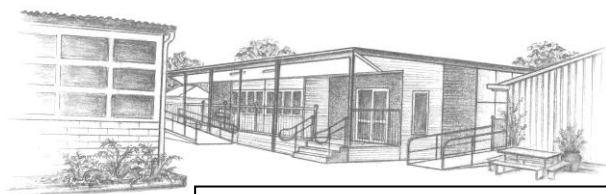

**TIP TOP TALLYGAROOPNA**

**Challenges and Overcoming our Best**

We decided to design a boat with two hulls and lean the solar panels on an angle. We used foam and cardboard to make the boat and we used the foam cutter to shape the foam to just the right size. After we had shaped the foam we glued the foam and cardboard together with a hot glue gun. When the glue dried we took it outside and tested it. The main said the propeller was too low so we had to change it. When we made the propeller higher and moved the solar panels we took it out again. It still didn't seem to help and unfortunately we didn't win. We named the boat TTT (Tip Top Tallygaroopna) and our boat number is 335.

**Student Involvement**

Mikayla was awesome because she worked really well with everyone and she also did the cutting and some of the gluing. Bailey also worked well with the group and Bailey did the same as Mikayla but she did a bit more gluing. Preston was the mature one to step up and do the drawing. Bill was great to do a little bit of everything.

**Testing**

**WHAT WE HAVE LEARNED**

We have learned that the sun makes the boat go from solar power and we learned how to build the boat which was a bit hard but quite interesting as well. We also know now that if the sun is not shining on the boat that it will not move. We found out that the boat was too heavy at the front so we had to put both of the solar panels to the side so the boat won't tip forward.

**RACING ROCKET 336**

**Design**

On Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> of August we did the solar boat challenge. We used foam and plastic cardboard. We used a foam cutter, a hot glue gun and Velcro pieces. We had the foam curved up like a ski. Plastic cardboard got hot glued to the foam and we got the engine wired cables wired to the solar panels and we stuck the propeller on. Conner did the hot glue gunning and Jordan did the drawing and testing. Preston did the designing and he popped the boat in the water when the practice rars were on. Mitchell did the foam cutting and designing.

We tested it and tried it in the water and then we went back and wrote our names on the boat. We chose the name Racing Rockets and then tested it again.

**When we were making our boat we put the solar panels near the window to check that they were connected properly to the propeller. The propeller spun pretty fast so we knew that it was working well. We also tested Racing Rocket, in a little pool we had to adjust the angle of the propeller because it was too bent and didn't work properly.**
