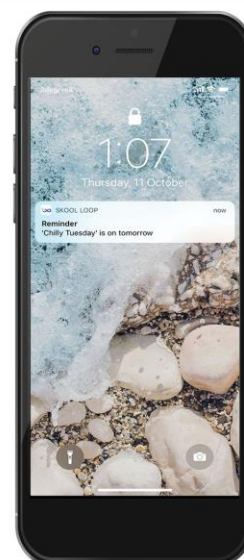

Here's some tips to ensure you receive notices and push notifications

- When you download the Skool Loop App you will be asked if you would like notifications please **tap yes**. Some devices don't ask this question and automatically tick yes for you. This can be changed in your settings
- If your notifications are turned off in your device settings, some phones apply that to all apps when downloading. In the phone settings please make sure your notifications are turned on
- Check your App Store or Google Play regularly for any outstanding updates
- There are 2 different notices school will send out: **push notification** (banner and ding) or a **notice** (visual alert only)
- You will only receive a push notification if you are not using the app at the time
- If your volume is off you will not hear an alert
- You will see a visual alert if a **notice** has been posted. You will not hear a ding
- You will only hear a ding if the school sends a **push notification**.

BUCKET FILLING

You may have heard your child/ren talk about filling people's buckets or dipping into buckets.

Everyone has an invisible bucket. When our bucket is full, we feel great. When it's empty, we feel awful. Yet most people don't realise the importance of having a full bucket. Things that you say or do will either empty or help fill a bucket. In the process of helping to fill someone else's bucket, you are actually helping to fill your own bucket.

RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS

Kindness is a type of behaviour marked by acts of generosity, consideration, rendering assistance, or concern for others, without expecting praise or reward in return. Have you ever done something nice for someone else 'just because'? It wasn't to repay them or because you had to—it was simply because you wanted to. Well, then, you've done a random act of kindness! Kindness is a fantastic tool to use to grow your well-being. It's not only good for you but has a positive impact on others.

Here are some examples:

Giving compliments, saying kind words, doing an act of service for someone else, being respectful, showing gratitude, noticing good things that others do.

CLASSROOM MOOD METERS

The Mood Meter is a way for children to express their feelings without fear of being laughed at. Emotions drive attention, memory, learning and decision making. Thus, it is important for students to recognise how they feel, communicate this information effectively and regulate their emotions and by doing so maximise learning and performance. The Mood Meter is a tool that helps everyone to achieve these goals. So, how does the Mood Meter work? The Mood Meter is a quadrant of colours: red, blue, green and yellow. Each colour represents different kinds of emotions such as:

Red – angry, scared, worried

Blue – sad, lonely, tired

Green – calm, relaxed, optimistic

Yellow – happy, excited, brave



This term all three classes have been using the Mood Meter as a way of checking in with students to see how they are feeling.

During wellbeing sessions, we have also looked at lots of strategies to help deal with and regulate these emotions.
