1. Gonski Funding

Yesterday, the State Government announced that they had come on board with the Gonski Review for School Funding. This announcement will see Victorian students benefit from billions of dollars in extra schools funding after a deal was struck between the Commonwealth and State. The new agreement will see the Commonwealth spend an extra \$6.8 billion, and the State Government put in an extra \$5.4 billion. Unfortunately, the Education Maintenance Allowance which is available to some families may have been a casualty as a result of this announcement. We look forward to further information regarding future school funding in the near future and will keep the school community informed as much as possible.

2. Table Tennis / Knitting

Last week we had a huge response to the Table Tennis Tournament which started last week for all grades. We look forward to this continuing most Friday mornings until all rounds are complete. A huge thank you to Gill O'Brien for assisting with this. This Wednesday, we will be starting knitting activities and any children wishing to participate will need to bring their own 8 Ply Ball of Wool in their favourite colour. Leanne Goode has kindly offered to help run this activity on Wednesday lunchtimes and anyone from the community is welcome to come along and join in.

3. Tree Planting

9. Parent Opinion Surveys

Your comments in the final, open-ended question will be scanned and provided back to the school. When completed please seal your survey in the envelope provided and write your child's name on the back of the envelope. Your child's name will only be used to record you have returned the survey. The sealed envelope will not be opened by the school and will be sent to an independent organisation for collation and reporting. The results will be shared with parents via the School Council later in the year.

10. School Disco

Our Grade 5/6 students have started to plan the School Disco which is scheduled to be held at school on Friday 23rd August in the Multi Purpose Room. If any parents can assist with the organisation of this night, could you see David ASAP – decorations and set up of the MP room may begin on the Thursday morning because we have our Art program scheduled the next day.
