#### 1. Building Update

Building works continues to happen at school and it is really exciting to see the developments which are starting to take place. Our cladding work has begun and we are having a combination of normal and compressed sheets around many of the existing buildings at school. Last week, our servery window was put in and we are hoping that the kitchen will be completed and ready for use over the next few weeks.

On Friday, the Principal and some staff from Tawonga Primary School visited Tally to see how we have put together our new facilities which include buildings and furniture. They were extremely impressed by our school and were very excited about the prospect of going through a school redevelopment after seeing the evidence of the end result. This was great feedback for us also.

#### 2. Kitchen Opening

We are hoping to have our Kitchen fully operational in time for the last Munch N Crunch for Term 3. The date for this is Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> September and this will be our official opening for this new facility. We are planning to do an audit of kitchen supplies which we currently have and would need for the future and are hoping that families may be able to donate some equipment when the new kitchen facility is open. #### 4. Interschool Sport

I was able to make a brief appearance at both venues in Shepparton and Mooroopna and it was great to hear that the students were well behaved and had an enjoyable day. It is always a pleasure to see the children from our school

#### 5. Water Programs

Goulburn Valley Water will be visiting our school this Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> August. The Juniors (P-2) will have a session on the water cycle. Seniors (3-6) will discuss stormwater. Both of these sessions will be held at 2pm by different instructors. They run for approx 30-45mins (depending on how many questions the kids ask!)

#### 6. Oliver Performance

Next Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> August, our whole school will be attending Wanganui Secondary College performance of Oliver. This is held at the Westside Performing Arts Centre in Mooroopna and we will leave school at 10.15am and arrive back at school by about 2pm. Permission forms will go home this week and they must be returned by next Tuesday. Students will need to bring a cut lunch and drink to take with them as lunch will be eaten during interval at the Performance. THERE WILL BE NO PIE WARMER AVAILABLE ON THIS DAY.

#### Synopsis

The curtain opens on the sinister interior of the workhouse with a bare dining table. Pale-faced wretches can be seen peering through the bars of the door at the back. The door opens and the boys file in to the table singing "Food, Glorious Food". Widow Corney, who runs the workhouse, and Mr Bumble, the parish beadle, enter to serve gruel to the boys. Alone amongst them Oliver takes the bowl to Bumble and asks, "Please, Sir, I want some more." Bumble is outraged. Oliver must go and so he hawks Oliver through the streets of London singing "Boy For Sale." Oliver is sold to Mr Sowerberry, the undertaker. Alone, plaintive and surrounded by coffins, Oliver sings, "Where Is Love?"

He runs away and meets the Artful Dodger who sings "Consider Yourself At Home". Oliver is taken to a hideout to meet Fagin and the apprentice thieves - they welcome Oliver with "You've Got To Pick a Pocket Or Two". Nancy, Bill Sykes girl, and Bet arrive and sing "It's A Fine Life". Next morning Oliver goes with the boys and is arrested by the police, not for picking pockets but simply for looking guilty.

In Act 2 Nancy sings "Oom-pah-pah". Fagin's boys tell of Oliver's arrest by the police but that, as he has been found to be innocent, he is now safe in the house of a kindly, rich gentleman. Fagin and Sykes despatch Nancy to get Oliver back. Meanwhile, Oliver has become a well-cared for little lad. Seeing London street-traders from his bedroom window he sings "Who Will Buy?", a plea that his good fortune will become permanent. However, outside the house he is captured by Nancy and she returns him to Fagin. Fagin sings "Reviewing the Situation" and thinks of going straight.

Bumble and Mrs Corney, now married, discover that Oliver is the heir to a rich family and try to get him back. A regretful Nancy plans to return Oliver to his benefactor. She is fearful of Sykes yet sings, "As Long As He Needs Me". Sykes stalks and kills her, grabs Oliver and, after a chase, is shot dead. Oliver is restored to his benefactor who, as it turns out, is his own grandfather. Fagin, now minus the boys, home and money, reprises "Reviewing the Situation".

#### 7. EMA – Education Maintenance Allowance – 2<sup>nd</sup> Instalment of 2011

Parents with continuing eligibility, who were paid the first instalment for 2011 through this school will not be required to complete a new application for the second instalment. Parents who have transferred their child/ren to Tallygaroopna PS from another school after **28 February 2011** and prior to or on **5 August 2011**, must reapply at the new school for the second instalment. The Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is provided to assist eligible families with the costs associated with the education of their children. To be eligible for receipt of the EMA you must: -be either a parent or guardian of a school student attending school - be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004* or be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner or be a foster parent. Consequently parents/guardians are able to access the EMA if they have a valid Health Care Card or valid Pension Card. The eligibility criteria must be met as at the first day of Term 3 (18 July 2011). The EMA application must be submitted to the school by 5 August 2011 for the second instalment.

This extra curricula activity will be held at Kialla Lakes in November and more details will be made available in the future. Thanks again.

#### 11. Active After School Communities Program

This program will begin tomorrow with Taekwondo. Next Monday will be the first session of Volleyball/Netball. There will be one participation award handed out at assembly during terms 3 and 4 and this will be a \$5 Book City Voucher. This will be randomly drawn out to students who regularly participate in the program.

# We Saw a Baby Emu.






On Thursday
