Hi everyone,

#### 3. Eastbank Performance

This Thursday, the whole school will be attending Eastbank again for the second \$6 show – The Gruffalo's Child. ### Dealing with Being Left Out

A lot of children deal with feeling lonely or alone at playtimes. Children that have a small group of friends find it most common if their friends are away sick and may feel a bit lost without them.

I am trying to encourage the children to realise that everyone has days where they may be left on their own and help learn some strategies for when this happens. It's also important for the kids to be resilient and if others choose not to play with them, then they can still feel okay about themselves. Sometimes the reasons may be quite innocent where one person wants to play tennis and another wants to build a sandcastle.

Some ideas for when they are feeling left out:

- Look for some other people to play with
- Find your buddy
- Play a game that can be by yourself like bouncing a ball or climbing on the play equipment
- Offer to help someone else out

Our school also has an initiative in place where if the students go to the 'Turtle', other students know that this means that they want someone to spend time with them.

On Tuesdays and Thursdays, we also offer the children lunchtime games where any student can be involved in group activities. This has proven to be very successful for creating new friendships, building teamwork, getting along skills, sharing and is also a lot of FUN!

### TRIVIA NIGHT......PRIZE HAMPER DONATIONS PLEASE




