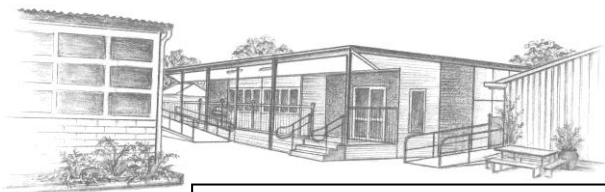
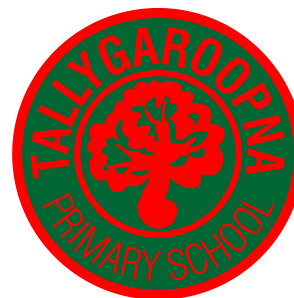

2. Personal Accident Insurance

The Department does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and guardians are responsible for paying the costs of medical treatment for injured students, including ambulance transport. Student accident insurance policies are available from some commercial insurers. In the event of a serious accident we will phone for an ambulance, so please check that your family has cover for such an event.

3. Extreme Heat

We are expecting extremely high temperatures for the coming week. Parents and guardians are reminded that on hot days it is important never to leave children alone in a car. We have an extreme weather timetable to cover these 'HOT' days. Students will remain indoors for some or all of lunch time and will be encouraged to drink lots of water. Please make sure they bring a water bottle to school each day.

4. Collecting students after school

A formal Car Parking policy was endorsed at School Council last year. This policy is attached to this edition of the school newsletter. The parking of cars and other vehicles in and around the school grounds is a daily necessity, but also raises a number of safety and traffic issues that must be well managed. Therefore, at the end of the day, children are only to enter the Car Park once they have been collected by their parents. Children will assemble in the Senior Playground area and be monitored by staff.

The aim of the Car Parking Policy is:

* To ensure that car and vehicle parking in and around the school grounds is orderly, safe and in accordance with the law.

5. Conveyance Allowance

The conveyance allowance is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school. The conveyance allowance is available to eligible students travelling by public transport, private car and private bus. The conveyance allowance is also available to eligible students whose nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus.

The eligibility criteria varies depending on the type of school attended and where it is located. Students attending a government or non-government school must:

- * attend their nearest government or non-government school appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible
- * reside outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary
- * reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school attended
- * be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.

Applications are available from the office and please see Karen if you have any questions. Completed applications need to be returned to the office by 27th February 2015.

10. National Red Balloon Day

This day was chosen as it is close to the last day of Summer. Please fasten a Red Balloon to your front fence or mail box on Friday 27th as a simple gesture to say Thank You. Please find attached to the newsletter a red balloon to fasten to your mailbox or front fence. Children are asked to wear something red to school and a gold coin donation per family which we will pass on to our local fire brigade, Tallygaroopna. In light of recent events we should support our local fire fighters who have worked tirelessly to fight fires in our local community. Please remember to dispose of your balloon properly by putting it in the bin. Thank You.

11. Fosbury Flop Forms – Athletic Sports

Last week, Fosbury flop forms went home for parents to fill out if they are happy for their children to perform this routine (landing on back) when completing the high jump. Over the next few weeks, we will complete a lot of practice with the high jump and are hopeful that the majority of students will be able to perform this routine safely. If students do not bring this form back they will need to perform the scissors routine (landing on feet). If the form is returned, they will have the option of both routines. Athletic cards will be marked indicating which students are allowed to perform the Fosbury flop.



12. Music – Grade 3/4 students

As stated a couple of weeks ago, students in Grades 3 & 4 will need to purchase a recorder from the school for \$10 each. This fee will be added to their school fees so a separate payment is not needed at this stage. Recorders are to be left at school but will obviously be owned by the students. If students have their own recorders it would be appreciated if these are left at school as well in preparation for Music lessons every fortnight.

13. School Fees

This year, school fees remain the same at \$150 for the school year. These fees includes subsidizing school supplies along with many programs which are implemented at school including the MACC Van, MARC Van, Music, Athletics, Reading Eggs, Ziptales, Skoodle, Spelling City, Language Nut etc. This year we are also introducing a \$50 computer levy for each family which will assist with the up keep of our student computers as well. **These fees are due at the beginning of the year and it would be appreciated if they could be paid as soon as possible.** Again, there will be no set Excursion Levy included for the 2015 year. As a result, families will have 2 options – either to pay for excursions throughout the year as they occur or, pay an amount upfront which will be allocated to excursions as they occur. This system allows families to be able to track what excursions are held and paid for.

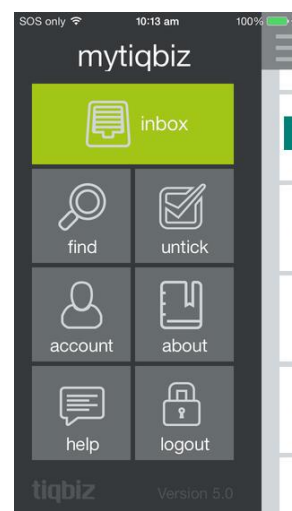

Help your kids manage their asthma

Checklist for Parents



	<p>Does your child have an up to date Asthma Action Plan (Asthma Care Plan)?</p> <p>The Asthma Care/Action Plan tells the school how to manage your child's asthma and what to do if their asthma gets worse. This should be updated & signed by the doctor on an annual basis.</p>
	<p>Does your child carry their reliever puffer and spacer with them at all times? Or is it readily available to their Carers?</p> <p>Medication needs to be available wherever your child may be (school, child care, sporting field, home)</p>
	<p>Are you and your child aware of their asthma triggers?</p> <p>Do you take steps to avoid these triggers? Are the Teachers aware of these triggers?</p>
	<p>Do you listen to what your child says?</p> <p>They will be aware of their asthma symptoms and should be able to tell you when they need their medication.</p>
	<p>Does your child take their asthma medication correctly?</p> <p>Good technique allows more medication to get into the lungs where it is needed. Talk to your doctor or pharmacist if you would like to check your device technique.</p>

Summer storms are becoming more frequent throughout Australia. Thunderstorms can combine heavy rain, high humidity and strong winds. A European study found there are observations in favour of the possibility that thunderstorms disturb ground-level pollen grains, bursting the pollen grains and making the allergens small enough to be inhaled into the lungs. There is also evidence that after rain and during wet conditions there are a larger amount of fungal spores in the air. These can act as a trigger for asthma symptoms.

What can you do?

- Ensure preventer medication is taken as prescribed.
- Have an up to date Asthma Care Plan.
- If your asthma gets worse during thunderstorms try to stay indoors with the windows closed.
- Always carry your reliever medication with you.



Rationale:

- The parking of cars and other vehicles in and around the school grounds is a daily necessity, but also raises a number of safety and traffic issues that must be well managed.

Aims:

- To ensure that car and vehicle parking in and around the school grounds is orderly, safe and in accordance with the law.

Implementation:

- The parking of any vehicle inside the school grounds is at the discretion of the principal.
- The staff car park is for use by staff members only, and may be clearly signposted as such.
- Parents or visitors who park in the staff car park will be reminded of the need to park elsewhere. Habitual offenders will be referred to the local municipal council for prosecution or provided with an official Trespass warning from the principal.
- In return, the visitor's car park and on-street parking will not be used by staff.
- School Council will work with the municipal council to ensure all on-street parking is clearly signposted and School Council will seek cooperation from the local municipal council in ensuring that on-street parking has appropriate time zones applied.
- School Council will encourage frequent visitations from local parking enforcement officers to ensure compliance with parking regulations.
- Staff members will not approach members of the community who are parking inappropriately outside the school grounds.
- No person other than a staff member is to drive a vehicle onto the school grounds without prior approval from the school principal or his / her delegate.
- All school gates may be securely locked out of school hours, with keys sparingly distributed to appropriate people.
- Sufficient disabled car parking will be available and monitored.
- The school may provide a staggered finish to the school day to encourage parents to collect students and leave the car park, making room for the parents of the next group of students to park their cars.
- Parents may drop off children at the walking path in the car park every morning.
- At the end of the day, children are only to enter the Car Park once they have been collected by their parents. Children will assemble in the Senior Playground area and be monitored by staff.
- The school will implement a Walk Safely to School Program each year to encourage children to walk safely to school.
- A Bike Ed program will be implemented to encourage safe bike riding the school.
- Proper and safe parking practices will be regular features of the school newsletter.
- Damage to vehicles parked on school grounds is generally not covered by the Department of Education insurance.

Evaluation:

This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's three-year review cycle and feedback will be sought from the School Community
