



9. Attitude to Schools Survey

10. Woorabinda Camp

Great news – this camp will go ahead as initially planned and I know the 8 students who are attending will have a challenging, but wonderful time. Last Friday, Miss Flynn (teacher attending the camp) came and met the students going to the camp and she will initially be supervising our students on the way to Woorabinda. A reminder that all students will depart for the camp from Bourchier St. PS in Shepparton on Monday 31st July at 6.30pm. I will be seeing the students off on this day with Miss Flynn. All campers are expected to return to this pick up point on Friday 4th August at 5pm.

11. First Aid in Schools Program

All students in the school have an opportunity to participate in this program on Monday 7th August. There is no cost for this program and no permission forms are necessary because this is an incursion held at school. The First Aid in Schools Program is a free program run by St. John Ambulance Australia providing basic first aid training to school students across all states and territories in Australia. The knowledge and skills gained in this program will develop First Aid awareness with our children and contribute towards building a more resilient community. The learning is age appropriate and integrates with the Victorian Essential Leaning Standards (VELS) curriculum.

12. Aerial Photograph

We have an aerial photograph in the office area from a number of years ago. On Friday, we were able to organise some more aerial shots for our buildings and school grounds and we look forward to these being a welcome addition to our office area in the coming weeks.

13. CFA Van Visit

All students in the school have an opportunity to participate in this program on Friday 11th August. There is no cost for this program and no permission forms are necessary because this is an incursion held at school. CFA's mobile education program gives primary and secondary school students the chance to learn about home fire safety and summer fire safety in a fun and exciting way. Lessons are delivered on board customised vehicles (Mobile Education Units - MEUs) that visit schools throughout Victoria. Each one-hour lesson is tailored according to year level and supported by extra materials to help teachers follow up on important fire safety topics back in the classroom.

Primary Schools

Two types of Mobile Education Units are available:

Home Fire Safety: Open to all year levels from Prep to Grade 6. Through hands-on activities, students will learn about home fire safety.

Bushfire Safety: Open to all year levels from Prep to Grade 6.Through hands-on activities, students will learn about summer fire safety.




