#### News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone

We have had a fantastic beginning to the school year. All students have settled into normal class activities extremely well and are getting accustomed to new teachers for 2021. It has been wonderful to see some parents come into the school again so far despite restrictions in line with COVID-19. Please remember that only one family can be in the office at one time and pre-arranged meetings must be organised with classroom teachers. Facemasks are also mandated in all public indoor spaces which would include such areas as: the office, classrooms and the project space where assemblies are held. Fingers crossed these things are lifted again in the not too distant future!

A reminder that our Child Safe Code of Conduct will need to be signed for any volunteers who are actively involved. We are currently updating our register for all members of the school community.

Please don't hesitate to contact me if you need any help with the Parent Portal for Grade Expert or Skool Loop as it would be great to get all families connected to both of these ASAP. Hopefully, new families have received an email about the Parent Portal – this is where reports are kept along with other items such as Student of the Week awards. We have 57 families at our school with an enrolment of 80 students currently – almost everyone is on Class Dojo which is encouraging as well.

This week, staff will be putting the finishing touches to Information Night presentations which will be recorded and made available via Class Dojo for families to watch in the comfort of their own homes. This new method will also enable more families to receive this information as we are constantly aware of the busy lives that we all have. These presentations are an important aspect of the link between home and school and we hope many families can view these and hear about specific information in regard to how individual classrooms will operate.

You will probably notice that this edition of the newsletter is much smaller than the 1st one for the year. I encourage all families to keep referring back to the 1st newsletter if needed if you have forgotten something in regard to the return to school for the 2021 year. These are accessible on our school website which is constantly being updated throughout the year.

Finally, our school has committed to some professional learning again with all our staff, to complement the new approach to reading that we are implementing in 2021. 

#### Key Changes to COVID-19 Operational Guidelines from DET

COVID safe guidelines & school processes (to assist with contact tracing if needed)

Masks will be mandatory in public indoor spaces (ie: office, classrooms, assemblies). If you have visitors in your home, it is strongly recommended that masks are worn during the visit. Masks must be worn in indoor public spaces apart from when eating or drinking

Welcome back to a new school year. As you may be aware, the Department of Education & Training have COVID safe guidelines for schools, which they regularly update. We will always try and keep you informed of any changes via our Skool Loop app - which we encourage all families to join ASAP. We are all very glad to know that we can welcome parents, grandparents and visitors into school again! We have certainly missed you. However, there are still some extra regulations that we must all adhere to, to keep us all safe.

- Students can arrive at school from 8:30am each day. The bell to come into class is at 8.45am. Hand washing occurs at 8.45am.
- Students can be dropped off at the front of the school or via the car park if dropping and going. Please be aware of the school bus if using the car park.
- At the end of the day there will be no staggered finish time or walking out of classes by staff. Parents/carers can arrange to meet their child in the grounds, at the gates or at their car. Please confirm with your child, where you will be picking them up at 3:25pm.
- We are maintaining an enhanced cleaning schedule at school, with all high touch areas being cleaned.
- Students will still be washing their hands at the start of the day and at the end of morning and afternoon recess
- Drink bottles are still strongly encouraged, but there are bubble taps available along with water in the project space to fill drink bottles.
- Remember that we all need to stay home if unwell- students and staff- and get tested
  if we have any COVID symptoms.

Parents/carers can come into the school grounds, but with restrictions that help to keep us all safe:

- Face masks must be carried at all times.
- Face masks are recommended when 1.5 metres physical distancing cannot be maintained.
- There are limits on the number of visitors that can be inside the buildings at any time, so visits to classrooms are discouraged and must be pre-arranged.
- When visiting the Office only one visitor (family) may be in the Office at a time.
- Where possible, continue to communicate via email, our Skool Loop app or by phone.
   Class teachers can be contacted via Class Dojo info will go home soon.
- Parents who choose to drop their children off within the school grounds are asked to do so outside the classrooms.
- If there is a chance that a parent or visitor will remain within the school grounds for longer than 15 minutes, they must sign it at the office. An alternative is to use the QR codes that are displayed around the school. All visitors are encouraged to sign in when visiting and wear a visitor badge which can be collected at the office.



#### 1. Code Red Days

I am informing the school community of the recent changes to the Department of Education and Training's (the Department) Code Red day pre-emptive closures policy and procedures. The Department has refined the Code Red Policy to pre-emptively close Category 4 education facilities at risk of bushfire or grassfire in a weather district determined to be Code Red by the Emergency Management Commissioner. The Department also intends to cancel all school buses traversing Code Red weather districts on these occasions.

Our school, according to The Department's School Bushfire Risk Assessment Methodology, is listed as a Category 4 school. This rating means that on a determined Code Red day our school will now be required to pre-emptively close on Code Red days.

#### What will happened on a Code Red day.

- Decision to determine Code Red day will be made by the EMC by 1pm the day before.
- This determination will be communicated to the Regional Director and then to schools.
- Schools will then undertake the closure procedures and notify the Region when complete and/or work to resolve any issues.
- Communication will occur via text messaging by the Principal with a confirmation message to be sent back.
- The Principal will be at site from 8.30am -9.15am to ensure that anyone who has not confirmed will not be at school on this day.

#### 2. Prep (Foundation) Photos

This will be held on this Thursday 11th February at 12.10pm. It would be great to have all of our new Foundation students at school on this day for this formal photo, which will be published in the Shepparton News. If you would prefer for your child to not be in this photo contact the school ASAP please.

#### 3. Bravehearts

Students in Grades F-2 will be participating in a Bravehearts Personal Safety Show on Tuesday 4th March at midday in the Computer Lab / Library. The purpose of 'Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure Show' is to teach children protective behaviours in a non-confrontational, fun and engaging fashion. Bravehearts' Education teams deliver the show's messages into schools, day care centres, shopping centres, sporting clubs and other facilities (relating to the care of children) to provide students, parents, teachers, carers and the general community with specialised child sexual assault awareness and education.

'Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure' Education Program aims to continue communicating essential personal safety messages and works tirelessly to reach children across Australia. Since reaching the 200,000 safer kids milestone in March 2012, the amount of children that have seen Ditto continues to grow.

The show's main contents address:

\* Yes and No Feelings

- \* Warning Signs
- \* Scared and Yucky Feelings

- \* Private Parts and Privacy
- \* What to do if you feel unsafe or unsure

## No permission forms will be sent home for this show - please contact the office if you would prefer your children to not participate in this performance.

\* It's OK to say NO if you don't feel safe

#### 4. Aguamoves Day

We are looking into a whole school excursion if possible at Aguamoves on Tuesday 23rd February. We hope this date will be confirmed ASAP - more details to follow. The Aguamoves activities will be free play in the olympic pool, wading pool and splash park – strict supervision for junior students. Some inside activities may be available: The water slide and tarzan rope. All parents are encouraged to apply sun cream to students before arriving at school, but this will be applied and re-applied at Aquamoves by school staff. Some parental assistance with this would be appreciated because this is very time consuming and parents are welcome to attend to assist with supervision. We would leave school by bus at 9.45am at the latest and assemble at Aquamoves at 10am for an introduction to the day and provide further information to students and teachers as to how the day will unfold. The day will finish up at around 2:00 -2:30pm. Permission forms will need to be returned ASAP.

#### 6. School Council

There are a couple of openings with school council this year, with a couple of membership terms expiring. If you would like to be part of school council for 2021 an expression of interest needs to be made to the Principal by Friday 12<sup>th</sup> February. If there is interest with this, we may need to conduct some elections.

#### 7. Fosbury Flop Forms

The Fosbury Flop technique with high jump is appropriate if the teacher/instructor is experienced in this technique and if students have had instructions in, and lead up activities on the run up, take off, flight and landing phases of the jump.

Children will need parental permission to use this technique. Schools should issue permission notes prior to the sports. Due to the regulations with regard to high jump, we are seeking your permission to allow or not allow your child to perform the Fosbury Flop technique of high jumping. We ask that you only grant permission if you know that your child is proficient at the skills needed. Eg. learnt at little athletics **OR during P.E. lessons with Mrs Montgomery**. A permission form has been sent home in regard to this and we ask that parents sign this if possible as this technique will be carefully monitored and safety will be paramount (students landing on their back).

#### 8. Production

We have started working on our school production which will be held in Term 3 this year. As you could appreciate, a lot of time and effort goes into this program and we look forward to our students leading from the front again. Some auditions took place last week and the cast will be announced in the next couple of weeks. We ask that all students and their families accept any position that they are given and do their best with this opportunity.

The cast list with speaking parts and the props list is published in this newsletter – if you can assist with any of this let us know please.

#### 9. Professional Practice Days

In the Education State, we achieve excellence by consistently focusing on improving the achievements of learners across Victoria, whether it is through improving the quality of educational services or changing the way we teach. The most important thing we can do to improve student outcomes is to develop and improve the skills of our teachers.

The Victorian Government will continue to provide opportunities to develop professional, passionate teachers and principals and equip them with the right knowledge and skills to meet the needs of their students. To ensure we support the learning and development of not only our students, but our teachers too; we are committed to providing professional development opportunities for our teacher workforce. Teachers will spend four days per year further developing their skills in areas that are aligned to the school priorities. Students will directly benefit from these improvements in their daily learning.

Casual Relief Teachers will be provided on any of these days.

The professional practice days are part of the Victorian Government Schools Agreement 2017. Each full time teacher is entitled to one day per term (four days per year), to focus on the improved delivery of high quality teaching and learning. We know children sometimes find it challenging when their teacher is away from the classroom. Equally, it's important that teachers take the time to focus on improving their professional practice because their learning directly impacts on your child's learning experience. There is a learning plan in place to ensure that your child's education continues as usual. We are scheduling the days ahead of time and have planned the day so that there is minimal impact.

#### 10. Student Headphones

In past years, students have supplied their own headphones to use at school. We are encouraging this again in 2021 for students in Grades 1 to 6 so that these can be used daily by students with a variety of ICT programs utilised at school. All Foundation students will be supplied with a particular type of headphone. This is part of the Foundation school fee.

#### 11. Personal Property

Personal property is often brought to school by students, staff and visitors. This can include mobile phones, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises. The Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to school property. Therefore, staff, students, parents and guardians should be discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school.

12. School Payments - When making payment to the school bank account for multiple items, please make one direct deposit for the total amount with your family name listed and email the school a message detailing the breakdown of the payment.

#### 13. Teacher Professional Learning

#### 17. Accident Insurance - reminder

Our school does not have an accident insurance policy to cover student injuries or ambulance transport. A reminder to parents and guardians that they are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment and ambulance attendance/transport. We recommend all families arrange ambulance cover in case of emergency. There are also a variety of commercial insurance policies available that would cover accidents at school.

#### 18. Conveyance

The Conveyance Allowance Program (CAP) is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school or campus.

Depending on how a student travels to school, an eligible student may be granted a conveyance allowance based on:

- the least expensive public transport fares and/or
- a distance based allowance when travel is by private car or private bus.

Parents applying for the allowance are required to complete an application form – contact Karen if needed.

#### 19. Music - Grade 3/4 students

We are looking forward to our Music program continuing in 2021 with Mrs Tucker. Students in Grades 3 & 4 will need to purchase a recorder from the school for \$15 each if they don't already have one. Payment for this will need to be added to their school fees if required. Recorders are to be left at school but will obviously be owned by the students. Foundation, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students will focus on percussion instruments, which the school already has. Grade 5 and 6 students will utilise ukuleles which the school has as well. Students will need their own recorder because of hygiene reasons. Music will begin on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> February. Please let the school know ASAP if you can supply your own recorder as an alternative.

#### 20. Foundation Student Information

Throughout February children in Foundation WILL NOT attend school on Wednesdays. They will remain at home on 10<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of February. There may be some Wednesdays where Mrs Haberfield may require your child to attend a certain time for specific testing, but she will inform parents of this if there is a need.

The first full week for Foundation students will begin on Monday 1st March – extra days can be negotiated if needed.

#### 22. Medicine at School

For those students required to have medication whilst at school, a Medication Request form is required to be filled out, signed and returned to the school office prior to the student being administered medication. Further copies are available at the office. This does not apply to children with asthma with their puffer, although the office must be informed of the child's needs in this regard. Any change to the child's medical condition should be relayed to the office ASAP.

#### 23. Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families. Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 5829 8264 and ask for an application form. You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.
