News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone

It was great to see all of our children return to school last week, ready to learn after a well-earned break. This term promises to be an eventful one with lots of formal and informal events planned and we hope that everyone has the stamina for a long term – 11 weeks and 2 days. Congratulations to all of the students who received Attendance Awards for Term 3 – these nearly doubled compared to Term 2 and we hope that we finish the year on a positive note with no real disruptions to school or learning. Awards will again be presented at the end of the year for Term 4, Semester 2 and the whole year.

Our School Review is fast approaching in the next few weeks. Thanks to all of the family members that were able to complete the School Review Survey either online or in a hard copy form. This feedback will assist our School Review which begins on Tuesday 25th of October and concludes on Monday 14th November. This will allow our school to set some new goals and targets for the next few years.

Today, our Orientation Program began for our new Foundation students for 2023 and it was wonderful to see them generally settle into their new environment well and mix with our current students. Learning new routines obviously takes some time and we look forward to our new little ones getting accustomed to their new school over time. We have 4 more visits scheduled – all of these are in this edition of the newsletter.

Our full Mental Health Program begins this week and there will be some visitors to our school throughout the term working with a number of children. There is obviously a big emphasis on Mental Health as many schools continue to recover from COVID-19 interruptions which included many snap lockdowns...etc. As stated last week via Skool Loop, all relevant dates for Term 4 have been put in the newsletter and specific parents were contacted last week in regard to OT and Nick Bamford sessions. There is obviously a high demand for some support, so we have unfortunately had to do some prioritising. No whole group sessions will be held - support will be individualised to cater for each student as best as we can.

Finally, our Swimming Program begins next week and we look like having 74 students participate which is pleasing. All students participating, can wear their bathers under their uniform during the week before they change back into their uniform after each session. Please let teachers know if any children are being collected from the venue – Aquamoves in Shepparton. The 1st group swimming will generally be Foundation – Grade 2 students, followed by Grade 3-6 students from 1.45pm to 2.30pm. Groups may change throughout the week depending on swimming ability.

Karen will be at school for the rest of the week to attend to any matters that arise. I look forward to seeing some parents throughout the week.

FROM LAST OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES: 12th Sept

Any student or staff member who tests positive to COVID-19 must now isolate for a minimum of 5 instead of 7 days. If they are asymptomatic, they may return to school on day 6. If they are symptomatic, they must remain in isolation until day 7. If they have symptoms after 7 days, they are strongly advised to stay home until their symptoms have resolved.

When well again, Staff/ students can safely return to school. They do not need to be tested if they have been re-exposed within 4 weeks of ending their self-isolation.

Student accident insurance, ambulance cover arrangements and private property brought to school.

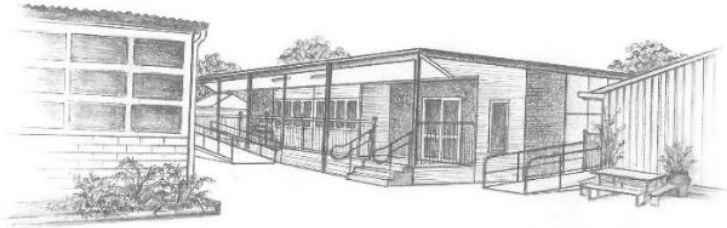

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 16th December 2022. The Parents Club have kindly offered to pay for the bus. As a result, tickets will be \$29 per student and \$29 per parent / guardian. This cost is significantly reduced but no changes in prices will be made to any families choosing to drive down by car. Normal general admission ranges from \$48 to \$55 per person

This can be paid to the office now. Bus arrangements will cater for 1x 57 seats - **Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment.** The Fun Park is open from 10am until 4.30pm, so we anticipate leaving Tallygaroopna PS at about 7.30am and leaving at 4.30pm. We should arrive back at school by about 6.30pm. Alerts regarding arrival will be updated frequently via Skool Loop.

This day is strictly for students of the school and parents / guardians. If families wish to bring other siblings other arrangements will need to be made in regard to travel and entry to Fun Fields – but please consult with the School Principal in regard to this. If anyone is attending but is not part of the School Group – normal gate prices will apply. Students can be supervised by staff on the day if needed as well if parents / guardians are unable to attend – please let us know ASAP.

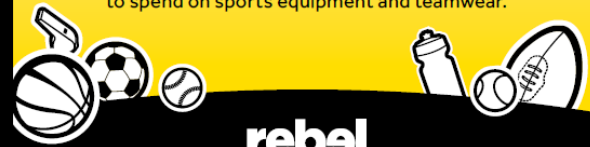

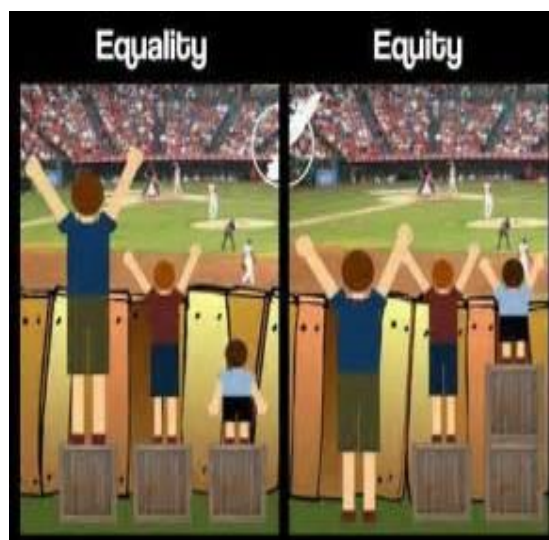

3. Swimming Program

Our Swimming Program is scheduled to be held from Monday 17th October until Friday 21st October (week 3 – term 4). There is no cost for this program for 2022. Generally, this program is of great value considering what it would cost for 5 swimming lessons away from the school environment. This year we will be swimming for 5 consecutive days. All students will swim for 45 minutes each day - there will be 2 specific groups again this year to make the time in the water more effective – these will be from 1pm – 1.45pm and 1.45pm – 2.30pm. We will leave school at 12.20pm and return at approximately 3pm (lunch will be eaten at the normal time of 11.45am).

Students can wear their bathers under the uniform each day to assist with changing before the program begins. All students will be required to change back into their school uniforms at the completion of the program each day.

Group 1 – Foundation, Grade 1, Grade 2 (swimming from 1pm – 1.45pm)

Group 2 – Grade 3, Grade 4, Grade 5, Grade 6 (swimming from 1.45pm – 2.30pm)

There may be some changes in groups depending on ability throughout the program.
