
This information is **never removed** from the Parent Portal, so you can easily view this information from previous semesters and years.

Whenever your child's school uploads any items to your Parent Portal account, you will be notified by email.


Each parent has their own **unique login**, and your email address that you have previously provided to the school is required to log in.


You can access the Parent Portal in any web browser, on any device, including a desktop or laptop computer, tablet or smartphone (example screenshots below).


#### **CURRICULUM DAY – TERM 1**

#### **CAR PARK SAFETY**

A reminder to all families about using the Car Park safely at the start and end of the school day. Obviously, schools are busy places and if we all follow these guidelines we will have no major incidents. The main points from the School Car Parking Policy are:

- 1. Parents may drop off children at the walking path in the car park every morning.
- 2. At the end of the day, children are only to enter the Car Park once they have been collected by their parents. Children will assemble in the Senior Playground area and be monitored by staff.

#### OSH Care for 2018 – 5 days

This service has continued to build over the last 4 years. In 2014, we were able to provide 72 sessions, in 2015 we had 95 sessions, in 2016 we had 108 sessions and this year we will provide 119 sessions. This service has been provided by Tally PS staff for 4 years and a big thank you to all of our class teachers past and present for allowing this service to be available to our families.

In 2018, we will continue to provide for families and their children. OSH Care will again be available in 2018 on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and we will extend this support to Monday and Tuesday's as well (excluding Public Holidays and Curriculum Days). We are pleased to announce that we have



appointed an OSH Care Coordinator / Educator for 2018 – Leeanne Niblock. We look forward to Leeanne making a valuable contribution to our school and continuing to develop this service for our families from 3.25pm to 6pm. A reminder to all families that a new enrolment form for 2018 must be filled in for any children utilising this service. This form is available at our school office and also on our School Website.

#### 1. Information Evening

An Information and Meet the Teachers evening will be held at school on Tuesday, 13th February from 6pm - 8pm. Teacher Information Sessions will begin at 6pm (F/1), 6.30pm (1/2), 7.30pm (3/4) and 7.00pm (5/6). We are expecting each session to go for approximately 30 minutes and some information will be sent home with families. All families are encouraged to come along to this night and we are trialling 4 separate times, so that there are no clashes with different grades.

#### 2. Student Insurance - from DET

Parents are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport and any other transport costs.

In some circumstances, medical or other expenses will be paid by the Department where it is assessed that it is likely, in all the circumstances, that the Department is liable for negligent (careless) acts or omissions of its staff/volunteers. Student accident insurance/ambulance cover policies are available from some commercial insurers, and can be obtained by school councils on a whole-of-school basis, or by parents/guardians for individual students. Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage.

#### 3. Men's Shed Visits

We will soon begin some fortnightly visits to the Men's Shed which is situated just behind the Kindergarten which is across the road from school. Mr Brodie will be taking small groups over from 9am until 10am and students will do small jobs with members of the Men's Shed and participate in an informal morning tea. This initiative links beautifully to our Kidsmatter approach which focuses on interacting with the local community. There is no cost to participate in this program and no permission forms will be sent home – this is covered in local excursions on the Green Student Information Sheet. If you would prefer for your child to not participate – contact the office ASAP please. All students will have 1 visit to the Men's Shed throughout the year.

#### 4. Random Acts of Kindness

These began last week and well done to James, Sienna and Jimmy who were responsible for doing the first Random Act of Kindness for the year. This initiative involves 3 students being picked out of the Givers box randomly and then selecting 3 random students out of the Receivers box. This is completed at the beginning of each school week with the hope of students completing their Random Act before the end of the week. These could be simple things and making something special – ie: card, biscuit, cake, bookmark...etc. Some students choose to do an act, which involves money, but we do not encourage this. However, it is up to each student to come up with a unique act of kindness – it is always the thought that counts. This week's givers of Random Acts of Kindness are – Heather, Jake & Nicholas.

#### 5. Red Balloon Day / Casual Day

Our whole school will be involved in a fun Wear Red Day on Tuesday 27th February (DATE CHANGE – to involve Foundation students). The students will make some posters and pictures to recognise the contribution of our CFA Fire Fighters and we may be fortunate to have a Fire Truck Visit to school from 11.30am until 1pm as well. The Parents Club will assist with some balloons on the fence and any students wearing red (Casual Day) are asked to contribute a Gold Coin Donation (per family).

#### 6. Late Pick Up - OSH Care

No child is to remain in the program after 6:00pm. If parents suspect that they will be late, they must contact one of the approved, alternate people nominated on their child's enrolment form and have them collect their child before 6:00pm.

#### A penalty fee of \$5 per 10 minutes per child will apply if children are not collected by 6:00pm.

When a child is left in the program after 6:00pm, the Coordinator shall take the following action:

- ring parents/guardians
- ring emergency contacts

If no contact can be made to either of the above, then a member of the OSHC Committee shall be notified to attend the OSHC Program. If contact cannot be made to parents/guardians or emergency contacts after 1 hour of closure, police shall be called. A notice shall be left on the door of the Program notifying where the child has been taken and/or who the parent needs to contact.

#### 7. Cluster Aquamoves Day

This is scheduled for Friday 9th March. The Aquamoves activities will be free play in the Olympic pool, wading pool and splash park – strict supervision for Junior students. The Rapid River, Tarzan rope and slide will be in operation from 11:00am to 1:00pm. All parents are encouraged to apply sun cream before arriving at school, but this will be applied and re-applied at Aquamoves by staff. Some parental assistance with this would be appreciated because this is very time consuming. We will leave school by bus at 9.45am at the latest and assemble at Aquamoves at 10am for an introduction to the day and provide further information to students and teachers as to how the day will unfold. The day will finish up at around 2:00 -2:30pm. Permission forms will go home soon and cost will be advertised shortly. Permission forms will need to be returned per student ASAP.

## No students are to buy things from the canteen and parents are discouraged from buying things for their children from the canteen.

#### 8. Student Support Services

This year, the Education Department is providing SSS support on an ongoing basis (initially every fortnight – subject to change and demand) and your child may be able to benefit from some of these services provided. Last year, this mainly focused on Speech Therapy but other support may involve:

- Psychologists and guidance officers
- Speech pathologists
- Social workers
- Visiting teachers
- Other allied health professionals.

It is imperative that the attached Student Support Services Privacy Information and Consent Form is returned so that support can be given if needed. Feel free to ring me to discuss if needed.

#### 9. Primary School Nursing Program

The Primary School Nursing Program accepts referrals for children in grades 1 - 6, children attending English Language Centre Schools and primary school-aged children who have recently arrived in Australia from overseas. If you or your child's teacher has concerns about your child's health or development, your child can be referred to the School nurse at any time using a referral form. Any queries - don't hesitate to contact the school.

Direct health assessment services provided under the Primary School Nursing Program may include:

- Vision screening
- Hearing screening
- Mouth check
- · Speech and language screening
- General developmental assessments

#### 10. Athletic Sports - Fosbury Flop Consent Forms

The Fosbury Flop technique with High Jump is appropriate if the teacher/instructor is experienced in this technique and if students have had instructions in, and lead up activities on the run up, take off, flight and landing phases of the jump.

Children will need parental permission to use this technique. Schools should issue permission notes prior to the sports. Due to the regulations with regard to high jump, we are seeking your permission to allow or not allow your child to perform the Fosbury Flop technique of high jumping. We ask that you only grant permission if you know that your child is proficient at the skills needed. Eg. learnt at little athletics **OR during P.E. lessons with Mrs Montgomery**. A permission form will go home this week in regard to this.

#### 11. Student Information - URGENT

Two weeks ago, a student information sheet went home for approval by families – to be filled out, signed and returned. These forms are essential for the general operation of the school and it would be appreciated if these are returned by this Friday please. This form enables families to give consent to a number of items at Tallygaroopna PS. A summary of the forms is below:

- Parent Payment Charges fill out and return
- Child Safe Code of Conduct (renewed annually)

   Please sign if assisting with any school activities this year reading, breakfast club, munch n crunch, fundraising...etc
- Green Confidential Student Information Details & Consent Form fill out and return
- Asthma Action Plans from relevant families

#### 12. Student Headphones

In past years, many students have supplied their own headphones to use at school. We are encouraging this again in 2018, so that these can be used daily by students with a variety of ICT programs which are utilised at school. Obviously, there may be some families who may not be able to supply these, so the school will supply some basic ones for students to use at cost of \$5 per headphone— this will occur next week. Good quality headphones cost about \$10 whereas the basic ones which are supplied at school are only about \$5 — not as durable obviously (please see Parent Payment Charges letter).

#### 13. School Bus Safety

Thanks to all families who returned information about the School Bus for 2018 before school began. It is imperative that families who have children who are bus travellers contact the school if their children are not going on the bus in the afternoon (before 3pm). Mr Brodie will be the school contact for buses in the morning and afternoon and parents will need to make contact with him using either notes or phoning the school. Alternatively, parents can text message Mr Brodie on 0411 960 164 if they cannot contact the school directly – please do this first.

#### 14. English Online Interview

The English Online Interview is a powerful online tool for assessing the English skills of students in Years Foundation to Grade 2 in Victorian government schools. The Interview assesses students across the three dimensions of the English domain of the Victorian Essential Learning Standards (VELS) – Reading, Writing and Speaking and Listening. Teachers will be conducting these tests over the next few weeks. #### 15. Parents Club / Meeting - AGM

New and existing parents are always welcome to join this club which constantly supports the school. Last year some great fundraising occurred and the school was able to utilise some funds to go towards school programs and excursions, which was greatly appreciated.

The next Parents Club meeting will be held on Monday 5th March 2018 straight after school. All are welcome and we look forward to seeing some new families help out with this great school community group. We are also looking for new and exciting ideas.

#### 16. School Council / Dates for 2018

#### 17. Payment Envelopes

Specially printed envelopes will be sent home with the students this week. When sending money to school, please seal it in the envelope, fill out the details on the front of the envelope and post it in the locked box inside the office door.

#### 18. Absence Notes

Could the attached form be used for Absences please. The other alternative is to do an absence on Flexibuzz. Both of these are the preferred methods because they are completed immediately. If either of these are not convenient - please ring the school. Formal notes are needed for audit records and your support would be appreciated. We would prefer no text messages.

What happens if absences continue – 7 days a term turns into 28 days a year, which turns into 196 days over 7 years. This results in a child missing 1 whole year of their Primary School years – something for all of us to think about.

#### 19. School Fees

All School Fee information is summarised in our Parent Payment Charges letter which have gone home. Feel free to contact the office if any clarification is needed. The Essential Education Items have been approved at School Council and are summarised below. With the new Education Department Guidelines specific items need to be itemised hence some minor differences between fees for different year levels. #### 21. Music – Grade 2/3/4 students

We are looking forward to our Music program continuing in 2018 with Mrs McQuilton. Students in Grades 2, 3 & 4 will need to purchase a recorder from the school for \$10 each if they don't already have one. Payment for this will need to be added to their school fees if required. Recorders are to be left at school but will obviously be owned by the students. Foundation and Grade 1 students will focus on percussion instruments, which the school already has. Grade 5 and 6 students will utilise ukuleles which the school has as well. Students will need their own recorder because of hygiene reasons. Music with recorder will begin on Friday 23rd February. Please let the school know ASAP if you can supply your own recorder as an alternative.

#### 22. Foundation Students Information (Preps)

Throughout the months of January / February, children in Foundation WILL NOT attend school on Wednesdays. They will remain at home on 31<sup>st</sup> January, 7th, 14<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of February. There may be some Wednesday's where Mr Flood may require your child to attend a certain time for specific testing, but he will inform parents of this if there is a need. We will continue to implement a whole school buddy program on Monday afternoons, once every fortnight. The first full week for Foundation students will begin on Monday 5th March – extra days can be negotiated if needed.

#### 23. Medicine at School

For those students required to have medication whilst at school, a Medication Request Form is required to be filled out, signed and returned to the school office prior to the student being administered medication. Further copies are available at the Office. This does not apply to children with asthma with their puffer, although the office must be informed of the child's needs in this regard. Any change to the child's medical condition should be relayed to the office ASAP.

#### 24. Playgroup Dates

This program will again be coordinated by John Hosking (Welfare Worker) in 2018. Community members are invited to drop in with their little ones and have a tea / coffee and a chat. Playgroup is every fortnight and begins at 9am and concludes at 11am. Specific dates for the next few weeks are: 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb, 8<sup>th</sup> March, 22<sup>nd</sup> March. These are all open to change.

#### **Second-hand Uniforms**

If anyone has any uniforms that they no longer require could you please send them along to school.



#### **Rationale:**

• A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the Dress Code.

#### Aims:

- To promote equality amongst all students.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with our school.
- To provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

#### **Implementation:**

- After consultation with the school community and the Student Representative Council, School
  Council has developed a Dress Code that we believe provides choice for the students, allows for
  students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, and caters for the financial
  constraints of families.
- The Dress Code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions. Change to this is subject to the Principals discretion.
- Summer and Winter uniforms, as well as a sports uniform will be prescribed, and are required to be worn.
- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, plus watches are the only acceptable jewellery.
- Extreme hair colors and/or extreme hairstyles are not permitted.
- Enclosed shoes must be worn at school.
- Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn at school.
- The only head wear that is acceptable is Sunsmart hats consistent with our Sunsmart policy. They must be worn outside from September until the end of April. Hats are not to be worn inside.
- From May until the end of August, school beanies and scarves are permitted to be worn outside.
- The Parents Club will accept good quality second hand uniforms, and will operate a second hand uniform store for parents.
- The student Dress Code, including details of uniform items and places of purchase, will be published in the newsletter at the start of each year.
- School Council requires the Principal be responsible for implementation of the Dress Code in a manner consistent with the Student Code of Conduct.
- Parents seeking exemptions to the Dress Code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability, health condition or economic hardship must apply in writing to the principal.

#### **Evaluation:**

- This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's three year review cycle and feedback will be sought from the School Community.
- This policy was updated and endorsed by School Council on Wed 17<sup>th</sup> Feb 2016.
- These policies will be implemented in accordance with our **Student Engagement Policy.**

#### School Car Parking Policy - Tallygaroopna PS

#### **Rationale:**

• The parking of cars and other vehicles in and around the school grounds is a daily necessity, but also raises a number of safety and traffic issues that must be well managed.



#### Aims:

 To ensure that car and vehicle parking in and around the school grounds is orderly, safe and in accordance with the law.

#### Implementation:

- The parking of any vehicle inside the school grounds is at the discretion of the principal.
- The staff car park is for use by staff members only, and may be clearly signposted as such.
- Parents or visitors who park in the staff car park will be reminded of the need to park elsewhere. Habitual offenders will be referred to the local municipal council for prosecution or provided with an official Trespass warning from the principal.
- In return, the visitor's car park and on-street parking will not be used by staff.
- School Council will work with the municipal council to ensure all on-street parking is clearly signposted and School Council will seek cooperation from the local municipal council in ensuring that on-street parking has appropriate time zones applied.
- School Council may encourage frequent visitations from local parking enforcement officers to ensure compliance with parking regulations.
- Staff members will not approach members of the community who are parking inappropriately outside the school grounds.
- No person other than a staff member is to drive a vehicle onto the school grounds without prior approval from the school principal or his / her delegate.
- All school gates may be securely locked out of school hours, with keys sparingly distributed to appropriate people.
- Disabled car parking will be investigated and implemented if required.
- The school may provide a staggered finish to the school day to encourage parents to collect students and leave the car park, making room for the parents of the next group of students to park their cars.
- Parents may drop off children at the walking path in the car park every morning.
- At the end of the day, children are only to enter the Car Park once they have been collected by their parents. Children will assemble in the Senior Playground area and be monitored by staff.
- The school will implement a Walk Safely to School Program each year to encourage children to walk safely to school.
- A Bike Ed program will be implemented to encourage safe bike riding to school.
- Proper and safe parking practices may be regular features of the school newsletter.
- Damage to vehicles parked on school grounds is not covered by DET insurance.

#### **Evaluation:**

This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's three-year review cycle and feedback will be sought from the School Community

This policy was endorsed by School Council on Wed 14th June 2017.
