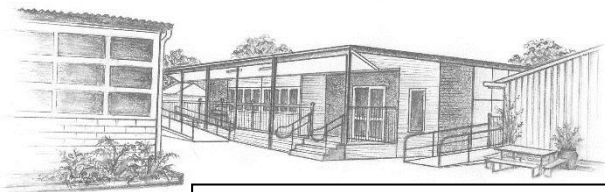

Sustainable Leaders Day

On Friday the 19th of August, the 4/5/6 Students were invited to attend a Sustainable Leaders Day at McGuire College for the Hume Region. As our school is a ResourceSmart school, we were invited to present what our school is currently doing to be more resource and environmentally friendly. A few other local primary schools that are also ResourceSmart schools attended too, which provided students with the opportunity to share with each other what their school is currently doing to be more ecofriendly.

Throughout the day students participated in a range of activities which taught them about things such as greenhouse effect, sustainable energy, looking after animals in our outdoor environment, pollution of waterways from stormwater runoff, how to create vegetable boxes for growing food, and ways we can educate the schooling community to be more ResourceSmart.

After lunch, students conducted a waste audit of all the rubbish they had produce as part of their recess and lunch. Students were asked to sort the rubbish into 4 types of bins- landfill, organic, paper and mixed. It was interesting to see how much waste every person can produce every day.

After the audit, each school did a presentation about what their school is currently doing to be more ResourceSmart. It was interesting to learn what each school is doing, and it also gave us some ideas of what we could take back to our own school.

Overall, we had a great day and learnt heaps about making our school more ecofriendly. We now have lots of ideas to take back to school and try out!

Child Safe Standards

As a result of the 'Betrayal of Trust' report and recommendations, all schools are required to be compliant with the new Child Safe Standards. There are 7 key standards to ensure that all schools are safe places for children and that they have a zero tolerance towards child abuse. School Council and I are working together updating, amending or developing policies in alignment with the Child Safe Standards.

Some of the key elements for our school are:

- Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- We have zero tolerance for any abuse of children.
- We already have policies and processes in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children. These are being strengthened to ensure a zero tolerance approach to child abuse.
- There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with the children here.
- The new child safe standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- The child safe standards apply to school staff (including volunteers and contractors), visitors and students' family members.
- Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility. Different people at our school have different roles and responsibilities for ensuring children's safety.
- Things you need to know about: what 'zero tolerance' means to us, what roles and responsibilities adults have for child safety, our new procedures to respond to and report complaints of any form of child abuse.
- We want to ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we'd like you to support us (for families).
- Staff members (including volunteers) will receive training and support to understand and carry out their responsibilities under the standards.
- Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school).
- Other people using our school facilities will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of using our facilities if they involve children enrolled at the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while their staff or other adults are at the school).

Staff have already begun receiving support to understand their roles and responsibilities as part of the implementation of the Child safe Standards. What this will mean for you as families and as a school community, is that there will be a number of changes and updates to the policies and processes we currently use. This information will be communicated in the most effective way, usually via the newsletter or Tiqbiz.

Internet Safety

We are all aware of the dangers of the internet but are our children??

Recently a confidential survey was completed with the students from grades 4/5/6 on social media and I want to share with you some of the findings.

Most children felt that they would never use social media to be mean to someone or gossip about others behind their backs. Most of the children stated that they use social media wisely but if they found that they had hurt another person's feelings, they would make the effort to apologise when they saw them.

The majority of kids felt that communicating face to face was better, although some stated that being behind a screen did give them more confidence to say things they might not normally say in person.

Nearly every child felt that there should be an age limit to when social media is appropriate to use for kids and the most common age mentioned was 13. Their reasons behind this was that kids could learn bad things, it may not be safe or people could say mean things to you.

Most kids felt that parents should have access to their children's social media accounts so that they can see what you are doing, to keep you safe and to make sure you are not getting into fights.

The students recognised that there were some risks to using social media, some of which included getting bullied, getting hacked, people finding out your personal information and people stalking you.

It was great to see the students being involved in this study as there are so many ways that we use technology and it is never too early to learn about internet safety. Children should not be afraid to use the internet but it's great for them to learn how to use it safely. Below are some ways to be **SMART** on the internet.

S-SAFE- Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information when chatting or posting online. This may include your address/email address, phone number and passwords.

M-MEETING- Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parent's permission and supervision. Online friends are still strangers even if you have been talking to them for a while.

A-ACCEPTING- Accepting emails, messages or opening files or pictures from people you don't know can lead to problems- they may contain viruses or nasty messages.

R-RELIABLE- Some online might lie about who they are and information on the internet may not be true. Always check websites, books or someone who knows.

T-TELL- Tell your parent or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know are being bullied online.
