Dear Parents,

A huge thank you to the families who helped with the Working Bee on Sunday. The morning was very well attended and your assistance was greatly appreciated. I am hoping to hold a couple of final working bees early in term 4 in preparation for our new building. Details will be available in the near future.

Today, all families will receive the Parent Opinion Survey. This survey is confidential and I encourage all parents to be honest with this so that the data which we collect is reliable and we can then act upon it. I would also like to emphasis what a great place Tallygaroopna Primary School is and try and keep in mind all of the positive things which happen and why this makes our school a great learning environment for our children.

Unfortunately, I didn't get to meet with Don Gargan from the Hume Region last week as he got held up at the Regional Office. Therefore when information becomes clearer in regard to the State School Improvement Program (\$300,000) I will inform the school community immediately. This may involve redevelopment of existing facilities to create administration and community spaces, but we have collated a large wish list which will be discussed at this meeting. School Council will be heavily involved in this process as well.

This week is Literacy & Numeracy Week and I encourage all family members to use this opportunity to come into our school and have a look at some of the programs which we implement. I will be teaching until Wednesday this week and I hope to release staff on Thursday morning so that they can complete some observations in classrooms to give each other feedback in regard to teaching practice. I have a Mentoring meeting on Friday afternoon at Benalla but, Karen will be in the office until Thursday to attend to any specific needs. Have a great week everyone.

1. Prep Enrolments for 2011

We hope to finalise Prep enrolments by the end of this term. Please contact the office if either you or a friend plan to enrol your child/ren at Tallygaroopna for 2011. <u>To assist with planning for 2011, we also need to know of any students who will be leaving our school at the end of the year.</u>

2. <u>Ultranet Evaluation</u>

Our school has been selected to participate in an Ultranet Evaluation Project. The Department has engaged Education Services Australia (ESA) to undertake an evaluation of Ultranet implementation over the next three years. The project consists of quantitative data collection and qualitative data analysis undertaken by consultants dk2 Pty Ltd on behalf of ESA.

As part of the data gathering, three online surveys will be administered to three hundred randomly selected schools. The purpose of the surveys is:

- to gather baseline data in 2010;
- o a climate check in 2011; and
- o a final evaluation survey in 2012.

The first set of online surveys will be administered between **October 11 and 22** and are designed to gather information about the expectations, attitudes, experiences and Ultranet use of principals, teachers, students, parents and Ultranet Coaches. Surveys are customised for each group.

For this first set of surveys, it is not essential for you or your school community to have had any experience with the Ultranet.

Who will be surveyed?

This round of surveys targets four groups within each of the 300 schools:

- Principals;
- Teachers:
- Students; and
- Parents.

The Ultranet Evaluation Project is designed to evaluate:

- how the Ultranet is being used to support existing practice or to transform practice;
- the role of the Ultranet in improving student engagement, wellbeing and achievement;
- the implications of anywhere, anytime access to data, devices and the system;
- the implications of increased access to learning technologies on rural and remote users of the Ultranet;
- how the Ultranet is being used by learners, teachers, managers, support staff and parents to support effective learning, teaching and management;
- the ways in which the Ultranet is being used to respond to individual learning needs;
- which functions and features of the Ultranet are most useful to whom, and which approaches to use have the most impact;
- whether the Ultranet supports improved home, school links and parent engagement;

3. Parent Opinion Survey

These went home with children today and they are due back at the office by Friday 10th September. The overall objective of the Parent Opinion Survey is to collect data about parent opinions and for individual schools to then use this information to drive further improvements.

4. Fruit in Schools Program

Students in the Prep / Grade 1 class with participate in a Fruit in Schools Program tomorrow. The session will be held in the Multi Purpose Room and begin at 10am and conclude at 10.30am. This program will also involve children from the Tallygaroopna Pre School and it is line with our Go For Your Life Program which promotes healthy eating at school.

5. Literacy & Numeracy Week

This week is Literacy & Numeracy Week and we will be conducting some fun educational programs at school. Parents are encouraged to come along and view any of these if they wish. Wednesday and Thursday mornings until lunch time are actually Open Mornings and all family members are invited to come along and observe classroom activities. These will be very informal.

6. Sports for School Program


