#### **News from the Principal's Desk**

Dear parents, carers, students and staff

On Sunday, the Victorian Government announced that, on the advice of the Victorian Chief Health Officer, regional and rural Victoria will move to Stage 3 restrictions and metropolitan Melbourne will move to Stage 4 restrictions to slow the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). These requirements apply to all schools across the government, Catholic and independent sectors and across all metropolitan Melbourne, rural and regional Victoria.

The changes to schools' operations will come into effect from Wednesday 5 August, following a student free day on Tuesday 4 August, and are likely to apply until the end of Term 3. As outlined in the Chief Health Officer's advice on Friday, schools remain safe places for staff and students – but these steps are critical measures to reduce the movement of students and families across the state.

There are implications for our school, and for families in our school community and a summary of what the changes mean for schools is on Page 15 of this newsletter.

We have a short time frame before Remote & Flexible learning begins again on Wednesday, but some of the processes will involve:

- Playgrounds being closed again
- School netbooks available to support Remote & Flexible Learning again.
- On site attendance available again

The criteria for students that can attend on-site has changed and the Victorian Government will provide further advice about this over the coming days. Please be patient with this as I await further information.

Keep safe everyone – I will no doubt see you all soon, even it is via Webex! Don't hesitate to contact me if any clarification is needed during this difficult time.

Dear Parents & Guardians

As you are probably aware, in line with advice from the Chief Health Officer, the Victorian Government has announced that all Victorians must wear a face covering when they leave home from 11.59pm on Sunday 2nd August.

Face coverings will be mandated for people aged 12 and over. These measures will slow the spread of COVID-19 and help protect the community.

In schools, this means that school-based staff and secondary school students will be required to wear a face covering. The Victorian Chief Health Officer has advised that any face covering will be acceptable – it does not need to be a surgical mask.

Student who attend primary school, including those goed 12 by Year 6, will not be required to wear a face covering. The Chief Health Officer has advised that it is not practical to require some primary school students to wear face coverings while others are not required to.

Students or staff who have a medical condition – including problems with breathing, a serious skin condition on the face, a disability or a mental health condition – are not required to wear a face covering.

#### Guidance for schools

All school-based staff must wear face coverings at school and when travelling to and from school.

Teachers and education support staff will not be required to wear face coverings while teaching, but those who wish to do so can.

Teachers should wear face coverings in other greas of the school when not teaching (for example, in the staff room, on vard duty and when providing first aid or taking temperatures) and when travelling to and from school.

Parents/carers will be required to wear face coverings whenever they leave the house, including for school drop-off and pick-up.

Our staff will work through this information with their students on Monday and we look for your support to discuss this with your children.

Please continue to check for updates on Skool Loop and Facebook regularly as we will continue to keep you informed about any changes announced by schools.



- <u>1. Remote & Flexible Learning 2.0 (Term 3) –</u> Please be advised schools will be returning to Remote and Flexible Learning from Wednesday August 5th. A summary of the start of the week is below:
  - Monday 3 August will be a 'normal' day of school under current arrangements, with students attending on-site
    asked to take all their necessary learning materials home. Staff will be wearing masks for the first time on this
    day.

#### Information for families:

- In accordance with requirements from the Victorian Government, primary school students are not required to wear a face covering irrespective of the student's age.
- Parents, guardians and carers are encouraged to inform their child/ren that school staff will be using face
  coverings and reinforce with their child/ren the need to keep 1.5 metres apart from other people, to wash and
  dry hands thoroughly and regularly, and cough and sneeze into a tissue or their elbow.
- Parents and carers will be required to wear face coverings whenever they leave the house, including for school
  drop off and pick up. If they are travelling in a car alone, or only with members of their household, they do not
  need to wear a mask. Parents and carers are required to wear a mask if they are required to collect an unwell
  child/ren from the school. If you require clarification in relation to the use of face coverings please contact me.
- <u>3. Borrowing Agreement</u> Families may wish to borrow a school notebook to support Remote & Flexible learning again which begins on Wednesday. Information went out via Skool Loop on Monday and the borrowing agreement can be collected out the front of the office if needed. Notebooks can be collected today between 11am and 5pm.
- <u>4. OSH Care</u> Could families planning to use the OSH service please let us know as soon as possible so that we can book in Toni-Marie.

#### OSH CARE WILL CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE DURING REMOTE & FLEXIBLE LEARNING

<u>5. School Photo Day Postponed</u> – Following on from yesterday's announcement that all Victorian schools will be returning to remote online learning from Wednesday 5 August until Wednesday 16 September our scheduled school photo date in Term 3 will now need to be postponed. This was on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> August.

We are currently in the process of working out potential dates for our school in Term 4 and will be in contact with families as soon as possible.

- <u>6. Student of the Week –</u> We will postpone Student of the Week while the period of Remote & Flexible learning is in place. This will start again when all students return to school.
- <u>7. Student Led Conference Day This is scheduled for Tuesday 1st September and will be held via Webex. If this does not suit, we can do a phone call but these will be limited to only 15 minutes each. Bookings will be open on Friday 14th October and information will go out on Skool Loop. At present, we are unsure whether Individual Learning Plans for Semester 2 will go home because of Flexible and Remote Learning being implemented again. We will be guided by DET in regard to this. We plan to use the online booking form again found at schoolinterviews.com.au.</u>
- 8. New Enrolments (2021) Information has been sent to the Kinder in regard to future enrolments for 2021 and was also posted on Facebook. Planning for the new year begins early. Some restrictions are in place with what we can and can't do at the moment in regard to tours during school hours. We hope normal school tours during school hours will be available at some stage. Enrolment forms and information can be collected at the office now it would great if these are back by Friday 7th August to assist with planning for 2021. If any families plan on leaving Tallygaroopna PS can you also let us know to assist with planning.

Our general school rule is to "consider the feelings of others at all times".


