1. Bus Seats / Bus Captain

Last week, all students who utilised the bus received information in regard to specific seat allocations for the bus. This will enable all children to adhere to the safety guidelines which are essential for travelling on the bus. Please reinforce safe travel on the school bus at all times. Last week, the bus travellers also voted for a Bus Captain and Abby was elected by her peers with this responsibility and more specific information is provided below

Bus captains are appointed to assist the driver with supervision. Under the coordinating principal's direction, they have full authority and should be instructed to report all misbehaviour and vandalism to the coordinating principal.

Bus captains should know that the following rules are to be rigidly enforced:

- Passengers must wait at the bus-stop in an orderly fashion; refrain from playing on the roadway; and not attempt to approach the bus until it has stopped.
- No passenger is to board or leave a bus while it is in motion.
- Passengers must board or leave the bus in a quiet orderly fashion.
- Passengers allocated a seat must remain seated for the whole of the journey. No pupil should, under any circumstances, have any part of his/her body protruding from a bus or throw any object within or from a bus.
- Boisterous conduct or 'horse-play' or any action which may distract the driver is not allowed.
- Students should converse in a normal tone of voice at all times and refrain from calling out to others on board the bus or to passing traffic.
- No food or drink is to be consumed on school buses.
- Students must not talk to the driver while the bus is in motion.
- Compliance with the school's Code of Conduct while undertaking bus travel.

What we hope to see: No moon unfortunately for the younger kids, but we'll be able to look at planets Venus and Saturn, clouds of gas and dust in space, double stars, carbon stars, globular and open clusters, starforming regions. We'll also, at around 8pm, run a brief five-minute naked eye sky tour using a laser pointer to indicate to people what's up in the sky, including the Milky Way galaxy, its two satellite galaxies the Magellanic Clouds, and various objects that we'll see through the telescopes.


