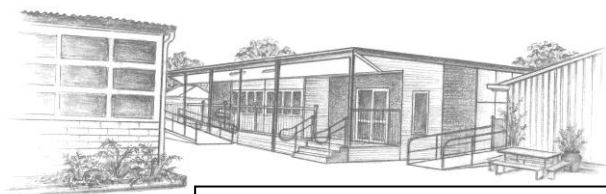

News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone,

On behalf of the whole school community, I would like to thank Ms Green for the terrific job she has put into teaching the F/1 class over the last 6 weeks while Mrs Wallace has enjoyed her time away on Long Service Leave. I know the children in the school have enjoyed having someone new in the class and Zerlina's professionalism and attitude to her teaching has been first class during this time. We all wish Zerlina the best in her future endeavours, who knows what that may entail – we may meet again! Mrs Wallace will resume normal teaching duties on Monday obviously.

Today our Camp program began with 3 lucky students heading off to Woorabinda and we have 2 other camps planned over the next couple of weeks. 10. Circus Workshop

All students from Foundation to Grade 4 will participate in a Circus Workshop at Eastbank in Shepparton on Thursday 27th of August beginning at midday and concluding at 1.30pm. We will travel by bus, leaving school at 11.30am and return at approximately 2pm. The cost for the day will be \$2 to cover the bus and permission forms will go home this week – to be returned before the end of the week. E learning vision for Tallygaroopna PS

ICT at Tallygaroopna Primary School will be a fundamental component of teaching and learning, where state of the art technology and professional learning will equip teachers with transformative skills and develop students into Global Citizens that are innovative and confident users of ICT in an ever changing digital world. Tallygaroopna Primary School aims to inspire and empower our school's learning community to envision and implement innovative eLearning strategies and technologies to improve student engagement, experience and achievement. We are fortunate to have a Student Teacher come into our school for the remainder of the term. Therefore, Eloise Ronnfeldt will be at our school during this time and may also attend the Grade 3/4 Camp at 15 Mile Creek. Ms Ronnfeldt will primarily work in the 2/3/4 class with Mrs Haberfield.

14. Enrolments

We have had a fantastic response to enrolments for new Foundation Students for 2016. At present, we have 9 Enrolment Forms handed in and we are awaiting a couple more as well. A reminder to families to get these in ASAP, so that we can begin the formal process of staffing for next year. Your assistance in regard to this would be greatly appreciated.

15. Sporting Schools Program

Our new Sporting Schools Program began a couple of weeks ago, free to all families. Gymnastics is being held during school time on Monday's for the whole school and Orienteering is held on Tuesday's after school from 3.35pm until 4.35pm for students who have enrolled in this program. Students receive a healthy snack before the program begins after school. Students need to be picked up immediately after Orienteering sessions.

16. Camp Information / Payments

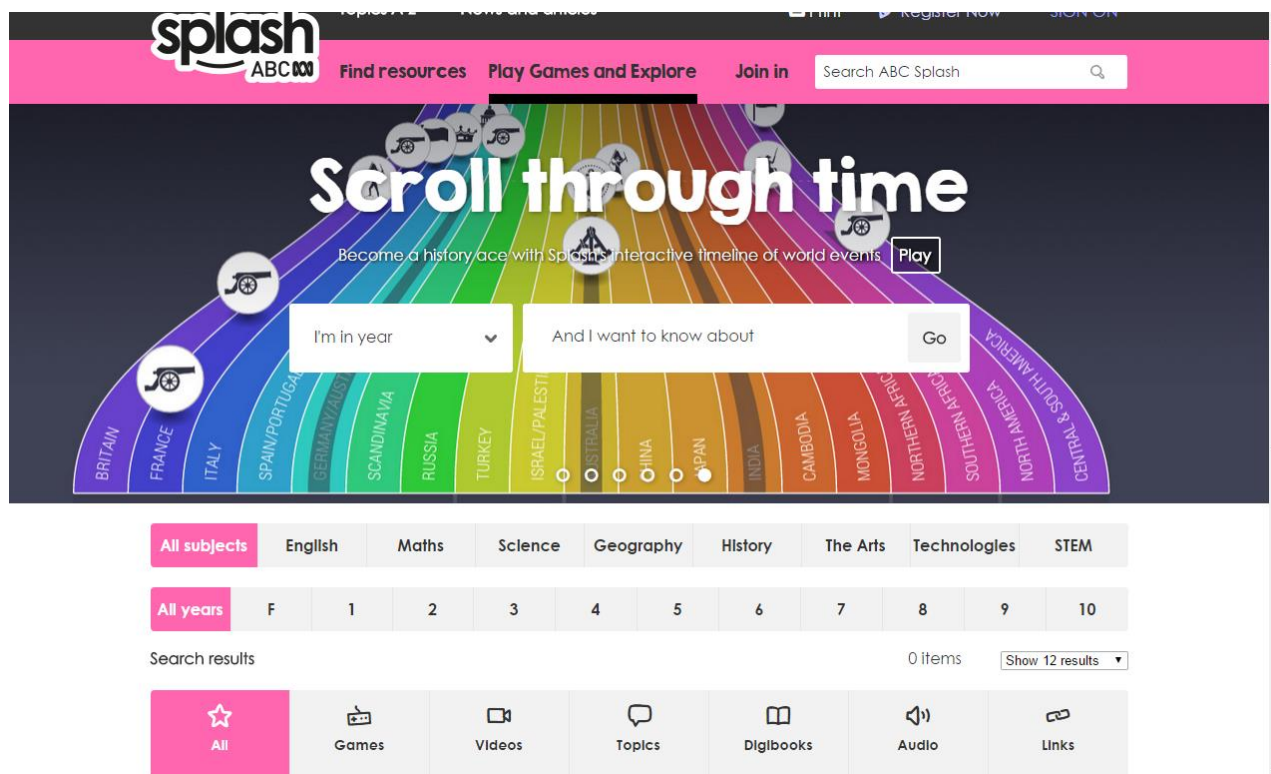
