1. Staffing – As stated last week, Miss Wilson officially joins our workforce today in the 23 room. Families will be informed ASAP in regard to Miss P's last day in the coming weeks. 2. School Hats – All students are now required to have a school hat at school again and wear this outside. This is in line with our Student Dress Code Policy which states that hats need to be worn by mid-August. Please follow this through at home.

3. Tally's Got Talent – This is scheduled for Tuesday 17th September and auditions will be held during this Wednesday again. We will be aiming to send a note home after auditions confirming any acts for the final performance. This will be very informal and the venue will be confirmed once acts have been finalised.

4. Father's Day Breakfast – Numbers closed on Friday and we are now ordering items for this breakfast. We look forward to see many of the Dad's and Special Friends at our school on Friday at 8am.

5. Farm Visit – This is scheduled for Friday 6th Sept for F,1 and 2 students at Pedretti's farm – 100 metres down the road. All family members are invited to come along if they wish. We will confirm the time for this in the next week or two – at midday or at 2pm. No permission forms are needed because this is a local excursion.

6. Parent Opinion Survey – This survey continues to be open for parents / caregivers / guardians to complete until **Friday 30th August**. Specific information was sent home a number of weeks ago in sealed envelopes and we welcome any feedback as per usual. Please just complete one survey per family.

7. Skipping Demo – This Wednesday we would like to show the whole school our skipping demos that we have been working on. We will assemble on the basketball court at 1:00pm and parents are invited to come along and have a look.

8. Bike Ed – This begins today for Grade 4,5 and 6 students. Other forms went home for the On Road Test and the Grade 6 Bike Ride last week – these are available on Skool Loop. Any help for the On Road Test would be appreciated.

9. Snags & Milo This continues on Friday and is again well supported by our students. Any donations of food would be appreciated. Please see Karen so this can be coordinated and any helpers on the day from 10.30am to midday would be appreciated.

10. Enrolments for 2025 – Can any enrolments for next year be handed into the office now please. We are currently trying to plan for next year, but this is a difficult task if we don't know what numbers will be for 2025. 11. Uniform Reminder – A reminder to families to reinforce our school uniform. This should give our students a sense of pride without competition at school.
