1. Building Update

Last week, painting began on our compressed sheets around school along with the rendered brick wall and these areas look terrific. Some painting will continue this week, so it is important that students stay right away from these areas. We were also able to put locks on all of our cupboards in the new school kitchen facility and we are now able to move items back into this area this week. **If anyone can assist with this it would be greatly appreciated.**

The Undercover Area outside the sport shed has been completed and we are hopeful that we will have our new basketball and netball rings erected this week – weather permitting of course. On Saturday 17th September, the pavers in the Undercover Area outside the Multi Purpose Room will be removed so that this area can be concreted during the holiday period – we will rope this area off during the last week of school for the term and make sure that it is safe and secure for all of the children at the school. Also during the holiday period, we anticipate that trees will be removed from the Car Park at the front of the school and this area will be levelled in preparation for a new redevelopment. Signage will also be put up around the school to make the school easily accessible for school visitors.

2. Book Day at Katandra West PS

The children participated in a variety of activities throughout the day which included cooking, mask making, outdoor games and a visit from a real author. 3. End of Year Excursion

In 2010, we had a successful end of year excursion to the Melbourne Zoo and we are hopeful of doing the same again this year. This was discussed at School Council last Wednesday night but <u>a possible date may be either Thursday 8th or 15th December to a venue to be determined</u>. This will be discussed further at the Parents Club Meeting this Wednesday night. Last year, parents were invited to come along with their respective children at school. At this stage, no Preschool children will be invited because we would like parents to see this trip as an opportunity to spend some quality time with their children who are presently enrolled at Tallygaroopna PS. We hope to confirm this event and specific costs before the end of the term so stay tuned.

4. NAPLAN Results

NAPLAN Summary Reports were made available to schools last Friday. Individual student reports are due to arrive at school before the end of Term 3. When these arrive they will be sent to families promptly, with a copy being put in each Students Individual File which is kept at school.

5. Swimming Program

Our Swimming Program began today with 43 students participating and as stated in the information that went home last Thursday, some small alterations have occurred. As a result, we will now leave by bus at 12.30pm and return to school at approximately 2.30pm. Students will swim in 6 different ability groups with qualified instructors from 1pm until 2pm only. This will enable us to spend more quality time working on our School Production back at school. All children should have a plastic bag with bathers and a towel with goggles being optional. These should be named accordingly. We will get changed for Swimming before we leave the school. Students are still required to wear school uniform for these days.






