The camp promises to be a great experience and there is the chance of warmer weather later on in the week which is encouraging. I know that all the students attending will adapt to the learning environment well and challenge themselves with specific activities which are planned.

I got an interesting phone call last week about our Building Project. Work on this will start at the beginning of November and we are extremely excited about the prospect of starting the New Year in a brand new, modern building. Details about this are in this edition of the newsletter and we will endeavour to make the rest of 2010 as normal as possible for everyone from our school community – students, parents and teaching staff.

There is no Bike Education this week, because of the Grade 5/6 camp. This program will begin again next week on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> October and we are hopeful of more suitable weather, compared to what we had last week. A reminder also about the Public Speaking Competition. Please encourage your children to have a go with this, because it would be a great experience going through this process. We hope to know who will represent our school by the end of October.

I will have an opportunity to catch up on some administration work this week, but I will be teaching the students from Prep – Grade 4 on Wednesday until lunchtime. Karen will be away on Monday and Tuesday at eduPay training, but I can assist parents with any specific matters at this time. Karen and I have an Occupational Health and Safety Inspection on Thursday morning until lunchtime.

#### 1. Building Project Update

Our new school building will be up for all to see before the end of the year. There are a number of plans which we have in place to make this project run smoothly. These can be summarised below.

- \* Staff will be meeting with Furniture Companies on Monday and Tuesday this week to organise an order for the building. This will cater for the 3 new classrooms and the Project Room which will be the main entry point into the new building. We have received extra funding to accommodate this.
- \* Next week (beginning Monday 18th October), we will be moving all furniture and equipment out of the vacant Portables. There are two of these and a lot of work will be completed on Thursday afternoon.
- \* In week 4 (beginning Monday 25<sup>th</sup> October), we will be moving all furniture and equipment out of the Grade 5/6 Portable and the Sportshed. A lot of work again will occur on the Thursday. Assistance is needed, so if anyone can assist with this contact the office ASAP.
- \* Students in Grades 5/6 will have a classroom set up in the Multi Purpose room until the end of the year. The students will be in this building from Monday 1st November.
- \* Three Portables and the Sportshed will be removed from the Building Site. We hope this work will commence on Monday 1st November, but it may start on the Wednesday after Melbourne Cup Public Holiday.
- \* The Building Site will be prepared by Grove our builders. This is anticipated for Tuesday 9th November.
- \* The Building arrives at school on Tuesday 16th November
- \* The Building is scheduled to be finished on Tuesday 21st December.

Although the time line for this project is short, we are very positive about this and we are sure that the whole school community will be as well. However, some of the time lines mentioned above may change so please be patient and tolerant over the next couple of months. If we all model this behaviour, I am sure the children at school will cope with the alterations fine. January next year, will be a busy time as we get the building ready for the beginning of the new school year.

#### 3. Melbourne Excursion

Plans have begun for our end of year school excursion. I am endeavouring to make this trip a special one, so we are looking at going to the Melbourne Zoo by train on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> November. Please keep this date in mind, because we are hopeful of inviting all parents if they wish to attend, to make this day a special one with your children at school. Details about the trip are as follows:

- \* Leave Shepparton Train Station at 6.57am and return at 6.33pm.
- \* Train tickets for students, teachers and parents are \$17.60.
- \* Melbourne Zoo Ticket Prices: Students \$12.10, Adults \$18.50

This excursion will be discussed at School Council and more details will be available in the next few weeks.

## 4. Public Speaking Competition

Our school is entering in a Public Speaking Competition for students from Grades 3 - 6. This is being organised by the Tallygaroopna Lions Club and is a great opportunity for some of our students to extend themselves in regard to Oral Language. Nine local primary schools have been invited to participate in this competition and I would encourage all students in these grades to have a go at this, especially any students who may have a leadership role at school (ie: School Captains, Junior School Council). This program is voluntary, but students wishing to enter this competition can get assistance from home. Details about the competition are listed below:

School Competitions – need to be finalised by the end of October.

- Only two students can represent each school 1 for each category (Grade 3/4 and Grade 5/6)
- Topics are (5 Minute Maximum) 30 second warning bell.
  - o Grade 3/4 Which place in the world would you love to visit and why?
  - Grade 5/6 Why is Australia such a lucky country?
- Schools to use their own initiative in regard to how they go about this marking, judging.
- School certificates will be awarded for any students prepared to have a go with this.

#### **Finals**

- Venue: Tallygaroopna Community Centre ( to be confirmed)
- Date: Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> November
- Time: 6pm to 9pm (Grade 3/4: 6pm 7.30pm, Grade 5/6: 7.30pm 9pm)
- Supper may be provided at the end of the night tea & coffee
- 9 Presenters for each category (Grade 3/4 and Grade 5/6)
- The same format and topics would be presented.
- Students to be judged by independent panel selected from the Lions Club Rubric utilised
- At the completion of each Category a spontaneous question is given to students.
  - They will have 10 minutes to prepare a 2 minute speech.
- All participants to receive certificates
- Winners to receive awards organised by the Lions Club book vouchers and perpetual shields have been mentioned.

#### 5. School Production Organisation

Things are moving along well for the School Production. We have organised sound and lighting for the night so the students are starting to get really excited and beginning to realise that the night is only a few sleeps away. On Tuesday 26th October, staff will be setting up the hall after school so if you can assist in any way contact the office. The whole school will be down the hall most of Wednesday 27th October, preparing for the night. We ask that parents don't come down to the hall on this day, so that the night is full of surprises for families who come along to witness the school concert.

#### 6. Outstanding School Fees

#### 7. Melbourne Cup Public Holiday

Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November is a public holiday across the State of Victoria because of the Melbourne Cup. The school will be closed on this day and no students will be required at school.

#### 8. Orrvale Primary School Visit

Next Wednesday morning, Mrs Haberfield and Mrs Wallace have an opportunity to go to Orrvale PS to observe some of the literacy and numeracy programs which are implemented at this school. They will also have an opportunity to observe some of the teaching approaches which are used by staff and we are hopeful that some of these techniques may be implemented at our school in the future. Our new building plan should enable us to do this with all the classrooms being in close proximity. I will be supporting them both on this day, by teaching the Prep - Grade 4 students until lunch time.

#### 9. Ultranet

At our school, we have started to implement the Ultranet, the Victorian Government's new online learning environment. The Ultranet is a state-wide, secure site that teachers, parents/guardians and students can access via the internet. It provides a new learning space for our students and teachers and, importantly, as a parent or guardian, it will allow you to access up-to-date and meaningful information about your child's learning at school.

Over the past few weeks, our teachers have been learning to use the Ultranet. We are creating some interesting and exciting ways to use and learn in this online environment and we're almost ready for our students and parents to log in and start using it.

The timeline for bringing students and parents onto the Ultranet is:

- Students in Years P-6 will be progressively brought on from Monday 1st November 2010
- Parents of students in Years P-6 will be invited to register for the Ultranet on Monday 8th November 2010.
- A Parent Information Night is planned for perhaps early 2011.

As implementation progresses, our students and teachers will start working together in the Ultranet using online tools such as wikis, blogs and discussion forums. Your child will use the Ultranet to create their own online learning portfolio and take part in online learning activities. You'll be able to see this information to help keep up to date with your child's progress. Our teachers will also use the Ultranet to access and share valuable teaching resources across Victoria.

Initially we will focus on student learning goals and portfolios and create our school community page. This will start in 2011. This means when you first log into the Ultranet you will be able to see the following information about your child and our school:

- Your child's attendance data
- Your child's learning goals
- Your child's learning tasks
- Your child's portfolio of digital work
- Our school community page and other general pages
- Our school newsletter
- Our school calendar of events for 2011.

Overtime, we will build up information in the Ultranet, creating an ongoing record of learning progress for your child. These records will travel with your child from year to year and school to school (within the Victorian government school system).

In the coming weeks, all families will receive a booklet outlining the main features of the Ultranet for parents, how to access the Ultranet, privacy for you and your child, safe and responsible use of the Ultranet, and where to go for additional resources or support. An extended version of this booklet will be available online from the end of October via <a href="https://www.education.vic.gov.au/ultranet">www.education.vic.gov.au/ultranet</a>. This will include step-by-step instructions and video tutorials on how to register for and use the Ultranet, how to manage your account and a glossary of terms and frequently asked questions.

## Accessing the Ultranet

In December, we will send you a Welcome Letter inviting you to register for and log into the Ultranet. Please keep the enclosed copy of *The Ultranet: An introduction for parents* to assist you to register at this time.

#### 10. Cricket Clinics - Milo / Kanga 8's

The students in Prep – Grade 4 had an enjoyable Milo Cricket Clinic last week. I am sure some of these children have already registered for the Milo Cricket Program which is available out of school hours. On Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October students in Grades 4-6 will participate in a Kanga 8's Clinic from 2-3pm. This is in preparation for the Kanga 8's Tournament which will be held in Shepparton on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> September at the McEwen Reserve in Shepparton. More details will be available soon – Mrs Sidebottom will be attending this day.

# 11. Student Scholarships for 2011

The Department of Education and Early Childhood Development administers 30 different student scholarship categories for this round which equates to approximately 175 scholarship awards (as some scholarships have more than one award). For scholarships that the Department administers, a student must apply for a scholarship at the same year level that they are studying in 2010, e.g. a student in Year 8 in 2010 would apply for a Year 8 scholarship. Scholarships for students at relevant 2010 year levels will be granted and paid early in 2011. The scholarships are offered to primary, secondary and tertiary students and range in value from \$250 to over \$2,000.

They are generally awarded to students who:

- \* demonstrate excellent academic achievement.
- \* demonstrate outstanding participation in their school and local community,
- \* are in financial need (determined by the parents/guardians being in receipt of the Education Maintenance Allowance or the students themselves receiving the Youth Allowance).


