Dear Parents,



New School Building



1. New Building

Our new building now sits proudly at our school. We are currently waiting on Sub Contractors to come into the school to complete electrical, plumbing, plastering and carpet work. Some staff have had the opportunity to walk through the building and we were pleasantly surprised about the size of the building, which will be a fantastic learning environment for our children in the near future. STAY TUNED!!!

2. EMA - reminder

The Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is provided to assist eligible families with the costs associated with the education of their children.

To be eligible for receipt of the EMA you must:

- be either a parent or guardian of a primary or secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; and
- be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004* or be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner or be a foster parent.

Consequently parents/guardians are able to access the EMA if they have a valid Health Care Card or valid Pension Card.

The eligibility criteria must be met as at the first day of Term 1 (1 February 2011) which is the first day for teaching staff) and Term 3 (18 July 2011).

The EMA application must be submitted to the school by **28 February 2011** for the first instalment and **5 August 2011** for the second instalment.

The EMA provides an annual amount of \$230 for primary students and \$460 for secondary students and is paid in two instalments. This amount is split evenly between the parents/guardians and the school. Students turning 16 years in 2011 will be paid on a pro rata basis.

^{*}Student year level (or age for ungraded and special school students) will form the basis for calculating the amount payable to parents and schools.

Parents with continuing eligibility, who are paid the first instalment of 2011 through this school will not be required to complete a new application for the second instalment. Parents who transfer children to another school after 28 February 2011 and prior to or on 5 August 2011, must reapply at the new school for the second instalment.

3. Grade 6 Uniform Prints

Grade 6 students wishing to have uniforms printed need to have these at the office with money enclosed by this Friday. These will be then taken to Spectrum in Shepparton for a school print. This will be similar to what was done last year. Each print will cost \$8 and we are hopeful that these will be returned to students by the end of February. This is voluntary only for Grade 6 students. Families will still need to make sure that school uniform is still adhered to during this time.

4. PING – Music / IT Program

Last week, we had a successful meeting with Joel Muston in regard to this program. Joel will be visiting our school every fortnight, starting on Wednesday 23rd February and working with the Grade 2/3/4 and 5/6 students with Music and Information Technology. Joel is new to the program as well, but he is young and enthusiastic and I have no doubt that the children at our school will guickly warm to him.

Ping is a social networking site that makes learning music fun, simple and accessible, and provides creative musical opportunities for rural middle year school students in Victoria, Australia. Using Web 2.0 technologies, the emphasis is on student centered, self-directed learning, exploring a range of musical styles. Ping incorporates video resources with online classrooms, master classes and real-time concert streaming. Perhaps the most attractive aspect of Ping is that it is completely free!

5. School Fees - reminder

At School Council last year, we were able to approve our new school fees for 2011. There were obviously some changes that occurred but we made these still affordable and in line with other schools in the local area. Keep in mind that last year's fees for one student were \$150 - which included \$90 for Excursions and \$60 for fundraising. We have also been able to rely on our Bingo account and Drought Relief Funding to support excursions and programs in the past, both of these will not be available this year.

2011 School Fees Structure per student:

The subject levy includes many programs which are implemented at school including MACC Van, MARC Van, Mathletics, etc.

The Excursion Levy includes the following (whole school activities):

Please note that these fees are both compulsory fees. We have decided to not put Swimming under the umbrella of the Excursion Levy because of the cost associated with this program. This year, this program will again be held at Aquamoves for 1 week in Term 3. The cost for this program is \$42 per student and families will have a choice in regard to whether their children participate in this program. Other excursions that happen throughout the year will not be whole school activities, so there will be a pay as you go policy implemented as well. Examples of these are Sailing, Kanga 8s and the Richmond Footy Clinic.

Parents are able to pay school fees in one payment or organise a plan which would involve partial payments throughout the school year. If you have any queries in regard to this please feel free to contact David or Karen at the office. These fees are now due.

6. Book City Sponsorship

We have been very fortunate to receive some sponsorship from Book City. This will enable all of our children who receive Student of the Week (You Can Do It Award) to get a book voucher to the value of \$5. Special thanks to Joe & Helen Sofra for this fantastic initiative.

7. Music Lessons

These began today and there are places still available for anyone interested. Lessons are on an individual basis for 20 minutes each and they cost \$15 a session. Families would have to commit to 5 weeks and the program would cost \$75 for term 1. We would be hopeful, that this would then continue for the whole year. Lessons are conducted in the morning. Guitar Lessons are also available. A student would need to own their own guitar to participate in guitar lessons (tuition guitars cost \$80 to \$90). Expressions of interest need to be at the school by Friday 18th February.

9. Headlice

10. Medicine at School

For those students required to have medication whilst at school, a Medication Request Form is required to be filled out, signed and returned to the school office prior to the student be administered medication. A form was attached to last week's newsletter. Further copies are available at the Office. This does not apply to children with asthma with their puffer, although the office must be informed of the child's needs in this regard. Any change to the child's medical condition should be relayed to the office ASAP.

11. Frozen Fruit Freezes

Frozen fruit sticks will be available for sale each Friday at lunchtime for 50 cents each. This will begin this week.

12. Kids & Fruit

NB# From time to time, Kids & Fruit Inc. will introduce new fruit and vegetable varieties to the program and therefore it is imperative that you inform the school of any allergies your child suffers which will be forwarded onto Kids & Fruit Inc. (eg. allergy to citrus fruit or strawberries). If a fruit or vegetable is provided that your child is allergic to, Kids & Fruit will compensate accordingly.

13. Conveyance Allowance

To be eligible to receive conveyance allowance, a student must:

- Be aged between 5 years by the 30th April and 21 years;
- Live more than 4.8 km by the shortest practicable route from the nearest school attended.
- Be enrolled at the nearest government primary school.
- Have NO access to bus travel

Those people eligible need to obtain an application form from the office and return it to school by the 18th of February.

14. Student Information

Last week, we sent home forms indicating information currently held at the school. Could you please check, complete and sign these forms and return them to school as soon as possible.

15. School Council

The first school council meeting for the year will be Wednesday, 23th February at 7.30pm. The Finance Committee will meet beforehand at 6.30pm. This year, there will be a couple of positions available for parents to be a member of school council. 16. School Photos

The 2011 School Photos will be taken on Monday 21st February in the morning. Please ensure that all school children are in school uniform. We will be taking a Grade 6 photo and a School Captain photo (Special Groups) and Family Photos will be available as well – envelopes available at the office. Photo order envelopes have been sent home last week and all envelopes and money needs to be at the office on the morning of 21st February.

17. Information Evening

An Information and Meet the Teachers evening will be held at school tomorrow from 5.30pm - 6.30pm. At 6pm Mrs Wallace will speak to Prep/1 families for approximately 30 minutes. This year there will be no evening meal as we have found that very few families have made use of this facility in recent years.

18. I.T. – Acceptable Use - reminder

Last week, all families received information in regard to acceptable use with the Ultranet, Internet and other Digital Technologies. Although, there is a lot of information in this document, page 2 is all that is needed to be returned to school. Could this be done by Friday 18th February please.

19. Engagement Policy - reminder

Only new families should have received the schools Engagement Policy. This document was approved in 2010 and it is a living and breathing document so new additions / alterations may occur throughout the year. Could Prep parents return the last page of this document to the office by Friday 18th February please.

20. School Bus / Safety - reminder

At present, the bus route has been extended until official approval at School Council. This will be in a couple of weeks. All families should have received information about the School Bus for 2011. Could information regarding Safe Travel and Bus Rules please be returned to the school office by Friday 18th February please.

Lam also currently seeking approval from the School's Regional Director to allow for Bus Travellers to be dismissed at 3.20pm. These students will still receive the standard 5 hours of instruction at school per day. If approval is granted buses will arrive home 10 minutes earlier than what was outlined in the Bus Time Table.

This is to cater for Zeerust PS whom we share the bus with.

21. Art / Library Van

The mobile Art Van will visit fortnightly on Fridays commencing 11th February. Children will need an art smock with a name on it (most already have one) eg. old shirt, etc to protect their clothes from paint, glue, etc. The Library Van will also visit the school on a fortnightly basis commencing on Wednesday, 16th February. Children are asked to bring a library bag (either cloth or strong plastic) to protect the library books.

22. Soccer Teams

Student accident insurance policies are available from some commercial insurers. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare or Private Health Insurance.


