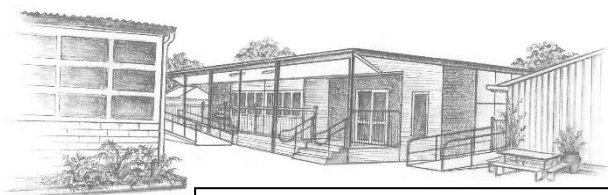

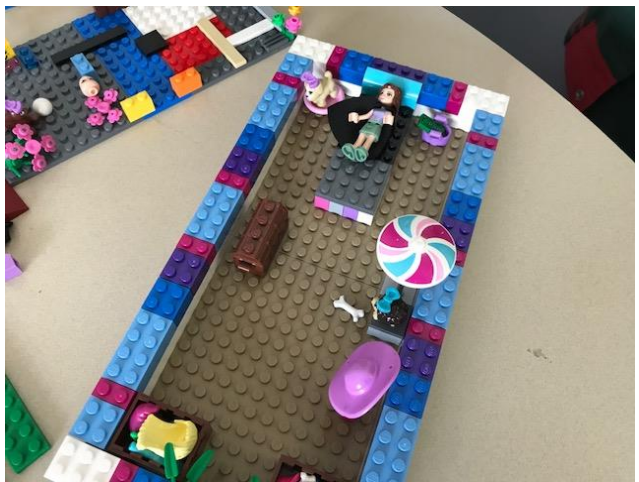

2. Working with Children Check Act Changes

Changes to the Working with Children Act 2005 (Act) commenced on 1 August 2017. The changes to the Act are designed to strengthen the protection of Victorian children by implementing key recommendations from the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse. The changes do not affect the requirement for individuals who engage in 'child-related work' to have a Working with Children Check (WWC Check). 'Child-related work' is any work that involves 'direct contact' with a child that is part of the person's work. It does not include occasional direct contact with a child that is incidental to the work the person is performing at the school (whether or not that work is paid).

Key changes for schools

There are two key changes to the Act:

1. The definition of 'direct contact' with children has been expanded to include oral, written or electronic communication as well as face-to-face and physical contact; and
2. A WWC Check is now required for anyone engaging in 'child-related work' regardless of whether contact with a child is supervised by another person or not. This means that a volunteer or visitor who is supervised by a teacher must have a WWC Check if they engage in 'child related work'.

What does this mean for schools?

Schools should review the parts of their visitors and volunteers policies that refer to requirements for WWC Checks to: update the definition of 'direct contact' with children so that it includes oral, written or electronic communication (as well as face-to-face and physical contact);

clarify that anyone engaging in 'child-related work' as part of their role or duties, whether an employee, volunteer, visitor or contractor must have a WWC Check regardless of whether they are being supervised by a teacher or another adult with a WWC Check.

The Department is updating its School Policy and Advisory Guide (SPAG) pages, and developing an exemplar policy template for principals to assist them to develop their volunteers and visitors policies. Further information will be provided as soon as possible.

What does this mean for parents?

The changes to the Act have not altered the provisions relating to parents.

A parent, or immediate relative, who volunteers at their child's school as part of an activity that their child is participating in is not required by law to have a WWC Check.

However, schools are encouraged to develop their own policies to assess and verify the suitability of volunteers and visitors to the school, and may decide to require a parent to have a WWC Check, depending on the activities and nature of the volunteer work being performed.

Parent volunteers are encouraged to contact their child's school to determine if the school requires them to hold a Working with Children Check card.

Mr Flood comes to our school with a lot of experience as a Junior Teacher and we look forward to him making a valuable contribution to our school and being a valuable member of staff. We wish Miss Beer all the best as she ventures into motherhood.

4. Grade 1/2 Activity Night / Sleepover

We have decided to hold a fun night for Grade 1 and 2 student with the option for Grade 2 students to stay the night. This program will be held on Friday 8th September beginning at 4.30pm and concluding at 7.30pm for the Grade 1 students. The Grade 2's will need to be picked up by 9am the following morning. Pizza will be provided for tea for all students who attend and the Breakfast Club will be open for Grade 2 students the following morning. A permission form has been sent home and will need to be returned by Friday 1st September to assist with catering. This night is not compulsory – it is just an opportunity for our kids to experience a night away from home leading into camps for the future.

More boxes are available to collect for anyone who is able to help out again with our fundraising project for the Grade 5/6 camp to Canberra. The response to this so far has been fantastic and we look forward to announcing the amount raised by the end of Term 3.

10. School Crossing Safety

It has come to our attention that some cars are not giving way to children or families who are approaching or going over the school crossing. This must be adhered to for the **safety** of anyone who uses this crossing. Could all families keep an eye on this please and reinforce this at home as much as possible to prevent a disaster from happening.

11. Unsafe Behaviours

No members of the community (children / adults) should be performing any unsafe acts at any time or be at unsafe heights (over 2 metres) during or after school hours. We obviously have Trespass signs displayed around the school so safe behaviour should always be adhered to. The school or Department of Education takes no responsibility for anyone not adhering to this.

12. Camps – Term 4

Parents are recommended to start thinking about some payments for the Camps, which are coming up in Term 4. These are summarised below. Medical and other specific forms will be sent home before the end of Term.

Grade 5/6 Camp to Canberra – Tuesday 31st October to Friday 3rd November

The Initial Cost for this camp is \$430 (this includes a \$30 rebate)

Grade 3/4 Camp to 15 Mile Creek – Tuesday 28th November to Friday 1st December.

Cost – approximately \$200 (TBC)

15. Parent Opinion Survey

A reminder that the Parent Opinion Survey will close on Sunday 27th August. We encourage all families to complete this survey and provide some feedback in regard to our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is completed annually by the Department of Education and Training and is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents at every school in Victoria. This year, many parents will be invited to participate. All responses to the survey are anonymous.

The survey helps our school gain an understanding of how you view our school climate, student engagement, and relationships. Our school will use the results to inform school planning and improvement strategies.

The survey is conducted online by ORIMA Research Pty Ltd and only takes 15 minutes to complete.

Results will be sent back to our school at the end of September.
