#### 1. Snakes

Some students reporting seeing a snake near the container last week. We have investigated this and we have not seen any slithering visitors. All students are reminded to stay away from the container area as this is out of bounds – please reinforce this at home.

If you discover a snake, do not approach it closely. If you step on a snake or are very close to a snake then move away quickly. If the snake is only about a meter away, freeze at first and see the snakes reaction - it will likely look for an escape route. If it is cornered, back away slowly.

#### 2. Canberra Camp

#### 3. Enrolments / Grade Structures for 2018

At present, we look like beginning the new year with 79 students which is a great result for our school. Therefore, we will be having a 4th classroom again in 2018 and we are currently working on grade placements which we hope to confirm in the next couple of weeks. #### 4. Staffing Process / New Classes

We will be finishing the classroom staffing process this week and hope to make an announcement to the school community ASAP and we thank everyone for their patience with this matter – a formal letter will be sent home. We anticipate having all of our classroom teachers for 2018 attend the Statewide Orientation Day which will be held in December. The next step with staffing will involve Specialist Teachers and we hope to finalise this ASAP as well.
