13. Student Insurance – Information attached

Parents are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport and any other transport costs.

In some circumstances, medical or other expenses will be paid by the Department where it is assessed that it is likely, in all the circumstances, that the Department is liable for negligent (careless) acts or omissions of its staff/volunteers.

Student accident insurance/ambulance cover policies are available from some commercial insurers, and can be obtained by school councils on a whole-of-school basis, or by parents/guardians for individual students. Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage.

14. Puberty Talks

Senior students in Grades 5/6 will participate in two Puberty Talks with a Sexual Health Nurse (Suzanne Wallis) from GV Health on Monday 20th March and Monday 27th March. Boys and Girls will be separated during these sessions and Mr Brodie and Miss Triffett will accompany each group. The sessions begin at 10.00 and conclude at 12.30pm. The boy's session will begin at 10.00am with the girls program following at 11.30pm. Suzanne Wallis can be contacted by phoning 58323100 regarding the program if needed.

If you would prefer your child to not participate in this program contact the school please. This program is a component of the curriculum in the Victorian Curriculum and is relevant for our current theme on the Human Body / Anatomy. Specific information is provided below:

The Puberty Education information will be delivered over 2 sessions allowing for the opportunity for students to post anonymous questions or issues that they would like answered / addressed in the second session. The sessions are delivered to single gender groups to facilitate student comfort and participation.

- * Viewing of Youtube educational cartoons on Puberty https://www.youtube.com/user/watchwellcast
- * Distribute worksheets re puberty to complete at home and hopefully stimulate conversations with parents

- * Review information delivered in Session 1
- * Answer any questions / concerns / observations
- * Menstruation
- * Pregnancy
- * Be prepared kits (male & female)
- * Where to get further information / resources / advice locally
- * (If time permits touch on body image and media portrayal photo-shop and true images)

15. Maintenance Work

Some plumbing work has been completed relating to bubble taps and the refrigerated water in the project room. We have some major funding which will be completed during the next couple of terms in the BER Building, 3/4 Classroom and Library but no major disruptions will occur during this time.

16. Athletic Sports

The EGPSSA athletic sports have been rescheduled to Tuesday 2nd May at McEwen Reserve, Shepparton (Little Athletics track beside the Sports Stadium). A back up day is planned for Wednesday 17th May. There has obviously been some major upgrades with the track and this has resulted in some delays – more information will be provided at the end of Term 1.

17. GV First Nations Curriculum

Classroom teachers were fortunate to have an after school session with Aunty Faye (Elder) and Erica Bell (KESO – Koorie Education Support Officer) last week which focused on the Importance of Indigenous Culture Inclusion to our Community. Schools in the Shepparton Network have an opportunity to develop awareness and understanding in regard to this and we look forward to developing this over time which will lead into implementation of the GV First Nations Curriculum. All staff will then be conducting activities with an aim to improve education for both Indigenous and non-Indigenous students.

18. Canberra Camp - Grade 5/6

An itinerary for this camp was put on Tiqbiz and also handed to all students last week. This is a wonderful opportunity for our children and we look forward to this adventure in Term 4. Dookie PS will be attending this camp also and families will be kept informed of any more specific details ASAP.

19. Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund Reminder

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) will continue with a term one application process and payment cycle for 2017. This changed timing of the program provides a better alignment with school budgeting and administrative processes and will give families certainty at the beginning of the year regarding CSEF eligibility.

Applications for the CSEF program will open from the commencement of term one, 2017, helping to ensure that all eligible students are able to participate in school trips and sporting activities. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card are eligible to apply. A special consideration category also exists.

A payment of \$125 for eligible primary school students and \$225 for eligible secondary school students will be paid directly to the school to be used towards camps, sports and excursion costs for the benefit of the student. Information went home in envelopes a couple of weeks ago.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. This initiative is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

20. Parent Payments - Policies

In previous years, we have mentioned the price of school fees at the beginning of the year in the first newsletter. We now have all of this information in our Parent Payments policy and an Information Letter which **went home in envelopes** a **couple of weeks ago**. Feel free to contact the office if any clarification is needed. These have been approved at School Council and are summarised below. With the new Education Department Guidelines specific items need to be itemised hence some minor differences between fees for different year levels.

Rationale:

• A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the Dress Code.

Aims:

- To promote equality amongst all students.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with our school.
- To provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation:

- After consultation with the school community and the Student Representative Council, School
 Council has developed a Dress Code that we believe provides choice for the students, allows for
 students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, and caters for the financial
 constraints of families.
- The Dress Code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions. Change to this is subject to the Principals discretion.
- Summer and Winter uniforms, as well as a sports uniform will be prescribed, and are required to be worn.
- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, plus watches are the only acceptable jewellery.
- Extreme hair colors and/or extreme hairstyles are not permitted.
- Enclosed shoes must be worn at school.
- Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn at school.
- The only head wear that is acceptable is Sunsmart hats consistent with our Sunsmart policy. They must be worn outside from September until the end of April. Hats are not to be worn inside.
- From May until the end of August, school beanies and scarves are permitted to be worn outside.
- The Parents Club will accept good quality second hand uniforms, and will operate a second hand uniform store for parents.
- The student Dress Code, including details of uniform items and places of purchase, will be published in the newsletter at the start of each year.
- School Council requires the Principal be responsible for implementation of the Dress Code in a manner consistent with the Student Code of Conduct.
- Parents seeking exemptions to the Dress Code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability, health condition or economic hardship must apply in writing to the principal.

Evaluation:

School Car Parking Policy - Tallygaroopna PS

Rationale:

• The parking of cars and other vehicles in and around the school grounds is a daily necessity, but also raises a number of safety and traffic issues that must be well managed.



Aims:

• To ensure that car and vehicle parking in and around the school grounds is orderly, safe and in accordance with the law.

Implementation:

- The parking of any vehicle inside the school grounds is at the discretion of the principal.
- The staff car park is for use by staff members only, and may be clearly signposted as such.
- Parents or visitors who park in the staff car park will be reminded of the need to park elsewhere. Habitual offenders will be referred to the local municipal council for prosecution or provided with an official Trespass warning from the principal.
- In return, the visitor's car park and on-street parking will not be used by staff.
- School Council will work with the municipal council to ensure all on-street parking is clearly signposted and School Council will seek cooperation from the local municipal council in ensuring that on-street parking has appropriate time zones applied.
- School Council will encourage frequent visitations from local parking enforcement officers to ensure compliance with parking regulations.
- Staff members will not approach members of the community who are parking inappropriately outside the school grounds.
- No person other than a staff member is to drive a vehicle onto the school grounds without prior approval from the school principal or his / her delegate.
- All school gates may be securely locked out of school hours, with keys sparingly distributed to appropriate people.
- Sufficient disabled car parking will be available and monitored.
- The school may provide a staggered finish to the school day to encourage parents to collect students and leave the car park, making room for the parents of the next group of students to park their cars.
- Parents may drop off children at the walking path in the car park every morning.
- At the end of the day, children are only to enter the Car Park once they have been collected by their parents. Children will assemble in the Senior Playground area and be monitored by staff.
- The school will implement a Walk Safely to School Program each year to encourage children to walk safely to school.
- A Bike Ed program will be implemented to encourage safe bike riding the school.
- Proper and safe parking practices will be regular features of the school newsletter.
- Damage to vehicles parked on school grounds is generally not covered by the Department of Education insurance.

Evaluation:

This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's three-year review cycle and feedback will be sought from the School Community
