1. E Smart Initiatives

A reminder that if any parents would like to have a weekly ClassDojo report emailed to them could they contact class teachers ASAP. This program is a classroom tool that helps teachers improve behaviour in their classrooms quickly and easily. It also captures and generates data on behaviour that teachers can share with parents and administrators. The ClassDojo is being implemented in Grades 2-6.

Also last week, all families should have received a permission form about Superclubs which will be implemented as part of Information Technology classes in Term 4. Could these forms please be returned ASAP. Information regarding these two programs was included in last week's comprehensive newsletter.

2. Kelvin Woodley Visit

Today, we had a visit from Kelvin Woodley (Jamie's Uncle), who is Principal of Tapawera Area School in New Zealand. This was a rewarding visit for the whole day and some of the core questions which Kelvin Woodley was focusing on throughout the day were:

- What are the founding philosophies that have created the learning environment?
- How does the school manage extreme behaviours in the more challenging students?
- How are the extremes of learning needs catered for?

3. Swimming Program

Our Swimming Program began today with the majority of students participating, which was pleasing to see. The couple of students not participating will stay at school with a teacher, with the exception being tomorrow. All children in the school will go to Aquamoves on Tuesday, with students not participating completing some work on the side of the pool. If any parents would prefer this to not occur, could you contact the school ASAP. All students will swim from noon until 1pm. Each day we will leave school at 11.30am and return at approximately 1.30pm. The cost for the program is \$48 per student, which covers bus costs, swimming instructors and entry to Aquamoves in Shepparton. This is only a small increase from last year's program. This money will need to be paid ASAP – contact the office if a payment plan is necessary.

4. Policy Updates

At School Council last week, we were able to update our Asthma and Bullying policies. These policies have both been endorsed and are available on our School Website for the school community to view if needed. Our Student Engagement Policy has also been also adjusted to reflect our updated Bullying policy.

5. School Hats

Recently, we were able to adjust our Sun Smart Policy in line with accreditation in regard to being a Sun Smart School. As a result, we now use a combination of sun protection measures for all outdoor activities from September to the end of April. Therefore, all children will need to have a hat at school ASAP. Children without a hat next week, will only be allowed to play under the large undercover area.



6. Last Day/ Casual Day

As per normal, on the last day of the term (Friday 21st September) students will be dismissed from school one hour earlier at 2.25pm. This day will also be a casual day with Footy Colours the theme of the day.

7. Grade 5/6

This week will be the final week for weekly spelling/tables for the Grade 5/6 students. Next Monday, we will have our Big Spelling Test in the morning and our class party will be held on the last day of the term. Students have been working on gaining points throughout the term, to hopefully participate in this party, which will involve a DVD and some party food. This will be provided by Mr Brodie.

8. School Production

This week, we will be having production practice every afternoon after Swimming in preparation for our big night next Wednesday. It is vital that all students are present during these afternoons as we finalise our school production. Next week, we will be down at the town hall all of Tuesday and on Wednesday until lunchtime






