

#### **News from the Principal's Desk**

Hi evervone.

We have had an extremely busy start to Semester 2 so far. I would like to thank the whole school community for getting behind the school leaders initiative so far. This has begun smoothly and the majority of the students in the school are enjoying this morning treat with milo and a snag which is encouraging. We have decided to make 1 slight adjustment to this in line with our eating processes at school. #### Physical Education Report Semester One

We started the year by looking at tennis and some tennis rounders. Tennis is a great non-contact sport although trying to hit a bouncing ball can be a little tricky. We used lots of our little pop up tennis nets and used bat tennis bats and tennis rackets.

After tennis, we turned our attention to Athletics training in preparation for the annual Athletics carnival held at McEwen Reserve. Unless you do Little Athletics, these skills can be very foreign to us and some practice is required. High Jump, Long Jump, Triple Jump, Shot Put, Vortex Throw, Hurdles, Sprints, 200m and Relays. I was very impressed and proud of how our school competed and conducted themselves, as it can be a very long and drawn out day. I saw many children trying their best, which was what I wanted to see. Some children were rewarded for their efforts with ribbons, but it was the effort and willingness to have a go that impressed me. We finished the day quite quickly as a nasty storm came through and our Captain Ball team unfortunately did not get a run, hopefully next year.

During Term 2, we looked at Netball, which coincided with our Senior Winter sports. Many of our children play netball and it was great to see these children assist with umpiring and coaching as we went along.

We finished the term with a look at Hockey, using some plastic lacrosse sticks for games and real hockey sticks for skills and drills. Some of our children have a real skill for this sport and I was impressed with everyone's ability to control the ball.

If we had a rain interrupted lesson, we used our Multipurpose Room to play Volleyball or newspaper hockey. It is very handy to have an indoor facility to use on these inclement days.

Throughout the first Semester, we have played some warm up games like Circle Ball, Chicken, Fill the Bucket, Donkey Tails, Tunnel Ball, Farmer Sam, Line Tiggy and many more. We have also played some minor games like Tennis Rounders, Boot Ball, Star Wars and Golden Child.

The F/1 and 2/3 class also participate in a Perceptual Motor Program (P.M.P) once a fortnight. This program focuses on Balance, Eye-Hand Co-Ordination, Body Awareness and some Cognitive elements. This is a non-competitive situation where the children are given an activity to practice one or more of the above skills. I always include a small skill related to our major game.

This Semester with a very kind donation from the Tallygaroopna Lions Club I have been able to purchase a number and alphabet kit which will double up as a learning tool for Physical Education sessions but also in Numeracy and Literacy in the classrooms. The Parents club also donated some of their funds to buy a mini tramp which I can use during P.M.P. Thank you to both of these groups for contributing to our sporting equipment.







#### Attitude to Schools Survey - Grades 4/5/6












### DOMAIN: Learner characteristics and disposition (% Positive)

#### 8. OSH – Availability Survey

Unfortunately, our numbers have dropped recently and it would be terrific to see some new permanent or casual placements in this service, which operates from 3.25pm to 6pm, 5 days a week. This service to our families involves a large financial commitment by School Council and we will be discussing the sustainability of this program at the end of the year. Our OSH Care service has been in operation since 2014 and as our school has grown we had hoped that enrolments in this service would continue to grow. We currently aim for 25 places filled each week. A survey was distributed last week to the eldest child in each family (also on Flexibuzz) – it was due back to school last Friday 26th July.

#### 9. Student Led Conference Day

#### 11. School Leaders Project

We have had a wonderful response to the Snags and Milo orders that our School Captains and Vice Captains have organised to raise money for the Salvation Army. These will continue to be served at the first break at 11.40am (slight time change) and students will enjoy these in the undercover area. The remaining dates are:

#### 12. Classes for 2020

We are currently discussing the formation of classes for 2020. At present, we are anticipating a reasonable sized group of new Foundation students so composite grades may be: F/1, 1/2, 3/4 and 5/6. These grades will allow consistent and low student numbers in each class. It is essential that enrolment forms are in ASAP so that appropriate planning can be put in place in regard to the 2020 school year. There may be some changes in relation to teachers with grades next year, but this will not be confirmed until late in the year.

#### 13. Children's Crossing / Speed Limit / Parking on the Road

We are looking into approaching the local council in regard to concerns regarding traffic along Victoria Street. The law states the following: "Children's crossings are only in operation when flags are displayed. When flags are displayed, drivers must not proceed through the crossing if children or adults are still on the crossing or about to start crossing. This is the law regardless of the presence of a crossing supervisor. When children's crossings flags are not displayed, pedestrians should give way to passing road traffic. Drivers should always use caution when approaching children's crossings when children are present. Not every child will know or remember the different rules."

I have informed the local police of some concerns in regard to speeding and parking outside the school. Please adhere to any signage displayed at the front of the school and when school crossing flags are displayed, drivers must not proceed through the crossing if children or adults are still on the crossing or about to start crossing. This is the law regardless of the presence of a crossing supervisor. I am expecting to see a police presence over the next few weeks.

#### 14. Communicating with Staff

Please feel free to discuss any issues with myself or specific class teachers. At Tallygaroopna PS, we are accessible to parents and we value the importance of positive and constructive communication with all of our families. Please contact the school to make an appointment if needed – so that issues can be addressed at an appropriate time which does not affect normal planning and learning time.

#### 15. Colder Months - Tissues

We would be very appreciative if each family could please supply a box of tissues for the school in anticipation of colder weather (and possibly running noses and coughs!). We remind families to please encourage their children to dress appropriately for the weather.

#### 16. Car Park Safety – reminder

Over the last few weeks, we have had too many children walking through the car park at the end of the day. This is becoming a concern in line with our School Car Parking policy. Could the following points from this policy be reinforced with members of our school community please.

- Parents may drop off children at the walking path in the car park every morning.
- At the end of the day, children are only to enter the car park once they have been collected by their parents. Children will assemble in the senior playground area and be monitored by staff.

# PLEASE ALSO BE CONSCIOUS OF THE BUS ARRIVING AT SCHOOL TO ASSIST WITH CONGESTION AT THE BEGINNING AND END OF THE DAY.

#### 17. Assembly Announcements

Any student announcements at assembly for sport / achievements need to be written down and approved by staff in preparation for assembly on a Friday. This will assist with trying to fit in assembly in such a short time frame at the end of the week. There will be a plastic pocket stapled to the divided wall for any items - just make sure these are checked by staff please.

#### 18. Production

The 5/6 students have been busy helping to make props for our Term 3 production, Rock Bottom. They have also been practising their lines regularly. Thank you to those who have been able to bring in props.

On Production night, 2-6s will be supplied with a coloured shirt and they are to wear their own black pants. F-1s will need to come dressed in all black.

#### 19. School Uniform - reminder

A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. A reminder to all families to reinforce this please. From May until the end of August, school beanies and scarves are permitted to be worn outside – these can be purchased from school in line with our uniform policy as well – we would appreciate green or red beanies and scarves only.
