

1. Bus Families for 2017

I am currently in the process of organizing the new bus route for the start of 2017. This takes some time to organize and we will need to call for a meeting (Monday 3rd October) similar to last year to set up a roster if needed to cater for all families. Currently, I have the following students hoping to use the bus for the beginning of 2017.

Unfortunately, we only have a 21 seater and spots are very limited and I am trying my best to accommodate many families who are not eligible to use the bus service (inside 4.8km going to your closest school). If any of this information is incorrect or you are happy to not use the bus for 2017, could you contact me ASAP so that the bus run can be finalised and organised without any problems. Mr Brodie

2. Potential New Bus Run for 2017

At School Council a couple of weeks ago, we discussed the possibility of completing 2 runs for our bus for next year to accommodate more families wishing to use the bus. This was approved although we are still seeking family feedback in regard to this to make sure that everyone is happy with this arrangement. This would enable us then to have a very easy bus meeting at the beginning of Term 4 – Monday 3rd October (FIRST DAY BACK IN TERM 4).

Currently, there are a number of families who use the bus who are eligible - being outside 4.8kms going to their closest school and they travel at no cost. Other families who are inside 4.8kms going to their closest school use the bus at no cost provided there is space. The current roster system enables this. We have a handful of families who choose to go to our school, although Tally PS is not their closest school. These families are fare payers - as per the Department Guidelines.

At present, we have a roster system where only 2 families don't use the bus every morning and afternoon. In 2017, this would increase to about 6 which would make it more difficult to organise.

A summary of the proposed school bus run and extension would be:

Morning Run: Stop 1 -8 & through to school arrive approx. 8.40am. Then from School to commence extension ie. Stop 9 (8.46am) - Stop 14 School (8.59am).

Afternoon Run: This would involve students on extension route to depart school at 3.15pm to 3.17pm in order for bus to return to school to commence main service at 3.33pm to arrive at Stop 8 at normal time of 3.42pm (normal time around 3.44, best to leave 2 minutes within times to keep pm times the same).

The Bus Map was provided on Tiqbiz for families to refer to if needed. The Department pays for Stops 1-8 (normal run) while School Council fund the extended run (Stops 9 to 14). As you could appreciate, the school already does a tremendous job accommodating families who live out of the township of Tallygaroopna so please consider this in your feedback.

There are pros and cons with this proposal:

In the morning - students on the extended route (Stop 9 to Stop 14) would pretty much arrive at school when the bell goes in the morning. However, nobody misses out on the bus - with no roster. In my opinion, eligible families should not be asked to rise in the morning to catch the bus any earlier. At present, the bus begins at just after 8am so this would not be ideal.

In the afternoon - students on the extended route (Stop 9 to Stop 14) would have to leave school earlier at 3.15pm. Students on the second run would have to wait after school for 8 minutes before the bus arrives back at school to be picked up. In my opinion, this would be ok because students generally stop their learning at 3.15pm anyway to pack up and clean up before the end of the day. Supervision outside would need to be enhanced to watch the students waiting for pick up at 3.33pm - again this shouldn't be a problem.

Zeerust PS would not be affected at all by this proposal.

3. Communication regarding the Bus

Over the last few years we have had a few minor issues where families have tried to contact me regarding the bus by texting me. At times though, I am in a formal meeting and the normal protocol during this involves having your phone on silent. As a result, I don't receive some messages on time. Apologies for this - but it is unavoidable.

Therefore, the best practice is to <u>contact the school first by phone</u>. Once the call is received (by a member of staff) alterations are made to the bus book. If families contact me by text or phone, I may not even be at school so I then have to contact the school and then alterations are made to the bus book. Obviously, this is an extra step and at times it is too late to make needed changes. Therefore, try the school first by phone and if that fails try me on 0411960164.

Just keep this in mind everyone as we continue to improve on our practices at Tallygaroopna PS. Everyone generally does a great job with this, but obviously the odd thing tends to slip through. If you get the answering machine at school try again or then ring or text me. David

All students will not be required at school on this day and there will be no OSH Care as well. Families will need to make alternative arrangements on this day.

A big thank you to the many families who returned these surveys. We had the majority of families respond to this survey and this feedback will allow us to continue to make our school a great learning environment for the children of Tallygaroopna into the future.

8. Father's Day Breakfast

At the Parents Club Meeting a couple of weeks ago, we decided to hold a Father's Day Breakfast for the wonderful Dad's, Grand Dad's or Uncles out there. The Breakfast will be held on Monday 5th September from 7am until 9am. Breakfast will involve - Bacon and Egg Rolls or Muffins & Coffee / Tea / Milo.

Special visitors are invited to stay around after breakfast to play some Board Games / Table Tennis. All students of the school will take home a Bag of goodies for their special visitor as well. Students will be monitored at school by staff when special visitors have to leave.

This is a wonderful initiative and I am sure our kids would love to see plenty of Dad's or Grand Dad's or Uncles at this event.
