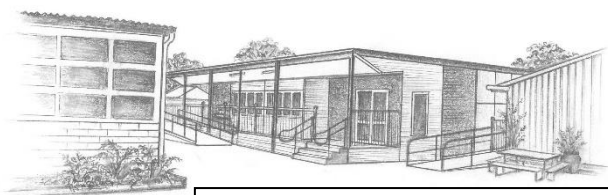

News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone

Welcome back from the Term 3 holidays. I hope everyone has had time to recharge the batteries as we look towards a busy but very rewarding end to the 2019 school year. Over the holiday period, we were able to install our 54 solar panels on the main building. Special thanks to Mrs Armstrong for her work with this major project and we look forward to this asset making a real difference to our school over the coming years. We are striving to be a Resource Smart School and I am sure data gathered from these panels will be integrated into a variety of teaching and learning activities at our school. Stay tuned for more information in regard to this.

There are a number of extra curricula programs taking place over the next couple of weeks so please read relevant information in the newsletter and don't hesitate to contact me if anything needs to be clarified. The next 3 weeks are extremely busy with a couple of programs out of the school (MARC Day & Fun Run) along with our whole school Swimming Program which commences on Monday 21st October. Permission forms must be returned for all of these programs or submit a consent form on Flexibuzz - we will follow some of these up this week. We also have some students who have an opportunity to represent the school at the Division Athletics Carnival in Shepparton next Monday - good luck with this everyone.

The grade structures for next year have also been announced in this edition of the newsletter and we have decided to split the Grade 1's in 2020. This will then allow us to have relative consistent and low class numbers across the whole school as was the case this year. In determining whether these children are in the F/1 or 1/2 class many factors will be looked at. Among these will be the academic and social level of the students in this year level and we will endeavour to do what we think is best for this cohort of children. Please contact me directly if you would like to discuss your child's placement for 2020. This Friday, we have our Cluster MARC Day at McGuire Secondary College. This promises to be a fun day with a parade, performance and a number of specific activities throughout the day. We encourage everyone to get into the spirit of the day and dress up - it sounds like prizes will be awarded for the best costumes on the day, so good luck everyone.

All families are encouraged to attend this night as we address the impact that social media has on our school community. 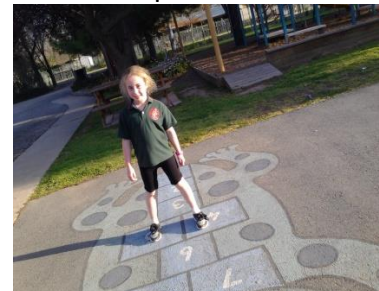

SCHOOL SOLAR PANELS

Over the holiday period, we were able to install 54 solar panels on our main building. This week we will have a specific monitoring system installed which will enable all of the staff and students to look closely at the power that is being generated from each individual panel. We look forward to being able to incorporate this information into our classroom activities throughout the year – more information will be available soon.

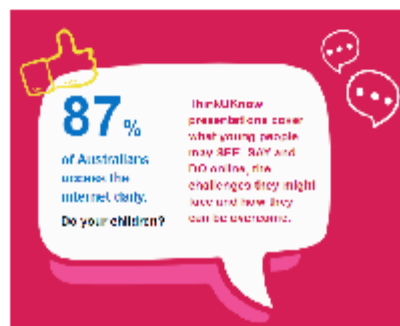

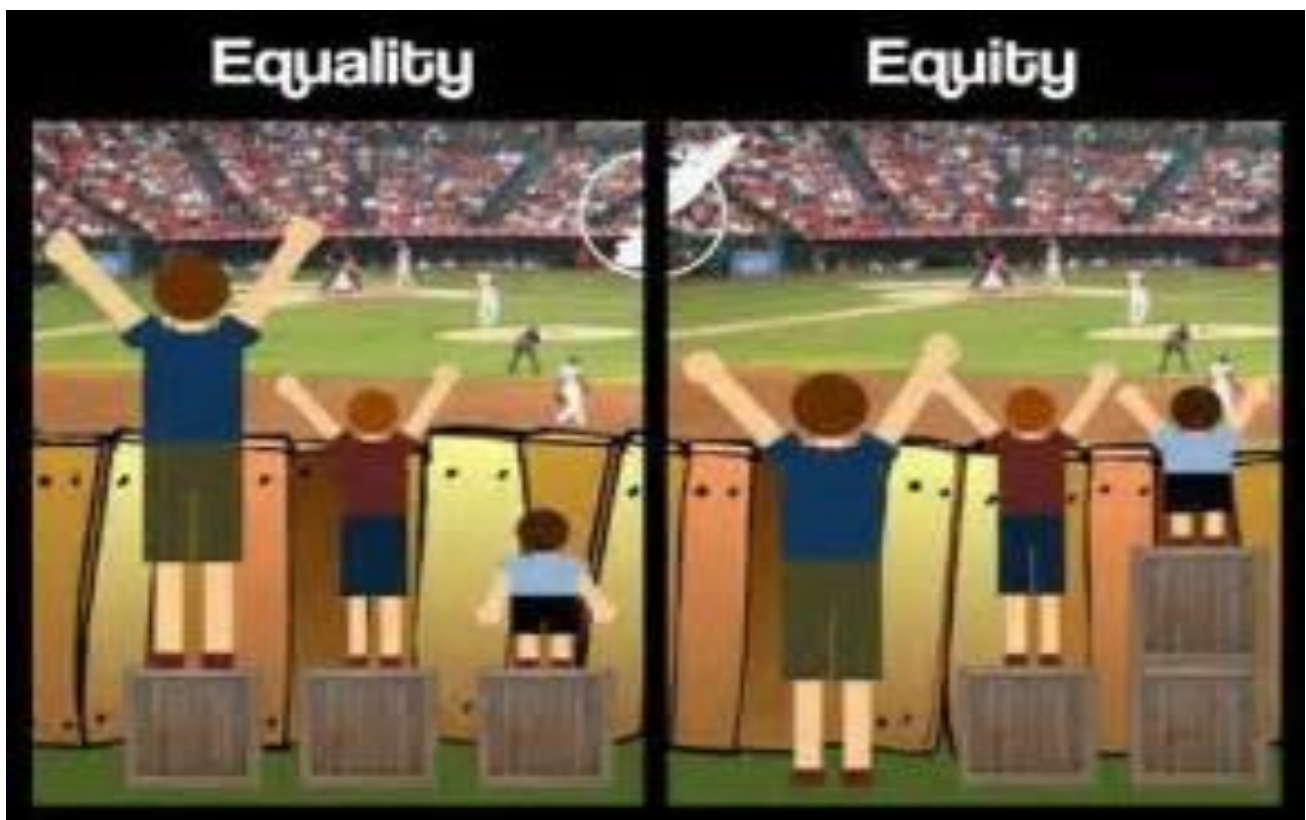

Day 5 (Statewide) – Tuesday 10th December (all day)

Uniform Voucher Process – Current Year 6 students

Please read on for important information about the \$200 uniform vouchers for 2020 Greater Shepparton College (interim name) students, specifically for current Year 6 students.

If you currently have a child in Year 6 who will be enrolled in Year 7 at Greater Shepparton College (interim name) next year your child will receive a form and an information sheet about the uniform voucher process early in Term 4, 2019.

Parents/carers are asked to please fill in the form indicating your choice of uniform retailer for each child (the uniform retailer options will be on the form), sign and return to McGuire College.

Completed and signed forms for current Year 6 students need to be returned to McGuire College by **Thursday 17 October 2019**.

Following receipt of the form, a voucher will be prepared for each child to the value of \$200 in the name of the requested uniform retailer, and distributed to students.

The voucher can then be redeemed from the nominated uniform retail shop.

Please ensure that you complete a form for your current Year 6 students if they will be attending the new school next year, so that your child can be included in the \$200 uniform voucher process.

If we do not receive a completed and signed form, we will not be able to factor your child's needs in or issue you with the uniform voucher.

1. Attendance Awards

We had many students record 100% attendance in Term 3, which was a fantastic result. Any student who records 100% attendance at the end of the year will receive a special laminated certificate.

2. Camps for 2020

At school council last term, school council members agreed that in the future families will be asked to pay a non-refundable deposit rather than give an expression of interest. This will aid planning as the school has had to cover costs in the past with families withdrawing their expression of interest.

It was agreed that a deposit of \$100 will be required to secure positions on future camps. Information was sent home to families before the holiday break (on Flexibuzz also) **and a deposit will need to be returned by this Friday 11th October.** Obviously, camps for 2020 want a deposit from the school now and bookings are filling fast. Camps will be informed of numbers when deposits have closed and if there is not enough interest - camps potentially will not go ahead as planned and family deposits will be refunded.

Grade 5/6 Camp (Urban Camp to Melbourne) - Monday 30th November to Wednesday 2nd December

Senior School

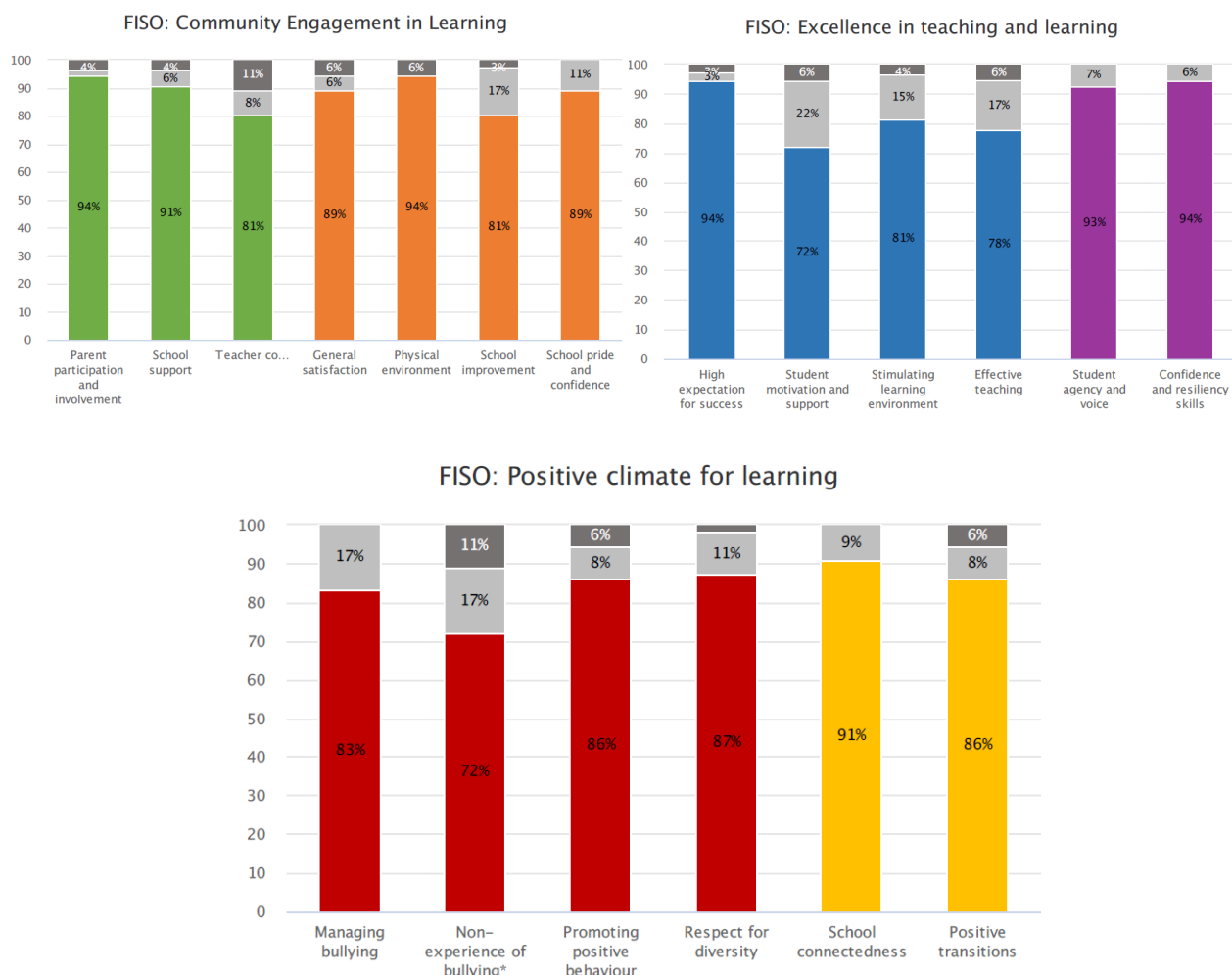
Grade 3 / Grade 4 – 22 students

6. Parent Opinion Survey

7. Contacting Staff out of School Hours

Please be mindful of contacting staff outside of school hours (beyond 5pm). This may involve text messaging, phone calls, Class Dojo and Flexibuzz. There has been a big push from the Department of Education in regard to staff and principal health & wellbeing and it is important that we all have lives away from the busy school day. We will also make an extra effort to do the same for our families, so that after work time can be devoted to families.

8. Grade 1/2 Activity Night & Grade 2 Sleepover

This program will be held on Friday 18th October beginning at 4.30pm and concluding at 7.30pm for the Grade 1 students. The Grade 2s will need to be picked up by 8am the following morning. Pizza will be provided for tea for all students who attend – no breakfast will be provided the following morning. A permission form and overnight camping form went home before the holiday break to assist with general organisation. Grade 2 students staying the night will need to return the normal camping medical form also. This night is not compulsory – it is just an opportunity for our kids to experience a night away from home leading into camps for the future.

9. Fun Run – Kids Town

All students in F-6 will have an opportunity to participate in a Cluster Fun Run on Friday 18th October. This will be held at the Mooroopna end of the Causeway (Chinaman's Gardens) running to Kidstown along the bike track. Participants will be from the following Primary Schools: Harston, Undera, Ardmona, Zeerust, Congupna, Lemnos, Merrigum, Wunghnu, Tally, Waaia, Mooroopna Park & Mooroopna North. The start for the first group of runners will be 11.30am and we anticipate finishing by 2pm. We should arrive back at school by 2.30pm at the latest. The cost for the day is \$3 (\$2 for the bus and a \$1 gold coin donation for Kidstown). This money should be paid directly to Tallygaroopna PS.

10. Division & Region Athletics

The cost for this event is \$10 per student if participating – families will be responsible for transport and supervision on the day. **Permission forms were distributed before the holiday break** – Division is on Monday 14th October at the Shepparton Athletics Track (McEwen Reserve) and if students qualify for Region this will be held on Friday 18th October.

11. Swimming Program

Our Swimming Program is scheduled to be held from Monday 21st October until Friday 25th October (week 3 – term 4). This program is not included in school fees and it is an optional program. Generally, this program is of great value considering what it would cost for 5 swimming lessons away from the school environment – last year the vast majority of children participated in the program, which was great to see. This year we will be swimming for 5 consecutive days. All students will swim for 45 minutes each day - there will be 2 specific groups this year to make the time in the water more effective – these will be from 1pm – 1.45pm and 1.45pm – 2.30pm. We will leave school at 12.20pm and return at approximately 3pm (lunch will be eaten at the normal time of 11.45am). **The cost for the program is \$55 per student, which covers bus costs and venue hire at Aquamoves in Shepparton. This money will need to be paid by Monday 14th October – permission forms went home before the holiday break.**

13. OSH – Availability Survey

Unfortunately our numbers have dropped and it would be terrific to see some new permanent or casual placements in this service, which operates from 3.25pm to 6pm, 5 days a week. **If you apply for the Child Care Subsidy, the cost can be a lot lower than you would anticipate.** This service to our families involves a large financial commitment by School Council and we will be discussing the sustainability of this program in the next couple of weeks. Our OSH Care service has been in operation since 2014 and as our school has grown we had hoped that enrolments in this service would continue to grow. We currently aim for 25 places filled each week. **A survey was distributed a few weeks ago to the eldest child in each family (also on Flexibuzz) – reply online please if possible.**
