

## **1. Time Alteration Proposal**

Recently, consultation took place with a group of parents about some issues regarding children eating lunch throughout the day. This has become a concern and we have a draft proposal to present to School Council on Tuesday 18th September. As always, we welcome any feedback in regard to this (email: tallygaroopna.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au).

This proposal increases eating time and allows children to take their time with food rather than being in a rush to go outside and play. Lunch and morning recess would be swapped around as would supervision in the yard and in the Multi Purpose Room. A summary is:

Bus times would remain the same with these alterations. Schools are mandated to have 5 hours of contact time with teachers and students. If approved at School Council, these new times would begin in Term 4. Families will be informed via the newsletter.

**School council meetings are normally open to the school community. Visitors or observers can be present at meetings with the agreement of the principal and a decision of council. There are times when the council meeting, or part of the meeting, needs to be closed.**

## **2. OSH Care Enrolment Forms - Amendment**

On Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September, we had an Assessment & Rating Visit for our OSH Care Service. One of the items that needed amending were some specific things on the OSH Enrolment Form. These were:

- a. Address of Emergency Contacts
- b. Details of Authorised Nominees including
  - Authorisation to consent to medical treatment
  - Authorise the administration of medication
  - Authorisation to authorise an educator to take the children outside the service premises.
- c. Cultural Background of the Child
- d. Medicare Number

Could these be filled in on the attached sheet that was sent home last week to OSH families. These are due by Friday 14<sup>th</sup> September and these will be added to our current enrolment form. These items will be included in the 2019 enrolment form which all families wishing to use the service will need to complete in the new year. Current emergency contacts & people authorised to collect your child were attached from the current enrolment form to assist you.

### **3. Notre Dame Transition Form – due today**

These were distributed to 5 families who have children attending Notre Dame College for 2019. To assist us in the successful transition of some Grade 6 students into Year 7 at Notre Dame College next year, we would appreciate families support in asking children some questions in regard to placements. Grade 6 teachers provide a Student Profile on each student through an online form – which we are aiming to do before the holiday period.

### **4. School Hats / Uniforms**

Over the last few weeks, we have noticed many children being out of uniform. Could this be addressed please because uniform reflects our school and relates to our school values of Respect and Inclusion. We will have many visitors in our school before the end of the year and with a School Review being held soon along with our formal Orientation Program beginning it is essential that our children show pride and value in our school by displaying consistent dress with our school uniform. Last week, hats were compulsory again and it was pleasing to see only a handful of students without a school hat. New hats can be purchased at school for \$11 if needed.

### **5. Cluster MARC Day**

Our school will be participating in a Cluster MARC Day hosted by Numurkah Secondary College on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> October (week 1 – Term 4). This day is a book themed costume dress up day with prizes for students and teachers. Schools participating on this day will be Katunga PS, Currawa PS and Dookie PS. Students will need to bring their own lunch and drink for this day and the cost for each student will be \$10 (\$6 to cover costs for the day and \$4 for the bus). We will be aiming to leave school by 9.30am and will return back to school at approximately 3pm. Permission forms will go home before the holiday period and it would be appreciated if these are returned with payment ASAP.

### **6. End of Term**

Term 3 concludes next Friday 21<sup>st</sup> September with dismissal at 2.25pm as per usual. Outside School Hours Care will be available for families if needed until 6pm. School resumes (Term 4) on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> October.

### **7. School Council Meeting**

This meeting has been rescheduled to Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> September to allow for staff to prepare for the School Production this week. The finance committee will meet at 6.30pm, followed by the formal School Council meeting beginning at 7.30pm. If any school community members are intending to come to this meeting to be involved in discussions in regard to the alteration of times proposal – contact the Principal please.

### **8. Contacting Staff out of school hours**

Please be mindful of contacting staff outside of school hours (beyond 5pm). This may involve text messaging, phone calls, Class Dojo and Flexibuzz. There has been a big push from the Department of Education in regard to staff and principal health & wellbeing and it is important that we all have lives away from the busy school day. We will also make an extra effort to do the same for our families, so that after work time can be devoted to families.

### **9. Visiting Artist**

Ann Christie will be visiting our school on Wednesday as part of our Art Program (MACC Van). Ann is a local artist from Picola who has studied art with the local art group and has concentrated on Botanical Art with Bev Williams. We will be looking at techniques with painting blue wrens and other items in nature. We are looking forward to working with Ann and learning some new skills.

### **10. Magpies / Plovers**

It is nesting season again so please take caution with any birds swooping over the coming weeks. We have had issues with plovers in the past, so we remind children to be on the watch for these into the future.

### **11. Flanny for a Farmer**

The last day of the term will be a casual day hosted by the Junior School Council with the theme being Flanny for a Farmer. Students may come dressed in their favourite flannelette shirts/farming outfits. Cost will be a gold coin donation with proceeds going to Drought Angels for drought relief.



### **12. Staffing Arrangements - 2018**

I am currently in the process of going through the staffing process for 2019. This takes some time and I anticipate informing the community early in Term 4 of the outcome. Thanks for your patience in regard to this matter. Mr Brodie.

### **13. Sharing of Food**

A reminder that we need up to a weeks' notice with any food shared in school (eg birthday cake) so that families can make alternative arrangements if needed.

### **14. Curriculum Day – Pupil Free**

The final Curriculum Day for 2018 will be held on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> November. Staff will be attending a Professional Development with Tony Attwood that focuses on Autism. Esteemed Professor Tony Attwood is a clinical psychologist who has specialised in Autism Spectrum Disorders since he qualified as a clinical psychologist in England in 1975. He has worked with many thousands of individuals of all ages with Asperger's syndrome or an Autism Spectrum Disorder. He presents for us sessions on cognitive abilities, thinking and learning profiles, and the presentation of ASD in girls. No students will be required at school on this day, so families will need to make alternative arrangements.

### **15. Italian Day**

Our school will be attending this day at Katandra West PS on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> October. The theme will be "Buongiorno Signora, An Italian Adventure", with the day involving the students of Katandra West, Tallygaroopna Primary, the Mooroopna School Senior Band and the Year 7 Mooroopna School Italian Class. Students will also be entertained by our special guest Nadia Cavallo from Geelong (Cavallo Capers). Nadia will perform for us and engage students in songs and dance. Activities will also include a soccer match and presentations from the Katandra West Grade 5/6 class.

Students are required to come in Italian colours and characters/icons. Italian colours are very much appreciated because we would like to create a human Italian flag. There will be a parade once again for the most creative dress up and photo shots.

Students will have their normal recess which includes their fruit from home. For lunch students will receive pizza and a gelativo for a treat. Special dietary needs will be catered for by notifying the school before the day. Students will need to provide extra morning tea and a drink. Students are required to wear hats also.

### **16. Swimming Program**

Our Swimming Program is scheduled to be held from Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> October until Friday 26<sup>th</sup> October (week 3 – term 4). This program is not included in school fees and it is an optional program. Generally, this program is of great value considering what it would cost for 5 hours of swimming lessons normally – last year the vast majority of children participated in the program, which was great to see. This year we will be swimming for 5 consecutive days. All students will swim from 1.30pm until 2.30pm each day. We will leave school at 1.00pm and return at approximately 3pm (lunch will be eaten earlier each day). **The cost for the program is \$46 per student, which covers bus costs and venue hire at Aquamoves in Shepparton. This money will need to be paid by Monday 15th October – permission forms will go home in the near future.**

### **17. Division Athletics**

This is scheduled for Monday 15<sup>th</sup> October at the Shepparton Athletics Track beside the Basketball Stadium. The following students have qualified for this day and permission forms will go home shortly. The cost for this event is \$10 per student if participating – families will be responsible for transport and supervision on the day.

### **18. School Production**

We will be down at the town hall all of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and on Thursday until lunchtime this week. Keep working on those scripts kids and don't forget the songs!!! Everyone needs to be at the hall by 7pm on Friday night.

### **19. Lunch Orders / Pie Warmers**

We are in the process of having lunch orders again one day a week. We have started initial discussions with the local service station in relation to this and are aiming for these to be available every Thursday, with lunch orders due at school by 3.30pm on Wednesday. Production tops have been organised for the F/1 students but could you please make sure your child is wearing black tracksuit pants and preferably black shoes (or sneakers if needed).


## **Football/Soccer Boot Bank**
