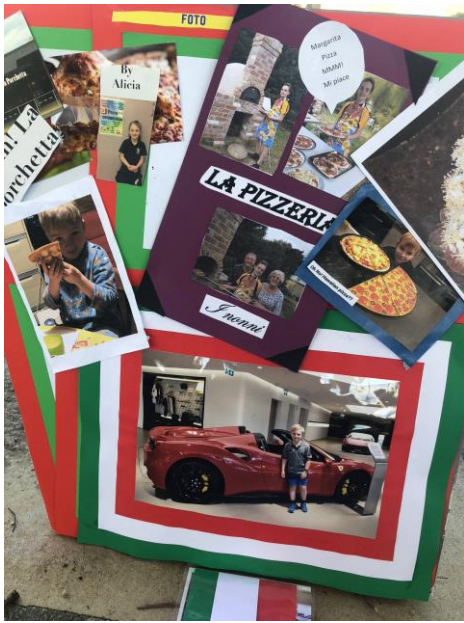

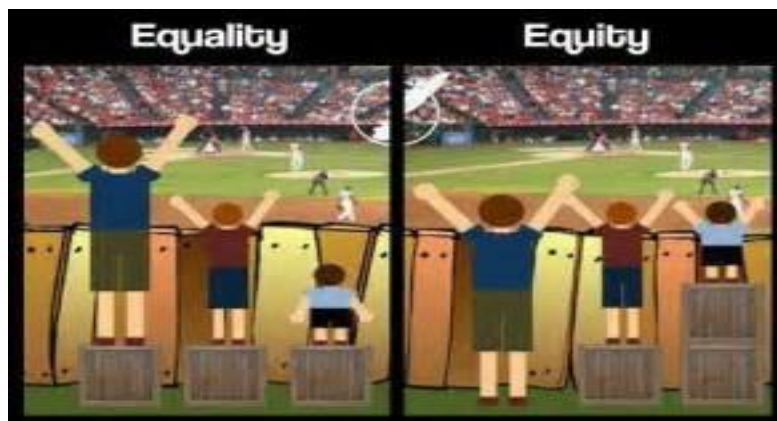

1. Parent Opinion Survey Results

A summary of these results for 2018 is below. 2. Colour Fun Run

Specific details are in this edition of the newsletter and were sent home last Friday with the eldest child in each family. A consent form must be returned to allow students to participate and there are some recommendations for eye protection. The school accepts no liability for any injuries, which may occur during this event, which will be held on Friday 9th November. The Grade 3-6 students will be having their run from 2.10-2.40pm, followed by the F-2 students and younger children (ie: Kindergarten) from 2.40pm-3.10pm.

3. School Council

This will be held this Wednesday at 7.30pm with the Finance Committee meeting at 6.30pm. Information was sent home to School Councillors last week.

4. Munch N Crunch

This is scheduled for Friday 9th November. Order forms went home with the eldest child in each family last week. Lunch on this day will involve a sausage in bread and a prima or water bottle. Orders need to be in by 3.30pm on Monday 5th November.

5. Northerners Cricket

It sounds like cricket will be played at our school most Wednesday and Friday nights, which is fantastic. A reminder to our school community about respecting our school grounds and facilities (i.e. toilets) and for making sure that all rubbish is to be cleaned up when using the school facilities – bins will be available. Outside School Hours Care is still running until 6pm each day so nobody should be riding bikes in the school grounds while a school program is still being implemented for safety reasons.

10. Enrolments / Grade Structures for 2019

At present, we look like beginning the new year with 84 students which is a great result for our school. Therefore, we will be having a 4th classroom again in 2019 and we are currently working on grade placements which we hope to confirm in the next couple of weeks. We are very pleased that we can again offer low classroom sizes across the whole school. This will obviously make our school an attractive learning environment for the future. If you would like to discuss grade placements for Grade 3 students could you see Mr Brodie ASAP please.

11. OSH Care Enrolment Forms - Amendment

On Wednesday 3rd September, we had an Assessment & Rating Visit for our OSH Care Service. One of the items that needed amending were some specific things on the OSH Enrolment Form. These were:

- a. Address of Emergency Contacts
- b. Details of Authorised Nominees including
 - Authorisation to consent to medical treatment
 - Authorise the administration of medication
 - Authorisation to authorise an educator to take the children outside the service premises.
- c. Cultural Background of the Child
- d. Medicare Number

Could these be filled in on the attached sheet that was sent home before the holiday break to OSH families. These are overdue and will be added to our current enrolment form. These items will be included in the 2019 enrolment form, which all families wishing to use the service will need to complete in the new year. Current emergency contacts & people authorised to collect your child were attached from the current enrolment form to assist you.

12. Contacting Staff out of School Hours

Please be mindful of contacting staff outside of school hours (beyond 5pm). This may involve text messaging, phone calls, Class Dojo and Flexibuzz. There has been a big push from the Department of Education in regard to staff and principal health & wellbeing and it is important that we all have lives away from the busy school day. We will also make an extra effort to do the same for our families, so that after work time can be devoted to families.

13. Staffing Arrangements - 2019

I am currently going through the staffing process for 2019. This takes some time and I anticipate informing the community in the near future of the outcome. Thanks for your patience in regard to this matter. Mr Brodie.

14. Grade 5/6 PowerPoints

The senior students will work on these a lot over the next few weeks. We will utilise many photos that are on the school server, but students new to our school are encouraged to bring in any previous school photos so that these can be scanned and then returned home. These PowerPoint presentations are an important component of the Grade 6 Graduation Night at the end of the year and reflect their time at Primary School, not just TPS.

16. Curriculum Day – Pupil Free

The final Curriculum Day for 2018 will be held on Friday 2nd November. Staff will be attending a Professional Development with Tony Attwood that focuses on Autism. Esteemed Professor Tony Attwood is a clinical psychologist who has specialised in Autism Spectrum Disorders since he qualified as a clinical psychologist in England in 1975. He has worked with many thousands of individuals of all ages with Asperger's syndrome or an Autism Spectrum Disorder. He presents for us sessions on cognitive abilities, thinking and learning profiles, and the presentation of ASD in girls. No students will be required at school on this day, so families will need to make alternative arrangements.

17. Missing Reading Books

We seem to be missing some junior level books for reading. If any of these are hiding at home - could they be returned to the office ASAP please.

18. Grade 5/6 Camp

Final information regarding the costs and itinerary for this camp were provided last week. We need final numbers by Friday 26th November – then a decision will be made in regard to whether this camp will go ahead. The camp is scheduled from Monday 10th December to Wednesday 12th December.

Students not attending this camp will still be required to attend school during this time. The State-wide Orientation Day will be held on Tuesday 11th December.

19. Staffroom – Parents (confidentiality)

We have been working hard on assessment and reporting so far this year. We are planning on focusing on Student Data during Semester 2. As a result, there is some confidential student data in the staffroom at present. We would appreciate all parents staying out of this room while this data is displayed.

We have also made a Data Wall to reflect our Maths Assessment for the Number Fluency Assessment (NFA), so please don't enter the staffroom unless given permission. Sorry for any inconvenience.

Football/Soccer Boot Bank

Northerners Soccer Club/Tallygaroopna Primary School have a collection of football boots that families have donated to be used by kids throughout the winter sport season. RE: Tallygaroopna Primary School Colour Fun Run – Parent Consent

Thank you for your support with the *Tallygaroopna Primary School Colour Fun Run*. The event is only weeks away which is very exciting.

It is our responsibility to seek permission for your child to participate in the *Tallygaroopna Primary School Colour Fun Run*. All measures have been taken to ensure that this event is safe for all students.

There will be various colour powder stations throughout the course with two designated lanes – one for colour powder, the other with no powder. Your child can still participate in the event should you not wish for them to be sprayed with colour powder.

The staff will do their best to throw the powder at the torso, however wind and other factors can cause the powder to protrude on the face. We recommend that your child bring their own eye protection such as sunglasses or goggles.

The colour powder used in the event is non-toxic, biodegradable and environmentally friendly consisting of 98% corn starch and 2% food colouring. It will likely wash out of your child's clothing, however we recommend that your child wears a plain white shirt that you don't mind being coloured. That's what the event is all about!

Based on the toxicology profiles of the powders used, their concentrations in the formulation and the mode of use, the colour powder is considered safe for use. Students with lung issues such as asthma or have allergies are advised to be careful in their decision to participate.

Should you wish to view the ingredient listings and toxicology risk assessment of the powder, please see the staff in the Office.
