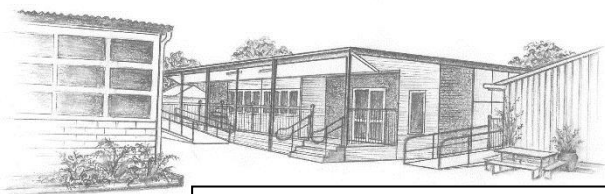

## News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone,

It gives me great pleasure to welcome Liss Lothian to our staff for 2017. Miss Lothian will be teaching the Grade 1/2 children and she is extremely excited to be part of our school. We have already had Miss Lothian come into our school and talk to our current staff along with attending a staff social function and she will be a welcome addition to our workforce next year.

Over the coming weeks, there are many extra curricula activities planned. These range from whole school programs to individual activities and we will continue to give our families lots of notice in regard to these. In the next couple of weeks we have the Cricket Tournament, the Cluster Day at Strathmerton PS, the Tallygaroopna Homestead Excursion and the Yachting Program for some students in the senior grade. Some information is provided in this edition of the newsletter so please read these items carefully and contact the school if anything needs to be clarified.

Most of the senior students in Grades 5/6 have camps to prepare for in the coming weeks. These are consecutive and I should be able to give families some more specific information this week in regard to the Cape Otway Camp which is from November 22<sup>nd</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup>. This camp is being organised by Lemnos PS and is a wonderful experience and opportunity for our kids.

As stated previously, we look like having 70 students at our school for 2017 and we have decided to split the Grade 1's in 2017 – being the largest grade in the school. This will then allow us to have relative consistent and low class numbers across the whole school. In determining whether these children are in the F/1 or 1/2 class many factors will be looked at. Among these will be the academic and social level of the students in this year level and we will endeavour to do what we think is best for this cohort of children. **Please contact me directly if you would like to discuss your child's placement for 2017.**

Finally, I would like to remind all of our families that our general rule at Tallygaroopna PS is to "consider the feeling of others at all times". As always at this time of the year, some students tend to test the boundaries a little bit in regard to this so please reinforce appropriate behaviour as much as possible.

Unfortunately, I will be away at Dookie PS conducting interviews on Thursday afternoon and away on Friday as well.

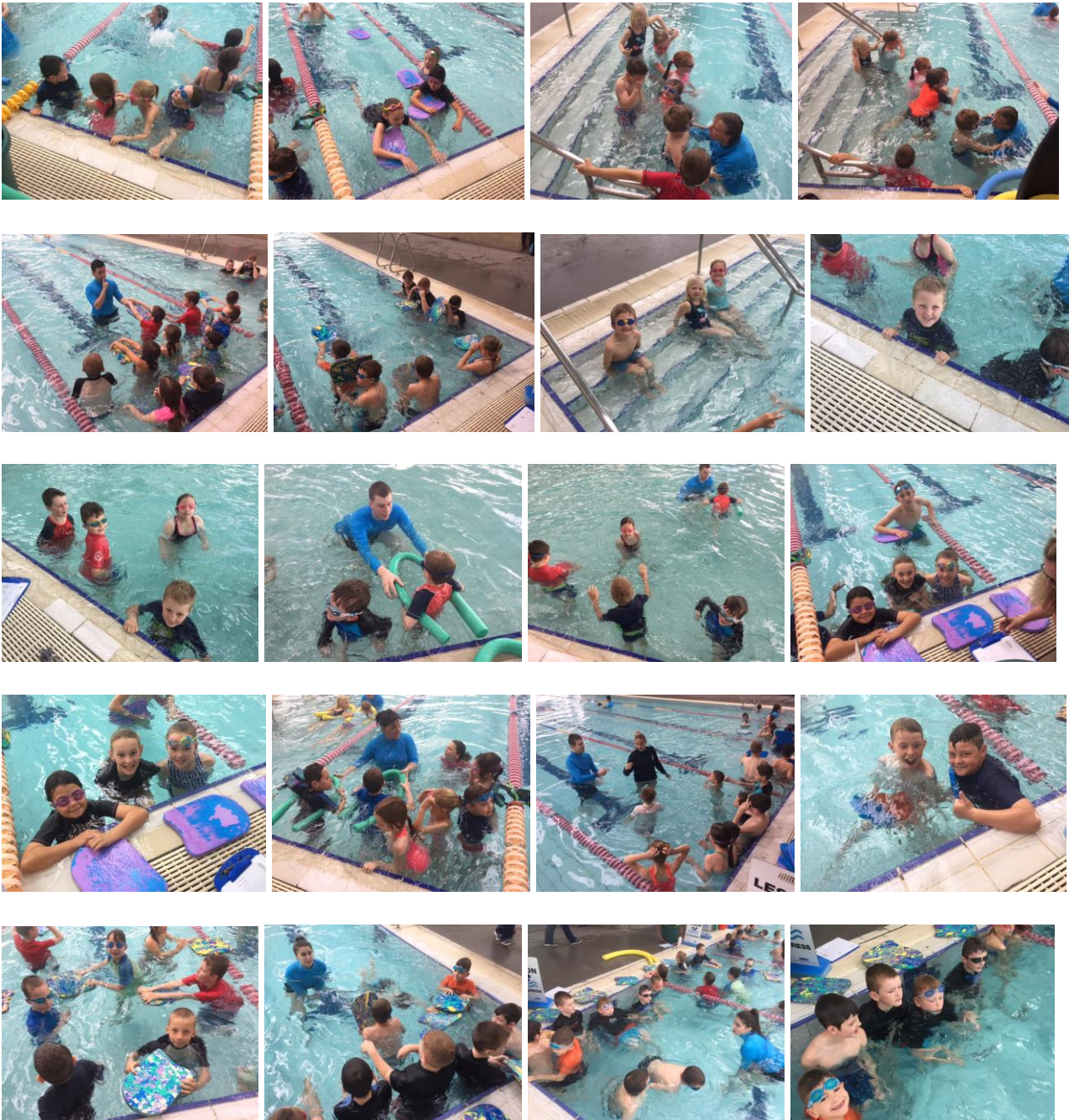

## **1. Enrolments / Grade Structures for 2017**

At present, we look like beginning the new year with 70 students which is a great result for our school. Therefore, we will be having a 4<sup>th</sup> classroom in 2017 and we can now confirm grade placements. The grade structure for 2017 will be the following, but class numbers may change with any future alterations to enrolments. We anticipate having all of our classroom teachers for 2017 attend the Statewide Orientation Day which will be held in December

### **Junior School**

Foundation / Grade 1 – 17 students (Teacher – Miss Beer)    Grade 1 / Grade 2 – 17 students (Teacher – Miss Lothian)

### **Senior School**

Grade 3 / Grade 4 – 16 students (Teacher – Mrs Haberfield)    Grade 5 / Grade 6 – 20 students (Teacher – Miss Triffett)

We are over the moon, that we can again offer low classroom sizes across the whole school. This will obviously make our school an attractive learning environment for the future. If you would like to discuss grade placements for Grade 1 students could you see Mr Brodie ASAP please.

## **2. Staffing Process – Specialist Programs**

We are about to finish the staffing process, for specialist teachers for 2017. These will be announced by the end of November and we thank everyone for their patience with this matter. At present, positions are advertised for LOTE (Italian), Physical Education and Music.

We are hopeful that our Specialist Program will again involve curriculum areas relating to Art, Library, Science, LOTE, Music and Physical Education.

## **3. Chaplaincy Program – 2017/2018**

We are pleased to inform our School Community that funding for the National School Chaplaincy Programme (NSCP) will be available for 2017 and 2018 to schools that are currently funded under the NSCP. As a currently funded school, we have accepted this offer and we look forward to continuing with this program and service into the future. We are currently having discussions with Mrs Forman, who hopefully will continue with her role at Tally PS.

## **4. Parent Opinion Survey Results**

Results from these were generally positive and these will be shared more formally with School Council on Wednesday night. In a nutshell our school was above the State and School Type in most areas with strengths being noted in the following areas: Parent Input, Extra Curricula and General Satisfaction,

For the Parent Opinion Survey we had 32 out of 40 surveys returned (80%).

## **6. Cluster MACC / MARC Day**

Our whole school will participate in the Cluster Literacy Day at Strathmerton PS on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> November. We will have a guest author (Matt Porter) and Artist (Jodie Newlan) and both are excited to deliver exciting workshops for both the students and the staff at our cluster day.

Students will be able to have a lunch order on the day. The lunches for students will be catered for by the P& F of Strathmerton PS. For those attending on Day 2 at Strathmerton PS here is the menu and pricing: \$5 for a student lunch pack of one sausage in bread, a piece of fruit and a Prima/ Tetra Pack of 100% fruit juice. If a student did not like sausages, then for the cost of \$6, the lunch pack would be a hamburger, piece of fruit and a Prima fruit juice. If students want an extra sausage, then it will be an extra \$2, or \$3 for an extra hamburger.

**The fee for the Cluster Day will be \$7 per student . This will cover the costs of the Author and Artist and buses.**

## **7. Head Lice**

As with all schools, headlice is an ongoing problem with children. We have had some incidents of head lice at our school this year, but unfortunately there have been some families that have been affected more than others. This has resulted in some repeat incidents of head lice, which is very frustrating for the families concerned.

Therefore, all families who have children with head lice must obviously treat their children but aim to remove all live eggs. To remove the live eggs it is imperative to use a nit comb (from the chemist) and comb through every inch of hair until all live eggs are removed. Families will continually be phoned to pick up their children if live eggs are still visible at school. This will hopefully eliminate repeated incidents. Please return children to school only if no live eggs are visible. They will need to go straight to the office upon arrival to confirm the removal of nits / live eggs. This will hopefully result in less repeat incidents.

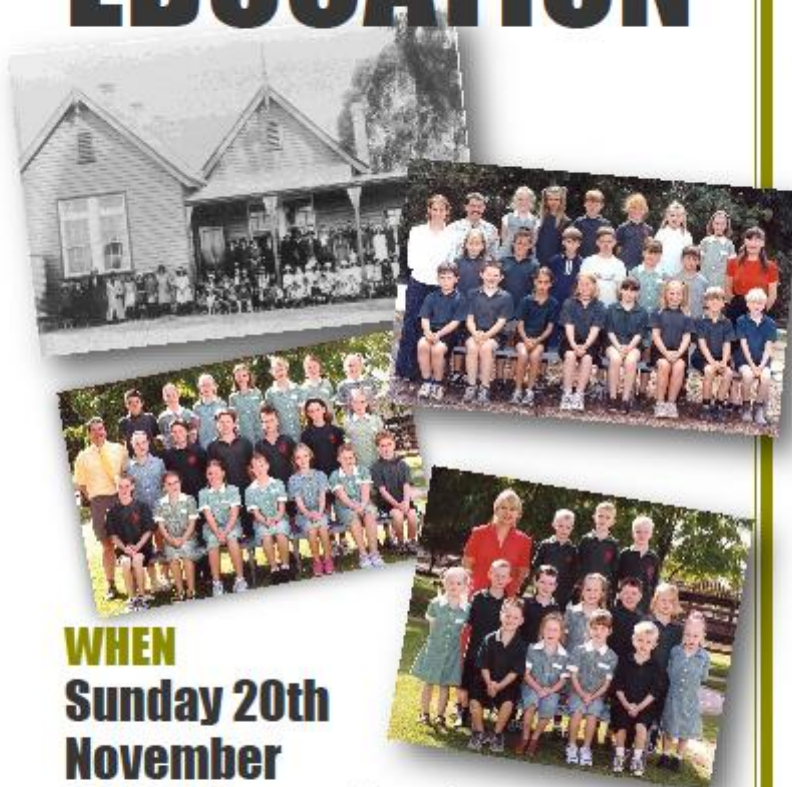
