News from the Principal's Desk

Hi evervone

Last Tuesday we all settled back into normal onsite learning after coming back on site a bit earlier than initially planned. Thanks to the families who returned work that was planned until Thursday with Remote & Flexible learning – your support with this matter was really appreciated. As always, we continue to navigate as best as we can through restrictions in line with COVID-19. I am extremely grateful for the support from our staff and families to make these uncertain times as normal as possible. Try and stay positive as much as you can – many support agencies have been listed in this edition of the newsletter if you need to reach out to someone.

We have finalised the Grade 3-6 Camp and it was great to see that 45 students have returned relevant forms so they can participate in this extra curricula program. Miss Lothian, Miss Rosevear, Dee Palmer and Beck Wayman will be at the camp for the whole duration and I will be attending on a Monday and Wednesday to assist. The cost for the camp is \$260 and this will need to be paid for before the camp begins on Monday 6^{th} September. I will be running OSH Care for the 3 days of the camp.

We have an important Parents' Club Meeting on Wednesday night and I again encourage everyone to attend on Webex if they can. Some events (Munch N Crunch, Father's Day Breakfast) are unlikely at the moment – but we will discuss them along with some other specific matters on the night.

In this edition of the newsletter there is some important information in regard to our remaining Curriculum Days, the Tutoring Program which concludes soon and also the Student Led Conference day. We have decided to hold off bookings for the latter for a couple of weeks in case restrictions are lifted in regard to families coming into the school. At the moment, essential workers are only allowed in the school, so there is the possibility that this day may be held via Webex. We will obviously make a decision in the next fortnight with the format for this day. A reminder that students are only involved for the duration of their interview and there is no school or OSH Care on this day. Staff will be busily meeting students and families throughout the day.

Production practice continues this week and we hope to finalise an end product by Friday 3rd September. We are aiming for this to be released early in Term 4 – although the situation is not ideal, the students are staying generally positive.

Finally, the Parent Opinion Survey is still open to families again for 2021. I encourage all families to complete this so that we can make relevant adjustments if needed to specific programs and processes which are currently in place at our school. As always, we value your feedback and all data is confidential.

Karen will be at the office all week, to address any matters if needed. Keep safe everyone! I am a bit unwell at present, but I hope to be back at school sometime this week.

Absence forms can be submitted on Skool Loop. This is our preferred method of notification.



In August of last year, my gorgeous two-year-old nephew, Hunter Patrick Boyle, tragically passed away. Hunter was playing at his Pa's farm when he got out of sight for a few seconds and sadly drowned in a nearby dam. Hunter's cheeky smile and big, blue eyes will be remembered forever by all of those who knew him.



Hunter's parents – Asha and Matt – established <u>The Hunter Bovle Children's Swim Program</u> alongside KidSafe, Victoria in memory of their little boy. Drowning is one of the leading causes of unintentional death for Australian children. This foundation aims to bring this statistic down by providing 12 months of swimming lessons to vulnerable children in the Goulburn Valley region, who are unable to access this on their own. Children are provided with all of the necessary equipment to support them throughout these lessons, such as goggles and towels. Asha and Matt, as well as their family, are passionate about supporting children as they develop crucial skills during these swimming lessons, in the hopes that no other family has to go through something as devastating as losing a child. This foundation is able to exist through the generous donations of our local community and beyond.

On Saturday the 21st and Sunday the 22nd of August 2021, the Shepparton Running Festival will take place. <u>The Hunter Boyle Children's Swim Program</u> is the Charity Partner for this event. To raise funds for such an incredible foundation, I am encouraging you all to register and come along. There are options to suit the whole family!




Outside School Hours Care is looking for any donations of wool for a craft project in this program. If you can help, please send the wool to the school office.

Mobile Phone Policy Reminder

1. COVID-19 Restrictions

A summary of important restrictions is below from the Operational Guidelines on Friday 13th August

- Visitors to school premises should be limited to essential school services and operations.
- Essential visitors to school grounds must comply with density limits, face mask requirements, QR code checkins and practise good hand hygiene.
- Non-essential visitors should be excluded from school sites for this period.
 - Essential visitors include for example:
 - Preservice teacher placements
 - Staff involved in School Breakfast Clubs
 - Health and wellbeing staff
- School tours should not be conducted on-site for prospective students and their families at this time.
- For communication purposes, teachers and education support staff are not required to wear face masks while teaching, but those who wish to do so, can. It is recommended that face masks be worn while teaching wherever practicable.
- Sharing of food is not permitted (ie: birthday cake), however pre packaged food which doesn't require anyone to touch this food is ok (ie: lollipop). Please contact the Principal in regard to this please so that families can be informed and make an informed decision in regard to participation.
- Use non-contact greetings (not shaking hands, hugging or kissing).
- School Production: No capacity or density limits apply if the facility is being used for the purpose of providing an exclusive venue for the exclusive use of a single school at any one time for educational or school gathering purposes. In this situation only students and staff can attend the event.
- School camps and overnight stays for regional Victorian schools can take place within regional Victoria. Bookings of camps venues must be limited to single schools. Camp venues can only accept multiple schools attending at the same time if they can guarantee school groups will remain separated and will not share common facilities at the same time. Mixing of staff and students between different schools is not recommended.

QR code check ins **are required** to be used by:

- all visitors on school site (including contractors, external Department staff and building and maintenance staff)
- all parents who enter school buildings when on school site

QR code check ins are not required to be used by:

- staff
- students
- parents who come onto school grounds for drop off or pick up, but do not enter buildings.

2. Student Led Conferences

Student Led Conferences will be held on Friday 10th September. The aim of this day is to give all students an opportunity to discuss their progress at school with staff and families. Students present their work and progress on this day in a very informal manner. All students prepare a simple sheet, which allows children to talk about their time at Tallygaroopna PS along with their Semester 2 goals. Students choose samples of work to show as well. There will be time for parents and teachers to discuss student progress without the child present. However, these conferences allow all of our kids to be involved in some way and to have ownership for their learning at school. Students will be required at school only for the duration of their interview. This day allows us to continue to build on the family – school relationship. We hope to see all children attend this day. Please arrange an alternate time if this day does not suit.

Bookings will be available on Monday 30th August at 3pm. Specific information will be in the next edition of the full newsletter.

3. Production

This week we will be continuing some whole school practice in the Project Space with the school production. Beginning on Monday 23rd August – we will begin some practice at the hall and we hope to finish recording this performance by Friday 3rd September (before the Grade 3-6 camp). We will need a few weeks to put this performance into a movie format and we hope to make this available to the school community early in Term 4. As stated previously, we cannot have an audience this year, but we are still looking forward to seeing our kids shine and do their best. Stay tuned for more details.

4. Curriculum Days

5. Tutoring Program

6. Grade 3-6 Camp – Billabong Ranch (Echuca)

We have finalised numbers for the Grade 3-6 camp - we have 45 students attending at present. The full cost of the Grade 3-6 camp has been finalised - this is \$260, This was our approximate cost to begin with - thanks to the families who have made some payments already. Can all payments for the camp be completed before the camp begins on Monday 6th September. If families are unsure of how much credit they have - please contact Karen at the office.

More information will go home in regard to the camp. This will include a reminders list and information in regard to departure and arrival back at school in regard to the camp.

All parents/caregivers/guardians will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year, the Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted <u>until Friday 3rd September.</u>

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. Survey results will be published via a future newsletter and also discussed at School Council. This survey will also be sent home in a hard copy form for all families.

8. Melbourne Trip - Grade 5/6

We hope to have a trip to Melbourne for Grade 5/6 students to cover some specific themes which we were unable to look at because of the cancellation of the Canberra Camp. This will include a visit to State Parliament, the MCG Museum and the Shrine of Remembrance.

The date for this visit is planned for Tuesday 23rd November – hopefully restrictions are lifted by then to enable us to do this excursion. More information will be available soon and permission forms will need to be returned – we may leave at 6am and return at 7pm which would be a big day, but very worthwhile.

9. Father's Day Breakfast

At the last Parents' Club Meeting, we decided to again hold a Father's Day Breakfast for the wonderful dads, granddads, carers or uncles out there. The breakfast will be held on Monday 30th August from 7am until 9am (depending on COVID-19 restrictions). Breakfast will involve - bacon and egg rolls or muffins & coffee / tea / milo. Special visitors are invited to stay around after breakfast to play some board games/table tennis. Students will be monitored at school by staff when special visitors have to leave. Contact the school on 5829 8264, if you can attend with names of all people attending please. Any new students intending to come to our school in 2022 are invited to participate as well.

Please note, this event will need to be confirmed in line with COVID-19 restrictions.

10. Tim Ford Support (Chaplain)

11. Sharing of Food

The updated guidelines state that sharing of food is not permitted (ie: birthday cake), however pre-packaged food which doesn't require anyone to touch this food is ok (ie: lollipop). Please contact the Principal in regard to this, so that families can be informed (via Skool Loop / Dojo) and then make an informed decision in regard to participation.

12. School Uniform - reminder

A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. A reminder to all families to reinforce this please. From May until the end of August, school beanies and scarves are permitted to be worn outside – beanies can be purchased from school in line with our uniform policy as well – we would appreciate green or red beanies and scarves only.

CAN APPROPRIATE UNIFORMS BE REINFORCED PLEASE – BLACK SHORTS OR PANTS.

13. Absence Notes

Absence notes are a legal requirement for all absences. Please use the school absence note or submit an absence on Skool Loop. Both of these are the preferred methods because they are completed immediately. If either of these are not convenient - please ring the school. Formal notes are needed for audit records and your support would be appreciated. We would prefer no text messages.

What happens if absences continue – 7 days a term turns into 28 days a year, which turns into 196 days over 7 years. This results in a child missing 1 whole year of their Primary School years – something for all of us to think about.

14. School Fees

Family reminder statements were sent home to some families early this term. If you need any clarification, please contact Karen. More information regarding fees can be found in Parent Payment Arrangements for 2021 which was sent home to families late last year and are also available on the school website under Information < School Fees. These base school fees are summarised below:
