Apologies for the error that was evident in the school reports regarding student attendance. Unfortunately, the 4 days which the school was closed because of the floods came up as an absence for students. These 4 days should be subtracted from the days absent figure in Semester 1 reports.

2. Long Service Leave

Mrs Wallace will be taking some well-deserved Long Service Leave during the last 6 weeks of Term 3. This will begin on Friday 10th August and Mrs Montgomery will be teaching the Prep / Grade 1 class during this time. Mrs Monty will spend some time with Mrs Wallace leading up to this transition and we anticipate that it will be a smooth process with normal classroom routines continuing.

3. Ultranet Evaluation Survey

Our school has been selected to be part of an Ultranet Evaluation Project which is designed to evaluate:

- how the Ultranet is being used to support existing practice or to transform practice;
- the role of the Ultranet in improving student engagement, wellbeing and achievement;
- the implications of anywhere, anytime access to data, devices and the system;
- the implications of increased access to learning technologies on rural and remote users of the Ultranet;
- how the Ultranet is being used by learners, teachers, managers, support staff and parents to support effective learning, teaching and management;
- the ways in which the Ultranet is being used to respond to individual learning needs;
- which functions and features of the Ultranet are most useful to whom, and which approaches to use have the most impact; and
- whether the Ultranet supports improved home, school links and parent engagement.

The Department has engaged Education Services Australia to undertake an evaluation of Ultranet implementation between 2010 and 2013. The project consists of quantitative and qualitative data collection and analysis undertaken by Education Services Australia Consultants dk2 Pty Ltd.

As part of the data gathering, three online surveys have been administered to three hundred randomly selected schools. The purpose of the surveys is:

- to gather baseline data in 2010;
- a climate check in 2011; and
- a final evaluation survey in 2012.

The first and second sets of online surveys were successfully conducted in October 2010 and July 2011, respectively, and provided rich baseline and climate check data enabling comparisons and the identification of changes and progress in use of the Ultranet.

The third and final set of online surveys will be administered between **July 23 & August 6** and are designed to gather information on the use of the Ultranet by principals, teachers, students, parents and Ultranet Coaches since its implementation. 5. Flood Recovery Support

6. Somers Camp

During the last week of the school holidays, we received some information regarding the Somers Camp for 2012. State Primary Schools from our area have their biennial opportunity to send 160 students (80 boys, 80 girls) from Years 5 and 6 to Somers School Camp. Our school was asked to enter the number of interested boys and girls for the camp and we entered all of our students in the senior grades.

DATES: 6/11/2012 to 14/11/2012 COST: \$160.00

Somers Camp is situated on Westernport Bay, 80km from Melbourne (Melway Map Ref 193 H9).

The camp provides an opportunity for social interaction between children drawn from many schools and presents a variety of challenging situations through outdoor education and contact with the local environment. The nine day commitment is essential if the social aims are to be achieved. The District Secretary will make allocations of places for schools once interest is expressed.

Selection (drawn randomly from a hat)

Allocations to schools are made by the District Secretary. When you receive your allocation, please select your children from a cross section of your school community. Because of the adverse effect on other campers, it is not advisable to send children who create disciplinary problems or demonstrate behaviours that are inappropriate to communal living.

Fees

The camp fee is \$160.00. It includes transport, accommodation and pocket money. This fee is to be collected from all selected applicants. A bulk cheque should be sent to the District Secretary when requested.

The Parents Club would like to inform the community that we were successful in obtaining post-flood funding from the Department of Education. This will enable us to offer our Christmas in July Munch 'n' Crunch free to all families. Your children will have a sit down formal roast followed by Christmas pudding and custard or chocolate cake and custard and a drink of cordial. Please let us know if your child does not want to participate.

10. After School Care

Transport has been finalised for After School Care and families will be invoiced by Tallygaroopna PS for this cost. Stepping Stones will invoice families separately for the service provided at St. Luke's PS. A reminder that this service will be available to families the first day back next term (Monday 16th July) and information booklets and enrolment forms can be collected from our school office. Both of these documents are also available on our school website. Bookings are to be made with Stepping Stones not our school – we will then be contacted from Stepping Stones with specific numbers for each session after school and we will then contact the taxi service in regard to this. We will be contacting the taxi service at 1pm each day so bookings need to be completed by this time to manage the program effectively.

The cost for each day of transport for After School Care will be \$23 for each trip. This cost is based on travel from Tallygaroopna PS to Congupna PS and it will be split evenly for the amount of children using that service each day. A summary of costs is below:

Bookings are to be made to Stepping Stones no later than 1pm.

Students attending After School Care will need to leave school by Taxi at 3.15pm.

The school will be charged for the travel component of the program and then families will have separate invoices sent out.

11. Active After School Program – Term 3

This term, we will be introducing a new sport with the AASC Program – BMX (Tuesday's). This will be very exciting and promises to be a lot of fun. Because children will need to be competent and confident riding a bike, enrolment will begin with Grade 6's and work down to Preps. There will be a first in best dressed policy applied because the program will only be able to accommodate 20 children. The first 5 sessions will be held at school and then the last 2 sessions will be held at the BMX track in Shepparton. We will be able utilise a bus for the last 2 sessions which will take children to the venue and then back to school – arriving at approximately 5.30pm. Mr Brodie will travel on the bus during this time as well. More details will be available early next term but the program will continue to be free to all children.

Our Bike Education Program was only for children in Grades 2 – Grade 6. However, students in Prep and Grade 1 will be able to participate as well – this will be up to the discretion of parents (no training wheels). Bikes, helmets and gloves will all be provided – <u>all children will need to have a long sleeve top, long pants and enclosed shoes.</u>

On Monday's, we will be having Taekwondo at our school. This is very popular as well so it will be first in first dressed. The last session will be held at the Koryo Taekwondo Centre at 415 Central Avenue in Shepparton also and a bus will be provided to and from this venue as well (see details above).

12. Grade 3/4 Camp





Tallygaroopna Primary School will be accessing this service immediately for Term 3 this year and beyond. Information is provided below and the Tallygaroopna Pre School will also be informed so that potential new families can make an informed decision in regard to enrolments for 2013.

Specific Information:

- Family Information Booklets and Enrolment Forms are available at Tallygaroopna PS.
- Services provided by Stepping Stones include Indoor and Outdoor Activities and Afternoon Tea
- After School Care is available 5 days a week from 3pm until 6pm at St. Luke's Primary School in Shepparton.
- The cost for each session is \$19.90 this is before any child care rebate. This will be billed directly to parents by Stepping Stones.
- Children will be transported to the venue by cab, leaving Tallygaroopna PS at 3.15pm and arriving at St. Luke's at approximately 3.30pm.
