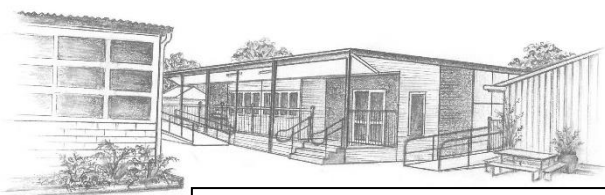

News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone.

We have been notified of a power interruption on Wednesday but are expecting a generator to be available. Please ensure that your child is warmly dressed in case this does not eventuate. The generator is expected to be positioned in the car park near the power pillar. Please ensure that no one goes near it. We will try and make the day as normal as possible and families can utilise the mobile number above for any communication. Flexibuzz or Classdojo messages can also be used if needed.

Only a couple of weeks to go until our kids shine again with our School Production. Everyone is working extremely hard with this and we look forward to our matinee and night show in the coming weeks. We will be videoing the production again and a DVD can be purchased for \$20 – orders need to be in by the end of the month, so please contact the office if interested.

Thanks to the families who have returned enrolment forms so far – three T-shirt presentations have been made so far and we look forward to more in the coming weeks. Having an idea of future enrolments certainly assists with planning for the 2020 school year. We have already started discussions regarding classes and staffing, but this takes time depending on enrolments. Announcements won't be made until late in the year, but families will have an opportunity to discuss any composite grade placements. At present, we are anticipating that the Grade 1 children may be split (F/1, 1/2), but obviously this could change.

I would also like to thank those parents who assisted with work around our grounds over the last couple of weeks. We have completed a lot of weeding and upgraded a number of garden beds to make our school attractive for all. Your support is greatly appreciated with this.

In this edition of the newsletter, there is information in regard to the Chocolate Drive, Grade 3-6 Camps, the Swimming Program, The Pizza / Footy Night and bookings for the Student Led Conference Day. Families are recommended to make an appointment ASAP for the latter – bookings will fill up quickly. If the Student Led Conference Day does not suit families – contact the school and another time can be organised. This day will be an opportunity to discuss student progress and also the Semester 2 Individual Learning Plan for all students.

At School Council last week, we discussed options for OSH Care for 2020 along with our Bus Service and we will continue to monitor interest in these services over the coming weeks. We anticipate making announcements in regard to both of these later on in the year – obviously the school makes a large financial commitment for both and it is essential that both of these are supported to make them viable for the future. Please contact the school if you have any queries in regard to these services – a survey is available for OSH Care and contact the school if you wish to utilise the bus in the new year.

Last but not least, Wednesday is a Casual Day for our Jump Rope for Heart Day – try and wear red if possible, if not a gold coin donation would still be appreciated with all proceeds going to the Heart Foundation.

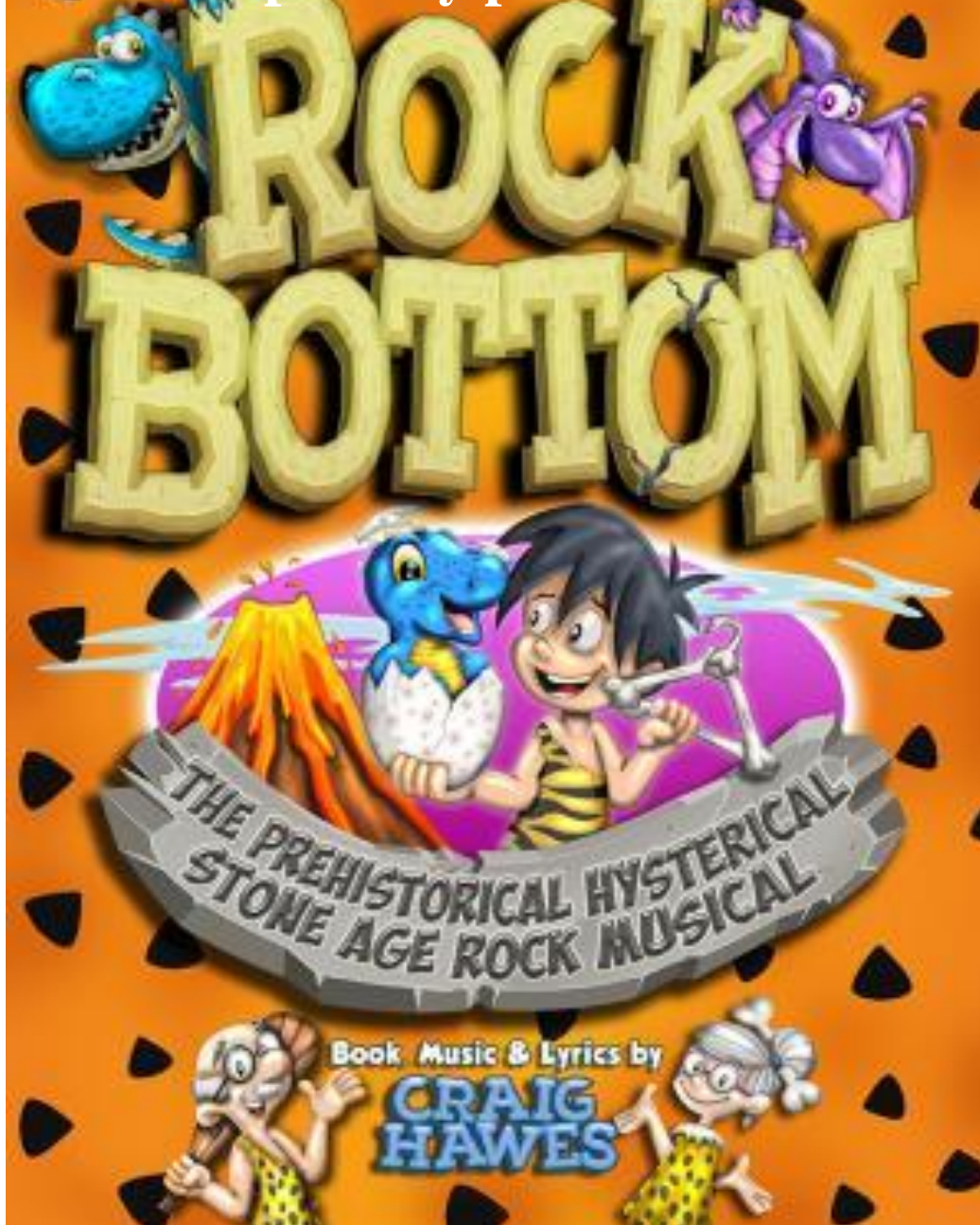

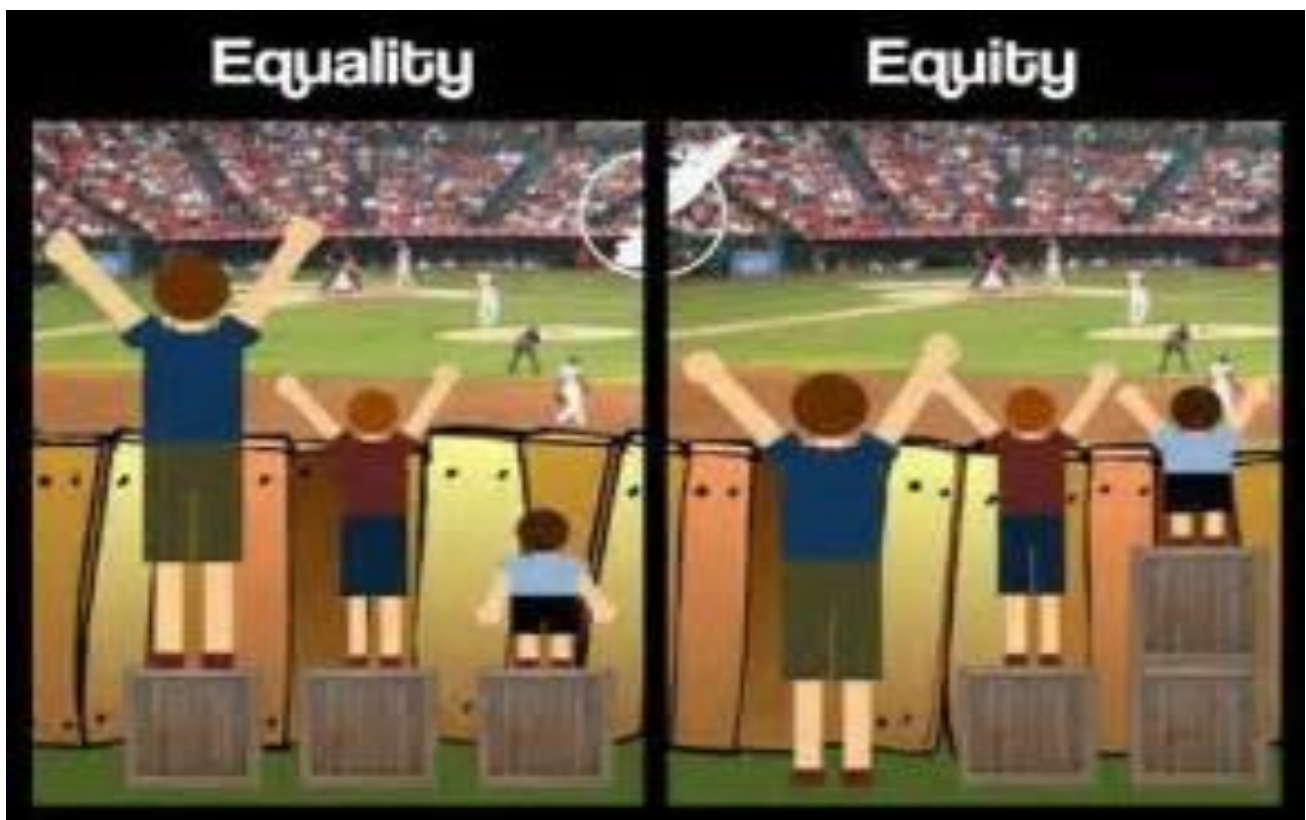

Values Vault – Week 4: Ellie

1. Swooping Magpies / Plovers

We have noticed a number of magpies starting to swoop smaller birds of late so the whole school community needs to be aware of this. Male magpies only swoop during mating season in spring due to a huge increase in testosterone where they become over protective dads. The mating season can vary from state to state but generally is between late August to late October, with the occasional borderline case.

Below is a list of safety tips that may help with preventing and avoiding a magpie attack.

- Keep alert and pay attention for any magpie nesting sites.
- Keep an ear open for their distinctive calls.
- Wear sun glasses and with a hat to protect your head and eyes.
- If a magpie swoops while you are cycling, it will probably stop swooping if you get off your bike and walk.
- If you spot a magpie nesting site then stay well clear and even plan alternative routes.
- Remember magpies are urban species too, so there is generally no escaping them!
- If you get swooped then tell others, log the attack here and inform your local council.
- Do not provoke the magpies, they are very territorial and will protect their nests.
- Wear a wide-brimmed hat or carry an umbrella.
- It is important to try to stay calm, if you panic and flap then this is more likely to appear as aggressive behaviour and provoke a further attack.
- Try to protect your eyes with your hands, those large beaks are very sharp and eye injuries have been previously recorded.
- Magpies seem to have very good memories and have attacked the same people over subsequent seasons and others they just leave alone. If it's attacked you before probably a good idea to use an alternative route next season!
- Face the magpie. They tend to attack from behind so facing them should avert an attack.

In the past, we have also had plovers laying eggs on the school oval and these birds can also be very aggressive so everyone needs to take extreme caution over the next few months. Appropriate action will be taken if anyone's safety is at risk.

2. Swimming Program

This will be held for 5 straight days beginning on Monday 21st October. Please put these dates into calendars at home. The cost for this program will be significantly lower thanks to some funding by the Department of Education. The cost this year is anticipated to be approximately \$50 per student – to be confirmed.

3. Footy / Pizza Night

We have only had 7 responses out of 51 so far for this night, which was planned for Friday 6th September. If numbers do not increase to about 15-20 this night will probably not go ahead. This night would involve dads, uncles, grandparents or special friends kicking the footy or soccer ball around after school at 6pm. This would be followed by some pizza and board games..etc, and also watching an AFL final - few beverages for the adults also! The night would probably end after the footy at about 10.30pm - kids can bring bean bags if they wish to watch the footy.

There would probably be a small cost (ie: \$10 per family for pizza as per the Movie Night earlier in the year)

4. Chocolate Fundraiser

Sixty boxes were distributed to families last week for a fundraiser for the Grade 5/6 camp. If anyone is able to sell some more boxes of chocolates – please contact the office so that an informed decision can be made on the purchase of additional boxes for sale. Each box is valued at \$60 – could this money please be sent into school by Monday 26th August at the latest.

5. Tidy Town Judging

A big thank you to the parents who assisted over the last couple of weeks with our school grounds in preparation for the visit. We had some guests last Friday come into our school and they were extremely impressed by the grounds and neatness of our school. Our work with Resource Smart / Sustainability was also emphasised heavily and we look forward to hearing of the outcome of this community initiative in the coming weeks.

6. Parent Opinion Survey – 17/51 completed so far

The Parent Opinion Survey was mailed to families a few of weeks ago. We hope this arrived safely - you can begin this survey from Monday 22nd July until Sunday 18th August (extended date). If you have misplaced this envelope - contact the school and we will send another one home. Only one survey for each family please. We really value any feedback that we get from our families and use this to make changes to our school if needed to make it a better learning environment for everyone.

7. Jump Off Day / Casual Day

This will be held on Wednesday 14th August and will be a Casual Day (wear red) to support the Heart Foundation. A gold coin donation would be appreciated for any students out of uniform on this day – please try and wear red to make it a special day.

9. OSH – Availability Survey

Unfortunately our numbers have dropped and it would be terrific to see some new permanent or casual placements in this service, which operates from 3.25pm to 6pm, 5 days a week. **If you apply for the Child Care Subsidy, the cost can be a lot lower than you would anticipate.** This service to our families involves a large financial commitment by School Council and we will be discussing the sustainability of this program at the end of the year. Our OSH Care service has been in operation since 2014 and as our school has grown we had hoped that enrolments in this service would continue to grow. We currently aim for 25 places filled each week. **A survey was distributed a few weeks ago to the eldest child in each family (also on Flexibuzz) – it was due back to school on Friday 26th July.**

13. Classes for 2020

We are currently discussing the formation of classes for 2020. At present, we are anticipating a reasonable sized group of new Foundation students so composite grades may be: F/1, 1/2, 3/4 and 5/6. These grades will allow consistent and low student numbers in each class. It is essential that enrolment forms are in ASAP so that appropriate planning can be put in place in regard to the 2020 school year. There may be some changes in relation to teachers with grades next year, but this will not be confirmed until late in the year.

14. Communicating with Staff

Please feel free to discuss any issues with myself or specific class teachers. At Tallygaroopna PS, we are accessible to parents and we value the importance of positive and constructive communication with all of our families. Please contact the school to make an appointment if needed – so that issues can be addressed at an appropriate time which does not affect normal planning and learning time.

15. Colder Months - Tissues

We would be very appreciative if each family could please supply a box of tissues for the school in anticipation of colder weather (and possibly running noses and coughs!). We remind families to please encourage their children to dress appropriately for the weather.
