 4</u>. The MARC Van (Library) and MACC Van (Art) will continue to visit our school each fortnight on alternating Wednesdays.

6. Classes for 2019

We are currently discussing the formation of classes for 2019. At present, we are anticipating a large group of new Foundation students so composite grades may be: F/1, 1/2/3, 3/4 and 5/6. These grades will allow consistent and low student numbers in each class. It is essential that enrolment forms are in ASAP so that appropriate planning can be put in place in regard to the 2019 school year. There may be some changes in relation to teachers with grades next year, but this will not be confirmed until late in the year.

7. Casual Day

This will be held on the last day of term and there is no cost for this day. Students do not have to wear just footy jumpers on this day – any footy colours are acceptable and if students don't wish to participate – student uniform is required.

8. Volunteer

We are fortunate to have Cathy McHugh volunteer her services for Semester 2 as she completes her Certificate 4 in Education Support. Cathy will primarily support the Grade 2/3 class and she will begin this at the beginning of term 3. We hope Cathy has an enjoyable and rewarding experience at our school during this time.

9. New Interactive Whiteboard

10. School Council

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 20th June. The Finance Committee will meet at 6.30pm followed by School Council beginning at 7.30pm.

11. Student Led Conference Day

Student Led Conferences are on Thursday 28th June. The aim of this day is to give all students an opportunity to discuss their progress at school with staff and families. Students present their work and progress on this day in a very informal manner. All students prepare a simple sheet, which allows children to talk about their time at Tallygaroopna PS. Students choose samples of work to show as well. There will be time for parents and teachers to discuss student progress without the child present. However, these conferences allow all of our kids to be involved in some way and to have ownership for their learning at school. **Students will be required at school only for the duration of their interview**. This day links to our Kidsmatter theme and allows us to continue to build on the family – school relationship. We hope to see all children attend this day. Please arrange an alternate time if this day does not suit.

12. School Reports

School reports will go home to families in sealed envelopes on Monday 25th June. Teachers spend a huge amount of time completing assessments and writing comments so please read reports carefully prior to the Student Led Conferences.

What exactly do the A-E ratings mean?

A indicates achievement that is **above the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting (12 months or more ahead of the standard expected at the time of reporting)

B indicates achievement that is **above the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that your child understands more complex ideas and has a broader range of skills than would normally be expected.

C indicates achievement that is **at the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that your child's learning is on track and that they understand and can apply the range of skills and knowledge expected for their year level at the time of reporting.

D indicates achievement that is **below the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that there are some skills and knowledge that your child has yet to acquire before they can be said to be achieving at the expected standard.

E indicates achievement that is **well below the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means there are significant areas of knowledge and skills your child needs to acquire before they can be said to be achieving at the expected standard.

Isn't a 'C' a disappointing result?

No it is not at all. It is important to remember that if your child receives a 'C' on the report card it indicates that their *learning* is on track and they are achieving the statewide standard that is expected of them at the time of reporting.

In the past, a 'C' in some schools might have meant that the child was performing below the expected standard. This is no longer the case.

Reports have been completed using our reporting program called Grade Expert which we began using in 2015. As a result, you will notice again some minor alterations to past reports and hopefully over time small technical issues will be eliminated. We appreciate everyone's support in relation to this. The written report provides an opportunity to read about your child's progress and the steps he or she has taken over the year so far. Class teachers have written comments on English, Mathematics & Integrated Studies which outline the skills that students have demonstrated and tasks completed. A personal comment has been provided by class teachers and comments are also written on other areas that affect their education.

13. Car Park Safety – final reminder

Over the last few weeks, we have had too many children walking through the car park at the end of the day. This is becoming a concern in line with our School Car Parking policy. Could the following points from this policy be reinforced with members of our school community please.

- Parents may drop off children at the walking path in the car park every morning.
- At the end of the day, children are only to enter the car park once they have been collected by their parents. Children will assemble in the senior playground area and be monitored by staff.

14. Centrelink Child Care Subsidy

Families using OSH Care will need to do a Centrelink Child Care Subsidy Assessment as soon as possible. You can do your assessment through myGov using your Centrelink online account. Or, through the Express Plus Centrelink mobile app. This is important, because if you don't do your assessment, you will not receive any subsidy from 2 July.

18. Urban Camp

We have had a great response to this camp with 20 students now confirmed. Specific Information will be distributed to all families who have expressed interest in Term 3. This camp is scheduled from Wednesday 19th to Friday 21st September.

19. Colder Months - Tissues

We would be very appreciative if each family could please supply a box of tissues for the school in anticipation of colder weather (and possibly running noses and coughs!). We remind families to please encourage their children to dress appropriately for the weather.

20. Family Financial Statements

Family statements will be sent home in the next week. Please check carefully and advise the office if you have been billed for an excursion that your child did not attend. Please be aware that the final cost for Grade 5/6 Urban Camp is not yet available – there is only a \$50 deposit fee entered onto your statement at present. The Swimming Program fee is also not yet entered onto your statement. Future excursion fees will be generated as they become known. Please see the office if you have any queries.

Reading at Home can make a huge difference!

Home Reading tip & information #8

When reading with your child, check for understanding by asking questions. It is important to check for understanding before, during and after reading. Here are some questions to ask.

BEFORE READING

- _- What do you think will happen in the story?
- What might be the problem?
- Where do you think the setting might be?
- What do you know about this topic?
- What does this story make you think of?
- What are you wondering?
- What does the title tell vou?

DURING READING

- What do you think will happen next?
- What can you tell me about the story so far?
- How do you feel about the story so far?
- What questions do you have?
- Why do you think the character did that?
- What would you have done?

AFTER READING

- What was the title?
- What was the problem/solution?
- Why do you think the author wrote this book?
- What was your favourite /least favourite part?
- What would you change about the story?
- What will happen next?
