<u>Supervision – before and after school hours</u>

A reminder to families that children should be in attendance at school before 9am, but teacher supervision will not be provided before 8.30am.

1. School Production

Congratulations to all involved with our School Production. As stated on the night, this is a real team effort and involves the support of all of the students, staff and parents. Again, our children led from the front and they were able to display skills of team work, resilience, organisation and cooperation. We look forward to next year and I am sure that Mrs H has already started planning for this. We hope that DVD'S will arrive at school before the holiday break – these will need to be paid for before collection.

2. Mr Brodie / Mrs Armstrong - Leave

As stated previously, Mr Brodie will be taking a week's long service leave beginning this Wednesday 13th September to attend a family wedding in Queensland. He will return to Tallygaroopna PS on Wednesday 20th September. During this time, Mrs Haberfield will be Acting Principal. Mrs Armstrong will be taking long service leave during the first 2 weeks of Term 4. She will return to Tallygaroopna PS on Monday 23rd October. It would be appreciated if all permission forms and specific payments are made ASAP.

3. Italian Cultural Day

This whole school excursion is scheduled for Thursday 21st September and specific information went home a couple of weeks ago. Could permission forms be returned ASAP and any children with special dietary requirements should have already returned specific information in regard to this - Thursday 7th September. The theme will be "Things Italian" with the day involving the students of Katandra West, the Mooroopna Secondary School Senior Band and the Year 8 Mooroopna Italian class. The host school will be Katandra West. The School Band have prepared Italian songs, and short skits by the primary school students will entertain students.

The activities will include soccer matches in the afternoon and the teaching and participating of "Bocce", the Italian way! Students are asked to come as Italian characters and famous Italians or wearing of the Italian colours. Ideas could include Pinocchio, La Befana, soccer players, a waiter, a pizza, a gelato or the colours of the Italian flag – green, white, red (pretty much the Tally uniform).

There will be a parade for the dress up. Students will have their normal recess which includes their fruit. For lunch, students will receive pizza and a gelativo for a treat. Special dietary needs will be catered for by notifying the school before the day. Please ensure that students are provided with extra morning tea and a drink.

The cost of the day is \$8.00 which includes the pizza, gelato, resources for activities - \$5 and bus travel - \$3

4. Swimming Program

Our Swimming Program is scheduled to be held from Monday 23^{rd} October until Friday 27^{th} October (week 3 – term 4). This program is not included in school fees and it is an optional program, if children wish to participate. Generally, this program is of great value considering what it would cost for 5 hours of swimming lessons normally – last year the vast majority of children participated in the program, which was great to see. This year, we will be swimming for 5 days straight and students will participate in an hour program daily. All students will swim from 1.30pm until 2.30pm each day. Each day we will leave school at 1.00pm and return at approximately 3pm (lunch will be eaten earlier each day). The cost for the program is \$60 per student, which covers bus costs, swimming instructors and entry to Aquamoves in Shepparton. This money will need to be paid by Monday 16th October – permission forms have gone home already.

5. Student Teachers - Term 4

For the first 3 weeks in Term 4, we will be fortunate to have 2 Student Teacher Placements at Tallygaroopna PS. We welcome both Coby Turk and Micaela Ripper to our school during this time and hope their time at our school will be an enjoyable one. Both ladies will be working primarily in the Grade 1/2 and Grade 3/4 Classrooms.

6. Last Day of Term 3 – Casual Day

The last day of the Term will be held on Friday 22nd September with school finishing at 2.25pm as per usual. This day will be a Casual Day with the theme of the day being Winter PJ's. It would be appreciated if a gold coin donation could be made per family to go towards the Cancer Foundation.

7. Lunch Orders / Pie Warmers

We are in the process of having school lunch orders again one day a week. We have started initial discussions with the local service station in relation to this and we are aiming for these to be available every Thursday, with lunch orders due at school on Wednesday by 3.30pm. We hope to have a pricelist out to families ASAP. Lunch orders will begin first week in Term 4 and daily pie warmer lunches at school will cease.

8. Fun Run

Permission forms for this event were sent home a couple of weeks ago – the cost is \$3 (\$2 for the bus and \$1 for Kidstown). This day will be held on Friday 15th September and we will travel over to Mooroopna / Kidstown by bus. Sausage Orders have now closed – from last Friday. We will be leaving school by 10.30am and aim to return to school by 2pm.

General Organisation

- School bags will be dropped off at Kidstown before turning up at the Chinamen's Garden.
- Students will have a texta mark placed on their hand with the grade they are in. Schools will do this before they get there. This will enable the staff at the end of course to easily identify the winning runners.
- The first three in each level will be recorded (but not their time)
- Grade 6 students will run first, followed by grade 5 students and so on.
- Boys and girls to run together.
- Boy and girl winners of each grade level to receive ribbons.
- Students to run in grade levels not age groups.
- We will have a sausage-sizzle at Kidstown. This is being organised by Dhurringile P.S.
- If students aren't having sausages then they will need their lunch in their bags.
- On arrival there will be allocated spots for each grade levels to sit. Look for the grade signs. We will have a short meet and greet. Teachers are to help get students into the correct lines.
- The aim is to have plenty of helpers along the running track. There will be cones along the track where marshals should stand.
- At the end of the event students will be marshalled through the finishing line to either the recording table where we will record the first three boys and girls from each grade or to the end marshalling/play area.
- The finish line is very hectic and we need helpers from other schools. This is an area where we need support so we don't miss any place getters.
- Each school would have someone from their school at the start and at the finish to account for their students.
- When everyone is finished running we will have a short presentation and present ribbons to the first three place getters in each grade level (boy and girls).
- It's all about Fun!

9. Art Work

Children have been working on their artwork for the Eastbank Exhibition. The theme is "In the jungle/ Out of Africa". These will be mounted on large Corflute boards and will be installed at Eastbank commencing on the 5th of September to 17th of October. Pop in and have a look and help us to celebrate the students work.

10. Speech Therapy

The final session for this term will be held on Wednesday 13th September. Reports will be handed out when Mr Brodie returns to school next Wednesday. We are currently in discussions for future dates in Term 4 and parents will be notified of these dates probably early next term.

11. Music Performance

On Friday 22nd September, the 5/6 students are going to perform the song to the school at the afternoon assembly at 2:00pm. We invite any parents and friends to come and watch the performance to see what the 5/6 students have been learning in music. Sorry for the late cancellation last Friday.

12. Curriculum Day – Pupil Free

The final Curriculum Day for 2017 will be held on Friday 8th December. This will be the day after the End of Year Excursion and staff will be busily finalising School Reports on this day. No students will be required at school on this day, so families will need to make alternative arrangements.

13. Staffing Arrangements - 2018

I am currently in the process of going through the Staffing Process for 2018. This takes some time and I anticipate informing the community early in Term 4 of the outcome. Thanks for your patience in regard to this matter. Mr Brodie

14. Sharing of Food

A reminder that we need up to a weeks' notice with any food shared in school (eg birthday cake) so that families can make alternative arrangements if needed.

15. Camps – Term 4

Parents are recommended to start thinking about some payments for the Camps, which are coming up in Term 4. These are summarised below. Medical and other specific forms will be sent home before the end of Term.

<u>Grade 5/6 Camp to Canberra</u> – Tuesday 31st October to Friday 3rd November Cost – approximately \$330 (TBC – depending on Chocolate Drive Fundraising) The Initial Cost for this camp is \$430 (this includes a \$30 rebate) <u>Grade 3/4 Camp to 15 Mile Creek</u> – Tuesday 28th November to Friday 1st December. Cost – approximately \$200 (TBC)


